ORDER IN COUNCIL

The Crown Corporations Act, 1978

(O.C. 1041/91)
17 December 1991

TO THE HONOURABLE
THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR IN
COUNCIL:

The undersigned has the honour to report that:

1 Section 3 and 6 of *The Crown Corporations Act, 1978* provide, in part, that:

3(1) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint one or more persons to operate any business, enterprise or undertaking, on behalf of the Crown in right of Saskatchewan, the operation of which is considered advisable for the public good.

(2) The person or persons originally appointed pursuant to subsection (1) and their successors in

office shall be a corporation, under a name to be designated by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.

6(1) The affairs and business of a corporation shall be managed by a board of directors consisting of the persons appointed pursuant to subsection 3(1).

(2) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may designate a member of the board of directors as chairman and another member of the board as vice-chairman of the board.

2 By Your Honour's Order 888/91, dated September 25, 1991, Bill Gibson of Regina was appointed as the Saskatchewan Government Growth Fund Management Corporation and as the Board of Directors thereof, and was further designated to be Chairman of the Board of Directors.

3 It is desirable and in the public interest that Donald R. Ching, of Saskatoon be appointed as successor to Bill Gibson of Regina.

The undersigned has the honour, therefore, to recommend that your Honour's Order do issue pursuant to sections 3 and 6 of *The Crown Corporations Act, 1978*:

(a) terminating the appointment of Bill Gibson, Regina, as the Saskatchewan Government Growth Fund Management Corporation and as Board of Directors thereof;

(b) appointing Donald R. Ching, Saskatoon, as the successor to Bill Gibson, Regina, as the Saskatchewan Government Growth Fund Management Corporation and as Board of Directors thereof; and

(c) designating Donald R. Ching, Saskatoon, as Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Saskatchewan Government Growth Fund Management Corporation.
