

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

October 2013

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between September 2013 and October 2013 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.2 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the October All-items Index increased from September 2013 primarily due to higher prices recorded for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, purchase and operation of recreational vehicles, and property taxes (including special charges). Prices also rose for women's clothing, footwear, travel tours and non-electrical kitchen utensils, tableware and cookware.

Moderating these increases were lower recorded prices for gasoline, traveller accommodation and men's clothing. Prices also fell for fresh vegetables, cereal products (excluding infant food), fresh or frozen beef and preserved vegetables and vegetable preparations.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.5 percent between October 2012 and October 2013 while the Canada All-items Index increased 0.7 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.7 percent and 1.1 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The October All-items Index increased from October 2012 primarily due to price increases for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and food purchased from restaurants. Prices also rose for cigarettes, electricity, rent and women's clothing.

These increases were partially offset by falling prices for gasoline, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance and home entertainment equipment, parts and services. Prices also fell for clothing accessories, watches and jewellery, seeds, plants and cut flowers, travel tours and prescribed medicines.
