- "non-trophy white-tailed deer" (i) "non-trophy white-tailed deer" means a female white-tailed deer or a white-tailed deer born during the year in which hunting is taking place;
- "open season" (j) "open season" means an open season established pursuant to any regulations passed pursuant to the Act during which it is lawful to hunt a particular species of wildlife;
- "provincial park" (k) "provincial park" means a provincial park constituted pursuant to *The Parks Act*;
- "recreation site" (l) "recreation site" means a recreation site constituted pursuant to *The Recreation Sites Regulations, 1986*;
- "wildlife management unit" (m) "wildlife management unit" means any area constituted as a wildlife management unit by *The Wildlife Management Zones and Special Areas Boundaries Regulations, 1990*;
- "wildlife management zones" (n) "wildlife management zones" means any area constituted as a wildlife management zone by *The Wildlife Management Zones and Special Boundaries Regulations, 1990*.

- Restrictions and conditions re hunting **4** These regulations are subject to any restrictions on and conditions relating to hunting contained in the Act, in these regulations or in any other regulations made pursuant to the Act or specified on the big game licence.
- White-tailed deer **5(1)** Subject to subsection (2), it is lawful for a person:
- (a) who is the holder of a First Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from:
- (i) November 18 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 55, including Brokenshell No. 1, Brokenshell No. 2, Buckland, Elbow, Estevan-Cambria, Cookson, Fort-a-la-Corne, Horsehide Lake, Last Mountain Lake and Lomond Wildlife Management Units and Cypress Hills (West Block), Duck Mountain, Moose Mountain and Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Parks;

- (ii) September 30 to October 12 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 61, 65, 66 and 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks;
 - (iii) November 4 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69 including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit, Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site; or
 - (iv) August 26 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 70 to 76, including Clearwater River and Lac La Ronge Provincial Parks;
- (b) who is the holder of a Second Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed deer licence, to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from:
- (i) November 18 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 47 and 50 to 55 including Buckland, Cookson and Fort-a-la-Corne Management Units;
 - (ii) September 30 to October 12 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 61, 65, 66 and 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks; or
 - (iii) November 4 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit, Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site;
- (c) who is the holder of a First Canadian Resident White-tailed Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from:
- (i) November 25 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 15, 18 to 30, 36 and 40 to 55, including Brokenshell No. 1, Brokenshell No. 2, Buckland, Elbow, Estevan-Cambria, Cookson, Fort-a-la-Corne, Horsehide Lake, Last Mountain Lake and Lomond Wildlife Management Units and Cypress Hills (West Block) and Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Parks;
 - (ii) September 30 to October 12 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 61, 65, 66 and 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks;
 - (iii) November 4 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit, Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site; or
 - (iv) August 26 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 70 to 76, including Clearwater River and Lac La Ronge Provincial Parks;

(d) who is the holder of a Second Canadian Resident White-tailed Deer licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from:

(i) November 25 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 47 and 50 to 55 including Buckland, Cookson and Fort-a-la-Corne Management Units;

(ii) September 30 to October 12 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 61, 65, 66 and 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks; or

(iii) November 4 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site;

(e) who is the holder of a First Non-resident White-tailed Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from:

(i) September 30 to October 12 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 61, 65, 66 and 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks;

(ii) November 4 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit, Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site; or

(iii) August 26 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 70 to 76, including Clearwater River and Lac La Ronge Provincial Parks;

(f) who is the holder of a Second Non-resident White-tailed Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from:

(i) September 30 to October 12 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 61, 65, 66 and 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks; or

(ii) November 4 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 69, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Greenwater Lake, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site;

(g) who is the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Non-trophy Whitetailed Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one non-trophy whitetailed deer from November 18 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 2, 6, 7, 11 and that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 14 west of Primary Grid Road No. 649 including Cypress Hills Provincial Park (West Block);

(h) who is the holder of a Guided Moose Licence and who also holds a First Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence, First Canadian Resident White-tailed Deer Licence or First Non-resident White-tailed Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from October 14 to 19 in Wildlife Management Zones 60 to 62 and 69;

(i) who is the holder of a Guided Moose Licence and who also holds a Second Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence, Second Canadian Resident White-tailed Deer Licence or Second Non-resident White-tailed Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from October 14 to 19 in Wildlife Managements Zones 60 to 62 and 69;

(j) who is the holder of a Special Resident Moose Licence and who also holds a First Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence or a Second Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from September 9 to 14 in one of the following zones specified on the Special Residence Moose Licence, that is Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 61, 65, 66 and 67;

