*Here's what you need to know about the 2021
camping season!*

Reservation Basics

1 Reservations for the 2021 camping season can be made online at parks.saskatchewan.ca or call centre at 1-833-775-7275 (1-833-7SK-PARK).

- Customers will be required to create new accounts on the reservation system. Your previous Sask Parks Reservation System logins and passwords will not work since the system is operated by a new service provider.
- The \$12 reservation fee is charged per campsite booked and covers the cost of administering the system. An additional \$2.00 call centre surcharge is charged for all transactions processed through the call centre. These reservation fees are **non-refundable**.
 - E.g. If you book two different campsites, you will be charged two reservation fees.
- Full payment is required at time of booking. Acceptable payment methods are Visa, Mastercard, Visa Debit, Mastercard Debit. Cash and Interac Debit accepted in-park as well.

2 2021 Reservation Launch Schedule is as follows:

- April 12: Seasonal Camping (all parks offering seasonal camping)
- April 13: Break
- April 14: Pike Lake, The Battlefords, Narrow Hills, Blackstrap
- April 15: Break
- April 16: Bronson, Meadow, Makwa Lake, La Ronge
- April 19: Saskatchewan Landing, Douglas, Danielson
- April 20: Buffalo Pound, Rowan's Ravine, Echo Valley, Crooked Lake
- April 21: Cypress Hills
- April 22: Duck Mountain, Good Spirit Lake, Greenwater Lake
- April 23: Candle Lake, Great Blue Heron, Moose Mountain



3 All launch days will begin at 7 a.m. each weekday morning. Nightly camping launch will be a staggered launch for each park, and includes reservations for nightly camping (full service, electrical, non-electrical, economy and backcountry), Camp-Easy and Mongolian yurt, equestrian camping, group camping, recreation halls and picnic shelters.

4 A pre-queue lobby will no longer be used on launch days however the same queue software will still be used but in a different way. Instead, the reservation system now monitors the amount of traffic on the site and the queue software will now function as a "virtual waiting" room if capacity thresholds on the site are triggered.

- When visitors exceed the site capacity, visitors are redirected to a waiting room (similar to the pre-queue lobby).
- They will be released back to the site in a first-in, first-out order, maintaining the integrity and fairness of the process.

5 Camping Terms and Conditions can be found on confirmation letters and also posted on saskparks.com and reservation website parks.saskatchewan.ca.

Nightly Camping

- 1 Nightly campsite reservations open at 7 a.m. CST on April 14, 2021 in staggered approach for stays during the 2021 camping season (May 20, 2021 until September 30, 2021).
- 2 Rates for nightly full-service sites and electric sites have changed for 2021. All other nightly rates remain unchanged as follows:
 - Regular rates in effect from May 20, 2021 to September 30, 2021:
 - Full-service site: \$44 per night (increased \$2 from 2020)
 - Electric site: \$33 per night (increased \$1 from 2020)
 - Non-electric site: \$20 per night
 - Equestrian site: \$20 per night
 - Economy site: \$18 per night
- 3 Backcountry camping permits will be piloted in 2021 at Narrow Hills and Meadow Lake and available for purchase online, call centre and in-park. Customers accessing the Narrow Hills Gem Lakes and Meadow Lake Boreal Trail must have a valid permit.
- 4 Same day bookings allowed until 8 p.m. on day of arrival.
- 5 There will be no maximum stay for nightly sites offered in 2021, following the positive response from the 2020 pilot. Campers will be able to book nightly camping for as long as they would like in the same campsite.
- 6 Auto check-in will be in operation again in 2021. Campers who have a reservation and an entry permit can continue to proceed directly to their campsite. Campers are automatically checked in by the system at 10 p.m.

