

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

March 2008

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended March 15, 2008, there were 500,100 persons employed in Saskatchewan during March 2008, an increase of 300 from February 2008 and 5,400 more than the number employed in March 2007.

Agricultural employment was 35,900 persons in March 2008, down 1,100 from the February 2008 level and 4,900 less than the March 2007 agricultural employment level of 40,800. Non-agricultural employment was 464,200 persons in March 2008. This is an increase of 1,400 from the February 2008 non-agriculture employment level of 462,800 and 10,300 more than March 2007.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for March 2008 was 4.4 percent. This is an increase of 0.1 percentage points from the February 2008 rate of 4.3 percent and 0.2 percentage points higher than the March 2007 level of 4.2 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 600 to 523,000 persons in March 2008 from 522,400 persons in February 2008. This is 6,400 more than the March 2007 labour force of 516,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.1 percentage points to 68.6 percent in March 2008 from 68.7 percent in February 2008. The March 2007 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.0 percent.

There were 22,900 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during March 2008. This is an increase of 300 from February 2008 and is 1,100 more than the number unemployed in March 2007.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 508,200 persons employed in Saskatchewan in March 2008, down 800 from the February 2008 level of 509,000 but is up 4,800 from the March 2007 employment level of 503,400 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for March 2008 was 4.1 percent. This is unchanged from February 2008 but 0.2 percentage points higher than the March 2007 rate of 3.9 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 34,700 persons in March 2008 to 16,845,200 persons from 16,810,500 persons in February 2008. In March 2007, there were 16,512,500 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 0.3 percentage points to 6.4 percent from the February 2008 level of 6.1 percent. In March 2007, Canada's unemployment rate 6.5 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.0 percent in March 2008. This is 0.2 percentage points higher than February 2008 but 0.1 percentage points lower than the March 2007 level of 6.1 percent.