(k) who is the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Elk Licence and who also holds a First Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence or a Second Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from September 16 to 28 in Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 61, 65, 66 and 69 including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and the north-east portion of Meadow Lake Provincial Park north of the Seventeenth Base Line;

(l) who is the holder of a Special Saskatchewan Resident Elk Licence and who also holds a First Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence or a Second Saskatchewan Resident White-tailed Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex from October 14 to 19 or October 28 to November 2 and who hunts during the time specified for hunting and in one of the following areas specified on the elk licence, that is Wildlife Management Zones 56 to 59 including Greenwater Lake Provincial Park; or

(m) who is the holder of a Non-resident Big Game Licence to hunt and take a total of one white-tailed deer of either sex as specified on the licence from November 18 to December 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 44, 45, 47 and 54.

(2) No person who hunts white-tailed deer in any open season established by section 5 shall hunt and take any white-tailed deer in:

- (a) Buckland Wildlife Management Unit except by means of a bow and arrow; or
- (b) Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park except by means of a muzzleloading firearm or a bow and arrow.

Elk

6 It is lawful for a person:

- (a) who is the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Regular Elk Licence to hunt and take a total of:

- (i) one antlered elk from September 16 to 28 in:

- (A) Wildlife Management Zones 48, 49, 53, 56 to 64, 66 and 69;

- (B) that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 47 north of Provincial Highway No. 3 and west of Provincial Highway No. 26;

- (C) that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 50 north of Provincial Highway No. 55;

- (D) the north-east portion of Meadow Lake Provincial Park north of the Seventeenth Base Line;

- (E) that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 68 south of the south boundary of Township 59 and Provincial Highways No. 21 and No. 699; or

- (F) Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Bronson Forest Recreation Site; or

- (ii) one elk of either sex from November 18 to November 30 in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 53 south of Provincial Highway No. 263 and Provincial Highway No. 922 and the Nesslin Lake Road to Prince Albert National Park, including Cookson Wildlife Management Unit;

- (b) who is the holder of a Non-resident Big Game Licence to hunt and take a total of one antlered elk from September 16 to 28 in one of the following areas specified on the licence:

- (i) in Wildlife Management Zones 48, 49, 53, 56 to 64, 66, and 69;

- (ii) that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 47 north of Provincial Highway No. 3 and west of Provincial Highway No. 26;

- (iii) that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 50 north of Provincial Highway No. 55;

- (iv) the north-east portion of Meadow Lake Provincial Park north of the Seventeenth Base Line; or

- (v) and that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 68 south of the south boundary of Township 59, Provincial Highways No. 21 and No. 699 including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Bronson forest Recreation Site;

(a) who is the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Regular Moose Licence to hunt and take a total of one bull moose or one calf moose from:

(i) October 7 to 12 in Wildlife Management Zones 43, 48, 49, 53, 56 to 67 and 69, and in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 54 north of Provincial Highway No. 3 including Cookson and Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Units and Nipawin Provincial Park;

(ii) September 9 to September 21 and October 7 to November 30 in Wildlife Management Zones 70 to 73, including Clearwater River and Lac La Ronge Provincial Parks;

(iii) August 26 to October 5 in Wildlife Management Zones 74 to 76;

(iv) November 18 to 30 in Wildlife Management Zones 43, 48, 49, 56 to 59 including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit; or

(v) November 18 to 23 in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 47 north of Provincial Highway No. 3 and west of Provincial Highway No. 26, and that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 54 north of Provincial Highway No. 3, and Wildlife Management Zones 53, 55 and 60 to 69, including Cookson Wildlife Management Unit, Nipawin Provincial Park and Bronson Forest Recreation Site;

(b) who is the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Special Moose Licence to hunt and take a total of one moose of either sex from:

(i) September 9 to 14 and November 4 to 16 in Wildlife Management Zones 48, 49, 56 to 67, and that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 54 north of Provincial Highway No. 3 including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Nipawin Provincial Park;

(ii) November 4 to 16 in Wildlife Management Zones 37, 55 and 68 and that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 47 north of Provincial Highway No. 3 and west of Provincial Highway No. 26 including Duck Mountain and Greenwater Lake Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site;

(iii) September 23 to October 5 and November 4 to 16 in Wildlife Management Zone 50, including Fort-a-la-Corne Wildlife Management Unit; or

(iv) November 4 to 9 in Wildlife Management Zone 6 and that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 7 east of Provincial Highway No. 271 and Grid Road No. 615; or

