

DEADLINE: Applications for projects must be received or postmarked on or before DEC. 1, 2022. Claim forms must be submitted the earlier of 18 months from project approval or before MARCH 15, 2023.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

The purpose of the program is to promote awareness of farm safety issues and encourage the adoption of safe farm practices in Saskatchewan.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS:

- Saskatchewan-based agriculture-related organizations, agri-businesses, public institutions and agencies.
- Collaboration between organizations is encouraged.

ELIGIBLE PROJECTS:

- Applicants must clearly identify the extent to which the activities align with the program priorities.
- Eligible projects should focus on one or both of the following two priorities and be new, or include a significant new component:
 - Farm safety education and training that engages producers and farm families in adopting safe farm practices.
 - Education and training on mental health issues affecting farm safety.

ELIGIBLE EXPENSES:

- Presentations by guest speakers, qualified instructors or trainers at an event:
 - Speaker fees and facility rental costs.
- Hosting safety training courses, workshops and events.
- Costs for the development and/or promotion of training resources such as videos, educational materials, displays, farm safety assessment tools, publications and other farm safety or mental health resources.

FUNDING:

- Project funding will be awarded on a competitive basis with up to 100 per cent of each of the project's eligible expenses being reimbursed.
- Each project will be eligible for funding of up to \$25,000 per project to a maximum of \$50,000 per applicant per year.
- Generally, funding will be awarded for projects with duration of one year. Exceptions will be considered for multi-year projects or those that require more than one year to complete.
- Successful applicants will be required to sign a contract before the project is initiated and funded.

INELIGIBLE ITEMS:

- Funding for core organizational activities such as employee salaries, office costs, accounting and auditing expenses, organizational marketing expenses.
- Funding of activities that are already provided for under existing grants from the Ministry.
- Funding for ongoing or reoccurring initiatives outside the two priority areas.
- Capital costs such as infrastructure and equipment.
- Travel, food and beverage costs, except if they are part of the travel expenses to bring in a guest speaker.

Applications accepted on an ongoing basis. Applications submitted by the 15th of the month will typically be reviewed in that month. All applications must be completed and submitted by DEC. 1, 2022.
