1 *The Crown Corporations Act, 1978* provides, in part that:

3(1) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint one or more persons to operate any business, enterprise or undertaking, on behalf of the Crown in right of Saskatchewan, the operation of which is considered advisable for the public good.

(2) The person or persons originally appointed pursuant to subsection (1) and their successors in office shall be a corporation, under name to be designated by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.

6(1) The affairs and business of a corporation shall be managed by a board of directors consisting of the persons appointed pursuant to subsection 3(1).

(2) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may designate a member of the board of directors as chairman and another member of the board as vice-chairman of the board.

8 The head office of a corporation shall be at a place to be designated by the Lieutenant Gover-

nor in Council, and the corporation may establish branch offices at other places.

9 A corporation shall perform the duties and may exercise the powers that may be prescribed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council, having regard to the efficient operation of its business.

10(1) Subject to subsection (3), a corporation may acquire, by purchase, lease or otherwise, any real or personal property that it considers necessary for the efficient operation of its business and may mortgage any of its property, real or personal, and may sell, lease or otherwise dispose of any property that it considers to be no longer necessary for its purposes.

(3) The Lieutenant Governor in Council shall, from time to time, designate the amount above which any purchase price or sale price of real property included in one transaction or the principal sum of any mortgage of real property shall be referred to the Lieutenant Governor in Council for approval.

14 In the performance of the duties and exercise of the powers imposed or conferred upon a corporation pursuant to the provisions of this Act, the corporation shall be responsible to the member of the Executive Council who is designated by the Lieutenant Governor in Council for the purpose.

15 All books and accounts of a corporation shall be closed and balanced annually at a date to be fixed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.

(i) invest any part of its capital or operating money in any security or class of securities authorized for investment of money in the consolidated fund pursuant to *The Financial Administration Act*; and

(ii) dispose of the investments acquired pursuant to subclause (i) in any manner, on any terms and in any amounts that it considers expedient;

(j) to make charges for any of the services provided by the corporation to any person;

(k) to provide assistance, including financial assistance, to any person for a purpose related to the provision of health services or the operation of health facilities;

(l) to educate and train students in medicine, nursing and any other associated discipline that the corporation considers appropriate and to work with other persons who provide education or training to such disciplines;