- (c) who is the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Special Elk Licence to hunt and take a total of one elk of either sex from:
- (i) November 4 to 16 and December 2 to 7 in Wildlife Management Zone 6 and that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 7 east of Provincial Highway No. 271 and Grid Road No. 615;
 - (ii) October 21 to 26 and December 9 to 14 or October 28 to November 2 and December 2 to 7 in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 7 west of Provincial Highway No. 271 and Grid Road No. 615, including Cypress Hills Provincial Park (West Block);
 - (iii) October 21 to 26 in Wildlife Management Zone 33 including Moose Mountain Provincial Park;
 - (iv) September 2 to September 21 in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 50 south of Provincial Highway No. 55 including Fort-a-la-Corne Wildlife Management Unit;
 - (v) November 4 to 9 and December 2 to 7 in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 54 south of Provincial Highway No. 3;
 - (vi) October 14 to 19 or October 28 to November 2 in Wildlife Management Zones 43, 48, 57 and 59 and that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 56 east of the grid road alternating south and west between the town of Porcupine Plain and Provincial Highway No. 38 on the northwest corner of Section 9 in Township 38, in Range 11, West of the Second Meridian;
 - (vii) October 14 to 19 or October 28 to November 2 in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 40 east of Provincial Highway No. 35 and north of Provincial Highway No. 49, in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 42 east of Provincial Highway No. 35, and in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 56 west of the grid road alternating south and west between the town of Porcupine Plain and Provincial Highway No. 38 on the northwest corner of Section 9 in Township 38, in Range 11, West of the Second Meridian including Greenwater Lake Provincial Park;
 - (viii) October 28 to November 2 in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 42 south of Provincial Highway No. 3, east of Provincial Highway No. 20 and west of Provincial Highway No. 6 and in Wildlife Management Zones 49 and 58; or
 - (ix) October 14 to 19 in that portion of Wildlife Management Zone 63 south of the Torch River and Wildlife Management Zone 64;

7 It is lawful for a person:

Moose

(c) who is the holder of a Guided Moose Licence to hunt and take a total of one bull moose or one calf moose from:

- (i) September 30 to October 19 and November 4 to 23 in Wildlife Management Zones 60 to 62 and 69;
- (ii) September 9 to 21, and September 30 to November 30 in Wildlife Management Zones 70 to 73, including Clearwater River and Lac La Ronge Provincial Parks; or
- (iii) August 26 to October 5 in Wildlife Management Zones 74 to 76.

8 It is lawful for a person who resides in Wildlife Management Zone 76 and who is the holder of a First Saskatchewan Resident Barren-ground Caribou Licence or a Second Saskatchewan Resident Barren-ground Caribou Licence to hunt and take a total of one Barren-ground Caribou of either sex from November 18, 1991 to March 31, 1992 in Wildlife Management Zone 76. Barren-ground Caribou

9 It is lawful for a person who is a holder of a Bear Licence to hunt and take a total of one bear of either sex from: Bear

- (a) August 26 to September 7 in Wildlife Management Zones 48, 49, and 56 to 59, including Leaf Lake Wildlife Management Unit;
- (b) August 26 to September 14 in Wildlife Management Zones 37, 42, 43, 47, 50 to 55, 62 to 69 and 73, including Cookson Wildlife Management Unit;
- (c) August 26 to October 12 in Wildlife Management Zones 60, 61, 70 to 72 and 74 to 76;
- (d) September 4 to September 14 in Clearwater River, Duck Mountain, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site;
- (e) September 4 to October 12 in Lac La Ronge Provincial Park; or
- (f) from September 23 to October 5 in Fort-a-la-Corne Wildlife Management Unit.

10(1) Subject to subsection (2), it is lawful for a person: Antelope

- (a) who is the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Antelope Licence to hunt and take a total of one antelope of either sex from October 28 to November 16 in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 14, 18, 19 and 23 to 27, including Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park;
- (b) who is the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Non-trophy Antelope Licence to hunt and take a total of one non-trophy antelope from October 31 to November 16 in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 14, 23, 25 to 27, including Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park;

(2) No person shall hunt and take any antelope in Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park during any open season established by section 10 except by means of a muzzle-loading firearm or bow and arrow.

