Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

January 2019

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering January 13th to 19th, 2019, there were 567,800 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 5,400 from December 2018, but 7,700 more than the number employed in January 2018.

Agricultural employment was 36,700 persons in January 2019, down 1,900 from the December 2018 level, but 3,500 more than the January 2018 agricultural employment level of 33,200. Non-agricultural employment was 531,100 persons in January 2019. This is a decrease of 3,500 from the December 2018 non-agriculture employment level of 534,600, but 4,200 more than January 2018.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for January 2019 was 5.8 percent. This is a slight increase of 0.4 percentage points from the December 2018 rate of 5.4 percent, but 0.2 percentage points lower than the January 2018 level of 6.0 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> decreased by 3,000 to 602,900 persons in January 2019 from 605,900 persons in December 2018. This is 6,900 more than the January 2018 labour force of 596,000 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> fell 0.4 percentage points to 67.9 percent in January 2019 from 68.3 percent in December 2018. The January 2018 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 67.7 percent.

There were 35,200 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during January 2019. This is an increase of 2,500 from December 2018, but is 700 less than the number unemployed in January 2018.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 576,200 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in January 2019, down 2,800 from the December 2018 level of 579,000, but is up 7,900 from the January 2018 employment level of 568,300 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>seasonally adjusted</u> <u>unemployment rate</u> for January 2019 was 5.5 percent. This is a slight decrease of 0.1 percentage points from the December 2018 and January 2018 rates of 5.6 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>unadjusted employment</u> decreased by 198,500 persons in January 2019 to 18,569,800 persons from 18,768,300 persons in December 2018. In January 2018, there were 18,231,300 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unadjusted unemployment rate</u> increased 1.0 percentage points in January 2019 to 6.2 percent from the December 2018 level of 5.2 percent. In January 2018, Canada's unemployment rate was 6.2 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted unemployment</u> <u>rate</u> for Canada was 5.8 percent in January 2019. This is 0.2 percentage points higher than December 2018, but 0.1 percentage points lower than the January 2018 level of 5.9 percent.
