Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

January 2018

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.4 percent between December 2017 and January 2018 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.7 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.4 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the January All-items Index increased from December 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; women's clothing; children's clothing; inter-city transportation; and traveller accommodation.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: furniture; recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles); fresh or frozen beef; telephone services; and preserved fruit and fruit preparations. The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.5 percent between January 2017 and January 2018 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.7 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both climbed 2.6 percent during the same period.

The January All-items Index increased from January 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: food purchased from restaurants; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; passenger vehicles insurance premiums; gasoline; and inter-city transportation.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; travel tours; homeowners' replacement cost; dairy products; and preserved fruit and fruit preparations.