Mule Deer

11(1) Subject to subsection (2), it is lawful for a person:

(a) who is the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Mule Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one mule deer of either sex from:

(i) November 4 to 9 in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 8, 11, 18, 19, 21, 22 to 27, 29, 30, 41, 44 and 45, including Elbow Wildlife Management Unit and Cypress Hills Provincial Park (West Block);

(ii) November 11 to 16 in Wildlife Management Zone 46 and 47; or

(iii) November 4 to 6 or November 7 to 9 in Wildlife Management Zones 9, 10, 12 to 14, including Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park;

(b) who is the holder of a Saskatchewan Resident Non-trophy Mule Deer Licence to hunt and take a total of one non-trophy mule deer from:

(i) November 11 to 16 in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 14, 19, 20, 23 to 26, 29 and 30 including Elbow Wildlife Management Unit and Cypress Hills (West Block) and Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Parks; or

(ii) November 18 to November 23 in Wildlife Management Zone 46.

(2) No person shall hunt and take any mule deer in Saskatchewan Landing Provincial Park during any open season established by section 11 except by means of a muzzle-loading firearm or bow and arrow.

- (a) "Act" means *The Wildlife Act*; "Act"

 - (i) tetraonidae, commonly known as grouse, including ruffed grouse, spruce grouse, prairie chickens, sharp-tailed grouse, sage grouse and ptarmigan; and
 - (ii) phasianidae, commonly known as pheasants and partridges, including ring-necked pheasants and European grey or Hungarian partridges.

(f) references to wildlife management units are references to wildlife management units constituted pursuant to *The Wildlife Management Zones and Special Areas Boundaries Regulations, 1990*;

(g) references to wildlife management zones are references to wildlife management zones constituted pursuant to *The Wildlife Management Zones and Special Areas Boundaries Regulations, 1990*.

4 These regulations are subject to any restrictions on and conditions relating to hunting contained in the Act, in these regulations or in any other regulations made pursuant to the Act.

Sharp-tailed

seasons

5 Open seasons for sharp-tailed grouse are:

(a) the third Wednesday in September and the following consecutive 45 days in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 47 and Last Mountain Lake Wildlife Management Unit;

(b) the first Wednesday in October and the following consecutive 31 days in Estevan-Cambria and Lomond Wildlife Management Units;

(c) October 31 and the following consecutive days to the last day of the 45 days mentioned in clause (a) in Elbow Wildlife Management Unit;

(d) the second Monday in September and the following consecutive 82 days in Wildlife Management Zones 48 to 76, including Fort a la Corne Wildlife Management Unit, Clearwater River, Lac la Ronge, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site.

Hungarian
partridge
open seasons

6 Open seasons for Hungarian partridges are:

(a) the third Wednesday in September and the following consecutive 59 days in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 55, including Last Mountain Lake and Fort a la Corne Wildlife Management Units;

(b) the first Wednesday in October and the following consecutive 45 days in Estevan-Cambria and Lomond Wildlife Management Units;

(c) October 31 and the following consecutive days to the last of the 59 days mentioned in clause (a) in Elbow Wildlife Management Unit;

(d) the first Monday in December and the following consecutive 19 days in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 19, 24 and 31, including Estevan-Cambria and Lomond Wildlife Management Units.

- 7** Open seasons for cock pheasants are: Pheasant
open seasons
- (a) the first Wednesday in October and the following consecutive 45 days in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 36, including Estevan-Cambria and Lomond Wildlife Management Units;
 - (b) the first Monday in December and the following consecutive 19 days in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 20, 24 and 31, including Estevan-Cambria and Lomond Wildlife Management Units.
- 8** Open seasons for ruffed grouse are: Ruffed grouse
open seasons
- (a) the third Wednesday in September and the following consecutive 59 days in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 47, including Last Mountain Lake Wildlife Management Unit and Duck Mountain and Moose Mountain Provincial Parks;
 - (b) the second Monday in September and the following consecutive 82 days in Wildlife Management Zones 48 to 76, including Fort a la Corne Wildlife Management Unit, Clearwater River, Greenwater Lake, Lac la Ronge, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site.
- 9** Open seasons for spruce grouse are: Spruce grouse
open seasons
- (a) the third Wednesday in September and the following consecutive 59 days in Wildlife Management Zone 43;
 - (b) the second Monday in September and the following consecutive 82 days in Wildlife Management Zones 48 to 76, including Fort a la Corne Wildlife Management Unit, Clearwater River, Lac la Ronge, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site.
- 10** Open season for ptarmigan is the second Monday in November in one year to March 31 in the following year in Wildlife Management Zones 61 to 66 and 69 to 76, including Clearwater River and Lac la Ronge Provincial Parks. Ptarmigan
- 11** Open seasons for ducks, coots and Wilson's snipe are: Ducks, coots
and Wilson's
snipe open
seasons
- (a) from September 1 to the Saturday closest to December 12 or December 12 if it falls on a Saturday in Fort a la Corne and Horsehide Lake Wildlife Management Units, Clearwater River, Lac la Ronge, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site;
 - (b) from the Monday closest to September 14 or on September 14 if it falls on a Monday to the Saturday closest to December 12 or December 12 if it falls on a Saturday in Valeport Wildlife Management Unit;

