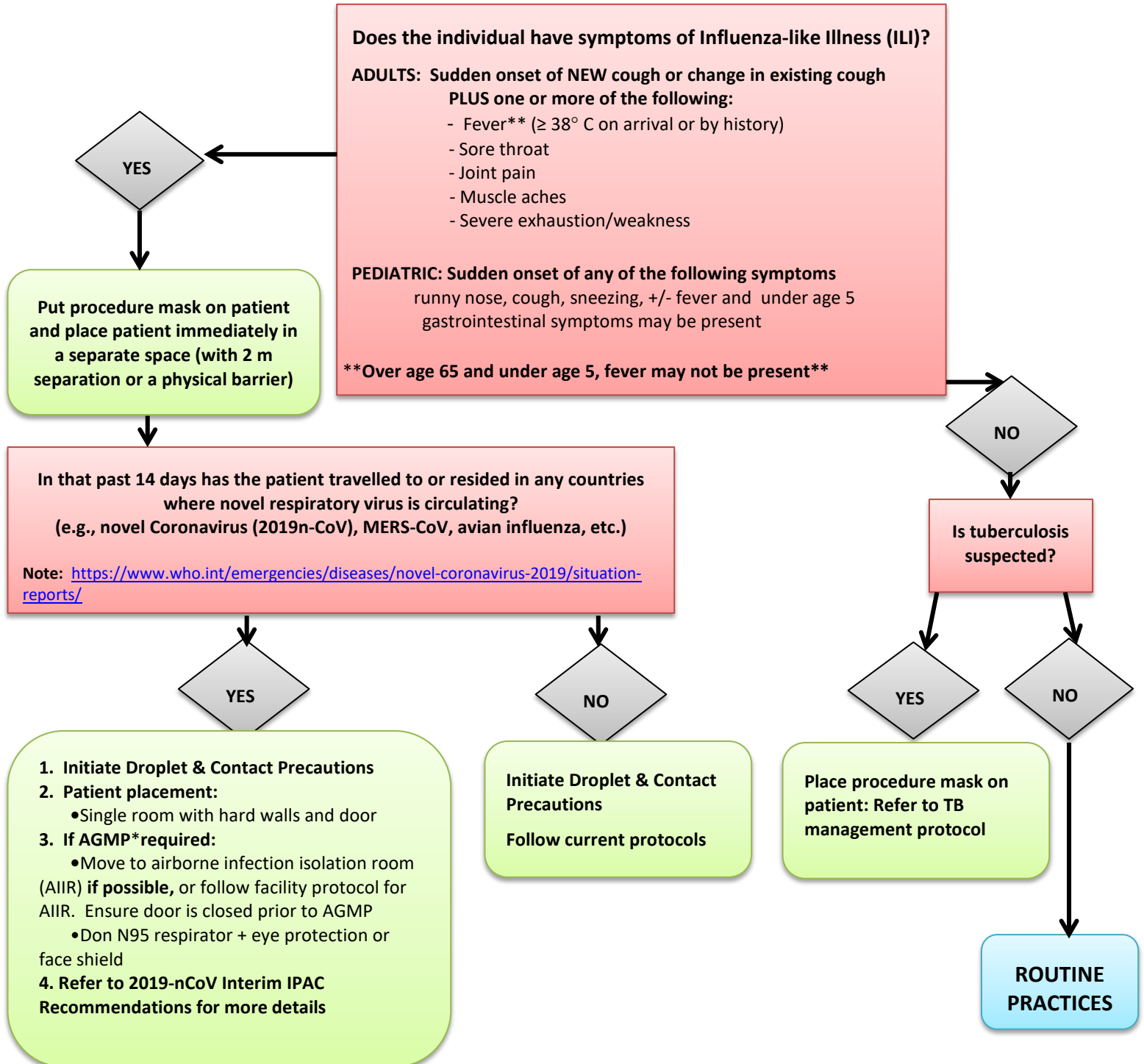


Screening For Respiratory Illness

Intended for use in Emergency Departments and Ambulatory/Urgent Care Settings



Note: *Aerosol Generating Medical Procedure (AGMP) is any procedure that may induce production of aerosols of various sizes, including droplet nuclei.

AGMPs considered high risk for private room placement include: Endotracheal intubation and related procedures, high frequency oscillatory ventilation, bronchoscopy, laryngoscopy, positive pressure ventilation (BIPAP & CIPAP), sputum induction and autopsy of lung tissue.

Other AGMPs include: CPR, airway suctioning, tracheostomy care, humidified high flow oxygen systems (e.g., ARVO, Optiflow), chest physiotherapy, administering aerosolizing or nebulizing medications. For further information see link below.
