*Situated in the legendary Qu'Appelle Valley between Echo and Pasqua Lakes, Echo Valley Provincial Park offers scenic surroundings and numerous recreational opportunities.*

## Camping

The park offers non-electric, electric, full hook-up as well as barrier-free campsites in their campgrounds. All have service centres featuring barrier-free showers and washroom facilities.

**Seasonal Camping:** Available May long weekend until September long weekend. Exceptions apply – check with park.

**Group Camping:** Looking for a group camping area for your next family gathering? Group camping reservations are available – must be made in advance.



## Beaches

Both Echo and Pasqua Lakes are known for their exceptional swimming, beaches and water recreation. Echo and Pasqua beaches have a buoyed swimming area for your safety, with barrier-free washroom and change rooms.

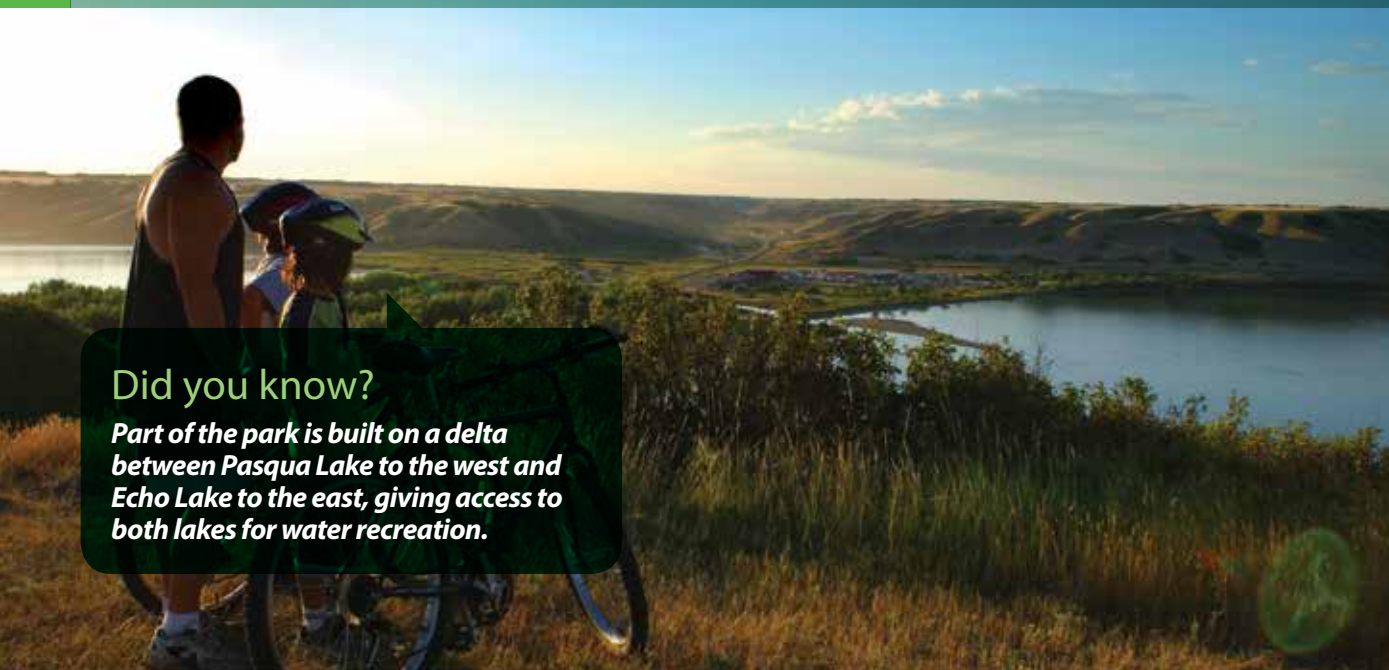
## Boating

Echo Valley Provincial Park has a boat launch on both Echo and Pasqua lakes. Lake levels fluctuate on a yearly basis and throughout the season.

# Welcome to Echo Valley Provincial Park

## Did you know?

**Part of the park is built on a delta between Pasqua Lake to the west and Echo Lake to the east, giving access to both lakes for water recreation.**





## Fishing

The lakes are well known for fishing, with the main species being walleye, pike and perch. There is a fish filleting station located beside the Pasqua Lake boat launch.

## Trails

**Hiking - The Nature Trail** (3 km): Take an hour walk through shaded coulees, along the ridge of the valley and across grassy meadows. The trailhead is accessible near the 'Hole in the Wall' group camping area.

**Cross-Country Ski and Cycle** (10 km): Echo Valley Provincial Park offers groomed and set cross-country ski trails. Two shelters with wood stoves and wood are provided. During the summer, the cross-country ski trails make for excellent biking trails.

## In-Park Services/Attractions

**Visitor Centre:** Stop by to see how the glaciers formed the valleys and lakes. Learn about weekly park programs throughout July and August.

**Picnicking:** Adjacent to the beaches are large areas of green space with picnic tables and barbecues. The Teepee and picnic areas can be booked for special events.

Playground equipment, volleyball courts and a baseball diamond are all available in the park.

**Miniature golf:** Located on the Pasqua Lake (west) side of the park, north of the parking lot near the bridge. This facility is privately operated.

## Nearby Services/Attractions

**Fort Qu'Appelle** (11 km): Full services.

**Echo Ridge Golf Course** (11 km): Located in Fort Qu'Appelle, this nine hole course has challenging holes, manicured greens and fairways and clubhouse. Steak Night every Friday during summer.

**Katepwa Point Provincial Park** (29 km): One of the nicest beaches in the Qu'Appelle Valley offering greenspace, picnic facilities, playground, service centre and parking. Accommodations, licensed dining, concessions, golf and canoe/kayak rentals are available nearby.

**Motherwell Homestead National Historic Site** (50 km)

*Lush lawns, playground, change rooms and barbecues make the beach area a great place to spend your summer days.*

*Interpretive programming and a nature trail allow visitors to explore and learn more about this beautiful area.*
