

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

October 2012

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between September 2012 and October 2012 while the Canada All-items Index also advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.3 percent and 0.2 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the October All-items Index increased from September 2012 primarily due to higher prices for property taxes, gasoline and purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles. Prices also rose for footwear, furniture, bakery products and clothing accessories, watches and jewellery.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for traveller accommodations, non-alcoholic beverages and dairy products. Prices also fell for processed meat, coffee and tea, cereal products (excluding infant food) and other food preparations.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.5 percent between October 2011 and October 2012 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.6 percent and 1.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The October All-items Index increased from October 2011 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs. Prices also rose for rent, cablevision and satellite services (including pay per view television), homeowners' maintenance and repairs and tuition fees.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, women's clothing and natural gas. Lower prices were also observed for home entertainment equipment, parts and services, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), prescribed medicines and non-alcoholic beverages.
