

## **Jury Findings**

**THIS IS AN EXTRACT OF THE JURY REPORT FILED AT THE INQUEST RESPECTING THE DEATH OF KENTON JOEL CARNEGIE WHICH WAS CONDUCTED OCTOBER 29 - 30 and NOVEMBER 1, 2007 AT PRINCE ALBERT, SASKATCHEWAN.**

The 6 person jury inquired into the death of the above named and their findings are as follows:

**Name of Deceased: Kenton Joel Carnegie**

**Date of Death: November 8, 2005 between 1600 - 1900 hours**

**Place of Death: Approximately ½ mile south of Points Northing Camp along path adjacent to lake**

**Cause of Death: Injuries consistent with a wolf attack**

**By What Means: Accident**

Recommendations:

**To: SERM**

All persons/departments involved in any aspect of wildlife

#1. Provide education to residents, employees/employers, visitors in Northern settings of the extreme danger of all predatory animals, especially wolf and/or bear.

**To: SERM**

**Landfill Regulations**

#2. Establish a standard to address every landfill in Saskatchewan where there has been predatory animals cited. This should include but not be limited to : upgrading, proper fencing i.e.: electric fencing and secure fencing , maintenance, security and supervision of all landfill sites.

eg: 1. animal proof receptacles.

2. someone to (illegible word) monitor and enforce fines if landfills aren't properly maintained/supervised.

**To: RCMP, SERM and Coroner's Offices of Saskatchewan**

#3. A protocol should be established between the RCMP, SERM and the Coroner's Office to (illegible word) co-ordinate investigations of suspected predator attacks. SERM should

immediately be contacted and work with the RCMP and the coroner to assist with the investigation.  
eg: establish a specific protocol/steps of how to deal with an investigation of an attack.

**To: SERM  
Conservation**

#4. Take the initiative to develop and implement educational information regarding predatory animals. Provide and distribute information on dangerous predatory animals in Saskatchewan to the public.

**To: SERM  
Wildlife and Conservation**

#5. Review procedures for the destruction of habituated animals to ensure increased safety of habitants in the north. Response times for permits to destroy habituated, dangerous, predatory animals should be immediate!

**To: SERM and Economic Development Organizations  
Wildlife and Conservation Department  
Mining company, private companies, First Nations or any other persons occupying the  
North**

#6. All predatory animals should be reported immediately to an identified individual on site.  
eg: signage should be posted with a contact person and phone number to report nuisance animals.
