

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

February 2021

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering February 14th to 20th, there were 538,700 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 700 from January 2021 and 22,700 less than the number employed in February 2020.

Agricultural employment was 30,200 persons in February 2021, up 200 from the January 2021 level but down 6,300 from the February 2020 agricultural employment level of 36,500. Non-agricultural employment was 508,500 persons in February 2021. This is a decrease of 900 from the January 2021 non-agriculture employment level of 509,400 and 16,400 less than February 2020.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for February 2021 was 7.9 per cent. This is an increase of 0.2 percentage points from the January 2021 rate of 7.7 per cent and 1.5 percentage points higher than the February 2020 level of 6.4 per cent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 600 to 584,700 persons in February 2021 from 584,100 persons in January 2021. This is 15,200 less than the February 2020 labour force of 599,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate did not change from the January rate of 65.8 per cent. The February 2020 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 67.5 per cent.

There were 46,000 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during February 2021. This is an increase of 1,300 from January 2021 and 7,500 more than the number unemployed in February 2020.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis, there were 549,700 persons employed in Saskatchewan in February 2021, up 2,300 from the January 2021 level of 547,400 but down 23,000 from the February 2020 employment level of 572,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for February 2021 was 7.3 per cent. This is an increase of 0.1 percentage points from the January 2021 rate of 7.2 per cent and 1.0 percentage points higher than the February 2020 rate of 6.3 per cent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian unadjusted employment increased by 309,300 persons in February 2021 to 18,251,600 persons from 17,942,300 persons in January 2021. In February 2020, there were 18,849,900 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unadjusted unemployment rate decreased by 1.2 percentage points in February 2021 from the January 2021 level of 9.8 per cent. In February 2020, Canada's unemployment rate was 5.9 per cent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 8.2 per cent in February 2021. This is 1.2 percentage points lower than January 2021 but 2.5 percentage points higher than the February 2020 level of 5.7 per cent.
