

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

April 2011

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended April 16, 2011, there were 518,700 persons employed in Saskatchewan during April 2011, an increase of 1,900 from March 2011 but 1,700 less than the number employed in April 2010.

Agricultural employment was 39,500 persons in April 2011, up 100 from the March 2011 level but 2,100 less than the April 2010 agricultural employment level of 41,600. Non-agricultural employment was 479,200 persons in April 2011. This is an increase of 1,800 from the March 2011 non-agriculture employment level of 477,400 and 400 more than April 2010.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for April 2011 was 5.6 percent. This is a decrease of 0.1 percentage points from the March 2011 rate of 5.7 percent and 0.3 percentage points lower than the April 2010 level of 5.9 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 1,500 to 549,400 persons in April 2011 up from 547,900 persons in March 2011. This is 3,500 less than the April 2010 labour force of 552,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate rose 0.2 percentage points to 68.9 percent in April 2011 from 68.7 percent in March 2011. The April 2010 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.1 percent.

There were 30,700 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during April 2011. This is a decrease of 400 from March 2011 and is 1,800 less than the number unemployed in April 2010.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 524,300 persons employed in Saskatchewan in April 2011, down 100 from the March 2011 level of 524,400 and is down 1,600 from the April 2010 employment level of 525,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for April 2011 was 5.0 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the March 2011 rate of 5.2 percent and 0.2 percentage points lower than the April 2010 rate of 5.2 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 154,600 persons in April 2011 to 17,088,800 persons from 16,934,200 persons in March 2011. In April 2010, there were 16,806,800 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.3 percentage points to 7.9 percent from the March 2011 level of 8.2 percent. In April 2010, Canada's unemployment rate was 8.4 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.6 percent in April 2011. This is 0.1 percentage points lower than March 2011 and 0.5 percentage points lower than the April 2010 level of 8.1 percent.