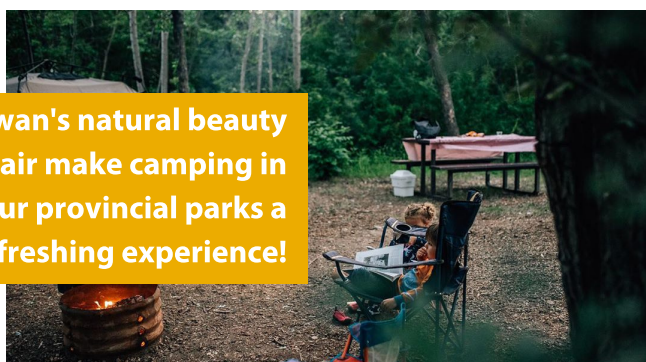

Seasonal Camping

- 1 Seasonal campsite reservations open at 7 a.m. CST on April 12, 2021 and can be booked until end of day May 19, 2021.
- 2 Any seasonal sites that have not been reserved by park opening (May 20) will be converted to nightly sites on May 20.
- 3 Seasonal campsite fees are as follows:
 - Full service: \$3,400 (new offering at Greenwater Lake and Meadow Lake)
 - Electric site: \$2,600
 - Non-electric site: \$1,400
 - Economy site: \$1,100
- 4 Seasonal campers need to purchase a vehicle entry permit.
 - For a senior with a seasonal campsite reservation, they can receive a Senior Annual Park Entry Permit upon presentation of ID.

Group Camping

- 1 Group campsite reservations open at 7 a.m. CST on the same day as the nightly campsites open for each park.

- 3 Group camping will be open for reservations in 2021 and 2022.

Camp-Easy

- 1 Camp-Easy and Mongolian yurt reservations open at 7 a.m. CST on the same day as the nightly campsites open for each park.
- 2 Camp-Easy sites will be available at the following provincial parks:

- 3 A refundable damage deposit will be owed at the time of reservation. If no damage occurs during stay and all supplied Camp-Easy equipment is accounted for, customers will be refunded their damage deposit. Parks are responsible for processing the refund – the Aspira One system will not automatically process this refund.
- 4 Customers will need to complete a Camp-Easy liability waiver that can be found on saskparks.com.
- 5 Mongolian Yurt at Great Blue Heron has a minimum 2-night stay for reservations in 2021.

Picnic Shelter Rental





- 1 Reservations for Pike Lake's picnic shelter open at 7 a.m. CST on April 14, 2021 for bookings in 2021 and 2022.
 - Cutoff time for picnic shelter bookings: reservations must be made by 8 p.m. CST 2 days prior to arrival date.
- 2 2021 Pike Lake picnic shelter rental fees remain unchanged at \$80 per day.



Entry Permits

1 A valid vehicle entry permit is required year-round within Sask Parks.

2 Vehicle entry permits offered in 2021:

3 Vehicle entry permits can now be purchased as standalone items on parks.saskatchewan.ca.

- Stand-alone daily and weekly entry permits are non-refundable; however, they can be upgraded to annual entry permit upon arrival at the park. Visitors can print at home or pick-up in park to display on their vehicle dashboard.
- Stand-alone annual vehicle permits and annuals purchased with a reservation before May 1 will be mailed to the mailing address associated with a customer's account. For annual vehicle entry permits purchased from May 1, 2021 to March 30, 2022, customers will need to pick up their permit at the park (any provincial park can fulfill the order). Parks will fulfill the order in-park and assign the serialized pass to the customer's account in the system.

4 Daily, weekly and annual entry permits will be automatically added to a booking by the reservation system unless the customer has an annual park entry permit or senior annual pass attached to their profile. The system will calculate entry fees based on length of stay and add the fees to the cart.

- Daily and weekly entry permits purchased with a reservation will be adjusted as needed if a reservation has been changed or cancelled (e.g. charged for extra nights/refunded for cancelled nights). No-show customers will not be refunded entry.
- Seven days before your arrival, you will receive an email from Sask Parks requesting that you pre-register your camping stay. As part of that process, you will be permitted to print your daily or weekly entry permit associated with your stay. With the printed permit, campers will be able to proceed directly to their campsite once they arrive in the park with Sask Parks' auto check-in function.

- 5 Saskatchewan residents 65 years or older (or turn 65 in the current year) may receive free entry to Saskatchewan Provincial Parks upon proof of age with government-issued ID at the park. They can be provided daily, weekly or an annual entry permit free of charge.
 - Saskatchewan residents 65 years or older can order a Senior Annual Entry Permit online but must collect the permit at the park as they must provide proof of eligibility with government-issued ID to collect the permit. The permit is assigned to their Sask Parks customer account and for their use only in Saskatchewan Provincial Parks.
 - For a senior with a seasonal campsite reservation, they can receive a Senior Annual Park Entry Permit upon presentation of ID.