(c) from the third Wednesday in September to the Saturday closest to December 12 or December 12 if it falls on a Saturday in Last Mountain Lake Wildlife Management Unit.

Goose open seasons

12 Subject to section 22, open seasons for geese are:

(a) from September 1 to the Saturday closest to December 12 or December 12 if it falls on a Saturday in Fort a la Corne and Horsehide Lake Wildlife Management Units, Clearwater River, Lac la Ronge, Meadow Lake and Nipawin Provincial Parks and Bronson Forest Recreation Site;

(b) from the third Wednesday in September to the Saturday closest to December 12 or December 12 if it falls on a Saturday in Valeport and Last Mountain Lake Wildlife Management Units.

Certain goose open season restricted

13 The open season for geese established in the *Migratory Birds Regulations* (Canada), as amended from time to time, from September 1 to the Sunday closest to October 21 or October 21 if it falls on a Sunday includes only the part of each day from one-half hour before sunrise to noon in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 59 and 67 to 69.

Hunting with raptors

14(1) Pursuant to subsection 15(6) of the *Migratory Birds Regulations* (Canada), as amended from time to time, any person may hunt migratory game birds by the use or with the aid of raptors in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 76 during any open season for migratory game birds.

(2) Subject to section 22 but otherwise notwithstanding any other provisions of these regulations, a person may hunt upland game birds by the use or with the aid of raptors only from September 1 in one year to February 28 in the next year.

Sharp-tailed grouse limit

15 No person shall take or kill, in the open seasons established by section 5, more than three sharp-tailed grouse in any day or have more than six in his or her possession at any one time.

Hungarian partridge limit

16 No person shall take or kill, in the open seasons established by section 6, more than:

(a) 10 Hungarian partridges in any day in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 19, 22 to 24, 29 and 31 including Elbow, EstevanCambria and Lomond Wildlife Management Units or have more than 20 Hungarian partridges in his or her possession at any one time;

(b) five Hungarian partridges in any one day in Wildlife Management Zones 20, 21, 25 to 28, 30 and 32 to 41 including Last Mountain Lake Wildlife Management Unit or have more than 10 Hungarian partridges in his or her possession at any one time;

(c) three Hungarian partridges in any day in Wildlife Management Zones 42 to 55 including Fort a la Corne Wildlife Management Unit or have more than six Hungarian partridges in his or her possession at any one time.

17 No person shall take or kill, in the open seasons established by section 7, more than three cock pheasants in any day or have more than six cock pheasants in his or her possession at any one time. Pheasant limit

18 No person shall take or kill, in the open seasons established by section 8, more than five ruffed grouse in any day or have more than 10 in his or her possession at any one time. Ruffed grouse limit

19 No person shall take or kill, in the open seasons established by section 9, more than five spruce grouse in any day or have more than 10 in his or her possession at any one time. Spruce grouse limit

20 No person shall take or kill, in the open seasons established by section 10, more than 10 ptarmigan in any day or have more than 20 ptarmigan in his or her possession at any one time. Ptarmigan limit

21(1) No person who holds a Non-resident Game Bird Licence shall hunt or kill any sharp-tailed grouse or hungarian partridge in Wildlife Management Zones 9 to 14 and 25 to 28. Certain hunting prohibited

(2) No person who holds a Canadian Resident Game Bird Licence or a Non-resident Game Bird Licence shall hunt, take or kill any Hungarian partridge on the first Monday in December and on any of the following consecutive 19 days in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 19, 24 and 31.

22 No person who hunts upland game birds in the manner described in subsection 14(2) shall: Limit for certain upland game birds

(a) daily take or kill any upland game birds in excess of the maximum number of those birds prescribed by these regulations that may be taken or killed daily;

(b) daily take or kill more than two upland game birds in any wildlife management zone during any time other than an open season for those birds in the zone.
