Join us on January 8, February 12 and March 5 for a candle-lit evening ski starting at 7:00 pm. The trail begins at Little Kenosee and is 3.2 km.

Outdoor Fun for All Ages!

- Curling and crokinole collide! Try your hand at Crokicurl this winter, located at McNaughton Heights.
- Build an ice castle! Take a short walk to McNaughton Heights, first left after the entry gate, to find coloured ice blocks waiting to become homes for the park's fairies, elves and gnomes.
- Bring your toboggan and fly down the hill, located at your first left after the entrance gate (watch for the sign). Warm-up shelter available.
- It's time for a new family photo! Start at the Administration Office/Visitor Centre, and look for the Moose Mountain Photo Hop sign. Follow the prompts on the sign to help you find fun, wild, and silly areas in the park to complete the listed photo opportunities. Be as creative as you want and show us on social media by tagging #SaskParks on Facebook and Instagram.
- Grab an outdoor Pick-up Park Activity Kit (PAK) from the Administration Office/Visitor Centre or McNaughton Heights. These self-use kits will take you and your family through a variety of fun outdoor activities!

Outdoor Adventure

- Load up your snowmobile and enjoy over 100 km of groomed trails! Toes getting cold? We have you covered with eight warm-up shelters throughout the trails stocked with firewood, axe, matches, paper and hand sanitizer.
- Cross-country skiing more your thing? Bring your skis and glide peacefully through the forest on set tracks or skate ski. Over 50 km of groomed trails ranging from novice to expert are available to you with stocked warm-up shelters. Majority of trailheads located at Little Kenosee and Whitetail Trail off Arcola Road. Ski rentals available at Kenosee Inn (306-577-2099).
- Pack your snowshoes and a warm pair of boots and hike with ease on Peninsula, Youell and Beaver Lake trails. Snowshoe rentals available at Kenosee Inn! (306-577-2099)
- Access to Kenosee and Little Kenosee Lakes is available for ice fishing. Bring your gear and try your luck! Fishing licenses are required for Saskatchewan residents aged 16-64. Purchase your fishing license from <https://www.saskatchewanhal.ca/licensing.page> or at the Administration Office/Visitor Centre.