Recreation Hall

- 1 Recreation hall reservations can be made online and via call centre for 2021 and 2022 starting at 7 a.m. CST on the same day as the nightly campsites open at the following parks:
 - April 14 – Pike Lake, The Battlefords
 - April 21 – Duck Mountain, Good Spirit, Greenwater Lake
 - April 22 – Moose Mountain
- 2 Recreation fees will vary depending on recreation hall size and length of booking as outlined below.

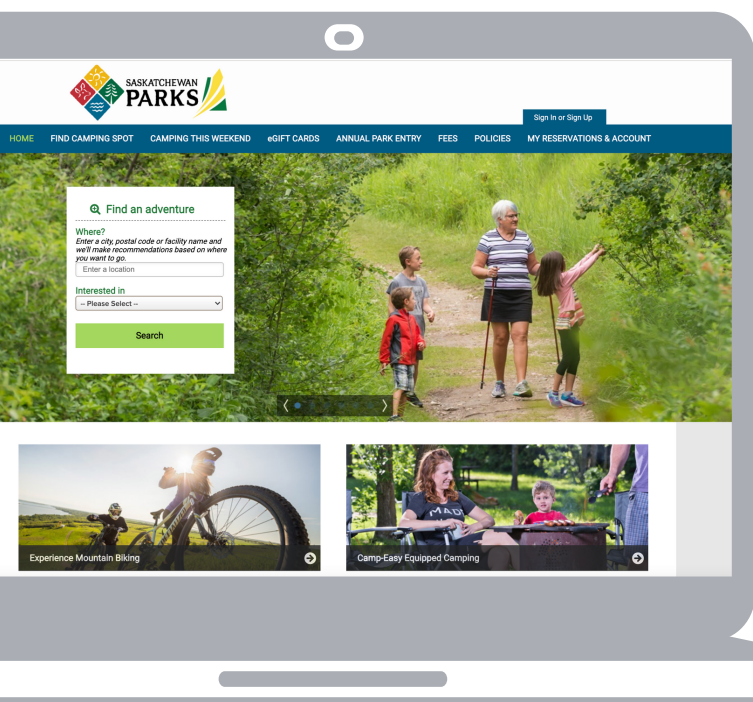
- 3 A refundable damage deposit will be owed at the time of reservation. The damage deposit will be refunded in whole or partially after inspection of the recreation hall.
- 4 Recreation halls are available for booking in half day or full day time slots. There is a refundable damage deposit associated with the reservations. If customers require multiple day reservations, they will need to complete two or more transactions. There will be two damage deposits associated with a two day reservation as an example. But they are refundable provided there is no damage to the facilities or the equipment within.

Swimming Lessons

- 1 Swimming lesson bookings open at 7 a.m. CST on the same day as the nightly campsites open for Buffalo Pound, Cypress Hills and Pike Lake.
 - Cutoff time for swimming lesson bookings: reservations must be made by 12 noon on the Friday before the Monday swimming lessons.
 - Sask Parks will continue to monitor the COVID-19 situation to determine if swimming lessons will be offered in 2021 and adjust accordingly.
- 2 A \$12 reservation fee will be charged for swimming lessons (including an additional \$2 surcharge if booked via the call centre).

eGift Cards

- 1 eGift Cards will be available for purchase online or via the call centre beginning April 12, 2021.
- 2 eGift Cards may only be redeemed towards the purchase of eligible goods and services offered on the Reservation Website, via the Call Centre and at Saskatchewan Provincial Parks, including campground reservations and walk-ins upon availability, park passes, and services operated solely by the Ministry of Parks, Culture and Sport. eGift Cards are not redeemable towards the purchase of goods and services offered by lessees operating in Saskatchewan Provincial Parks.
- 3 Sask Parks eGift Cards do not expire and we do not charge any service fees for non-use.
- 4 You can check your current balance or add more value to the eGift Card online at parks.saskatchewan.ca, by contacting the Call Centre, or in a Saskatchewan Provincial Park.

Reservation Changes and Cancellations

- 1 The grace period of cancelling or changing a reservation on the same day a reservation was created has been discontinued.
- 2 Change and cancellation fees are based on the type of site reserved. These fees are in addition to the reservation fee. Reservation, change and cancellation fees are non-refundable. Unless otherwise stated, you may change or cancel your reservation by visiting parks.saskatchewan.ca or by calling the Saskatchewan Provincial Parks Reservation Call Centre at [1-833-775-7275](tel:1-833-775-7275). If none of the following conditions apply, Saskatchewan Provincial Parks will apply the relevant transaction/penalty charges if you:
 - Shorten any dates on a reservation.
 - Change arrival date, except to extend a reservation by arriving earlier.
 - Downgrade to a lower-priced site or activity.

