Outdoor Fun for All Ages!

- It's time for a new family photo! Start at the Visitor Centre and look for the Duck Mountain Photo Hop sign. Follow the prompts on the sign to help you find fun, wild, and silly areas in the park to complete the listed photo opportunities. Be as creative as you want and show us on social media by tagging #SaskParks on Facebook and Instagram.
- Grab your skates and lace up! Duck Mountain's skating rink has room for everyone, from beginners to Olympians. The skating rink is located between the tobogganing hill and the Visitor Centre. A warm-up shack is provided (social distancing is required). Please bring your own skates.
- Let's get sledding! Duck Mountain's groomed tobogganing hill is located by the Visitor Centre.
- Do you like curling? What about Crokinole? Then try your hand at Crokicurl every weekend by the skating rink! Offered during park operating hours, first-come, first-serve.
- Stop by the Visitor Centre and grab an outdoor Park Activity Kit (PAK)! These PAKs are designed to bring the joy of play and nature exploration to your family.
- Have you built a fairy house at the park in the summer? Winter fairies need homes too. Head down towards the beach to find coloured ice blocks waiting to become a winter fairy castle or other creative design.

Outdoor Adventure

- Bundle up and grab your tackle box because Madge Lake has awesome ice-fishing! Ask staff about popular fishing spots. Fishing licenses are required for Saskatchewan residents aged 16-64. Purchase your fishing license from <https://www.saskatchewanhal.ca/licensing.page> or at the Administration Office/Visitor Centre.
- Calling all skiing and snowboarding enthusiasts! Did you know you can snowboard, cross-country ski and downhill ski all in one day at the Duck Mountain Ski Area? Duck Mountain Ski Area opens at 9:30 am and the Lifts run from 10:00 am until 4:30 pm. Equipment rentals are available at the lodge. In the case of severe weather, the ski hill will be closed. If you're unsure, please call 306-542-4111 to confirm.
- Step into your snowshoes and onto the trails! There are 78 km of trails available at Duck Mountain Provincial Park that are awesome for snowshoeing. Snowshoe rentals are available in the park: \$5/day for youth (under 18) and \$10/day for adults.
- Load up your snowmobile and enjoy the fresh powder at Duck Mountain! There are 40 km of snowmobile trails available at the park. Pick up your maps at the park office or on the Saskatchewan Snowmobile Association website.
- Pack up your fat bike! There's no better winter exercise than cycling through some snow. Duck Mountain has an awesome 12 km fat bike trail! Call the park for more details at 306-542-5500.

- Don't worry about packing supper, The Iron Grill in Kamsack has you covered! The Iron Grill will be offering a food delivery service to visitors staying at Madge Lake Resort located in Duck Mountain's core area! Call them for more details at 306-542-4745.
- Need lunch? The Duck Mountain Ski Area will be serving food while you're out on the hills! With options for the whole family, you're bound to walk away with a happy stomach.