Backcountry Camping

- You can only change your backcountry camping reservation by calling the Saskatchewan Provincial Parks Reservation Call Centre at [1-833-775-7275](tel:1-833-775-7275).
- **Once a backcountry camping permit is printed, you cannot change or cancel the backcountry permit.**
- Changes to dates, permit holder name or park made prior to 2:00 p.m. CST of scheduled arrival date.
- Shortening your stay or cancelling your permit more than 24 hours prior to 2:00 p.m. CST of arrival.
- Shortening your stay or cancelling your permit less than 24 hours prior to 2:00 p.m. CST of arrival.

- Shortening your stay or cancelling your reservation less than 24 hours prior to 2:00 p.m. CST of arrival.

Equestrian Camping

- Changes to dates, permit holder name, park or campsite made prior to 2:00 p.m. CST of scheduled arrival date.
- Shortening your stay or cancelling your reservation more than 24 hours prior to 2:00 p.m. CST of arrival.
- Shortening your stay or cancelling your reservation less than 24 hours prior to 2:00 p.m. CST of arrival.
- You are considered a no-show and automatically cancelled by the park if the site is not occupied by 2:00 p.m. CST on second day of reservation.

Group Camping

- Changes to dates, permit holder name, park or campsite made prior to 2:00 p.m. CST of scheduled arrival date.
- Shortening your stay or cancelling your reservation more than 30 days prior to 2:00 p.m. CST of arrival.
- Shortening your stay or cancelling your reservation 30 days or less prior to 2:00 p.m. CST of arrival.
- You are considered a no-show and automatically cancelled by the park if the site is not occupied by 2:00 p.m. CST on second day of reservation.

Nightly Camping

- Double sites must be reserved, changed and cancelled together.

Picnic Shelters

- Changes to dates or permit holder name made prior 8:00 a.m. CST of arrival date.
- Cancellations completed 30 days or more prior to 8:00 a.m. CST of arrival date.
- Cancellations completed 8 to 29 days prior to 8:00 a.m. CST of arrival date.
- Cancellations completed 7 days or less prior to 8:00 a.m. CST of arrival date.
- You are considered a no-show if the picnic shelter is cancelled after 8:00 a.m. CST on arrival date.

Recreation Halls

- You can only change your recreation hall reservation by calling the Saskatchewan Provincial Parks Reservation Call Centre at [1-833-775-7275](tel:1-833-775-7275).
- Changes to dates and times or cancellations made 30 days or more prior to 9:00 a.m. of arrival date will incur a \$15 change and/or cancellation fee.
- Changes or cancellations made 30 days or less prior to 9:00 a.m. of arrival date to a recreation hall less than 200 square meters.

- Changes or cancellations made 30 days or less prior to 9:00am of arrival date to a recreation hall more than 200 square meters.
- You are considered a no-show and automatically cancelled by the park if recreation hall is not occupied for the reservation period.

Seasonal Camping

- Changes to site can only be made prior to 11:59 p.m. CST Wednesday before Victoria Day.
- Cancelling prior to 11:59 p.m. CST Wednesday before Victoria Day.
- Cancelling on or after Thursday before Victoria Day.
- You are considered a no-show and automatically cancelled by the park if site is not occupied by June 24 prior to noon CST.

Swimming Lessons

- Changes to dates, participant names or swimming level or cancellations made before 12:00 p.m. CST on the Friday prior to the first day of swimming lessons.
- Cancellations made after 12:00 p.m. CST of the Friday prior to the first day of swimming.

\$100 Change/Cancellation Fee

No-shows result in the forfeit of 100% of the recreation hall rate

Penalty

\$15 Change Fee

10% of the seasonal rate is forfeited

Results in 10% of the seasonal rate being forfeited plus the regular nightly rate multiplied by the number of nights occupied.

No-shows result in the forfeit of 10% of the seasonal rate plus the regular nightly rate multiplied by the number of nights from Thursday before Victoria Day to June 24.

Penalty

\$15 Change/Cancellation Fee

Forfeit 100% of all swimming costs
