ERRATA NOTICE

Pursuant to the authority given to me by section 4-11 of *The Legislation Act, The Financial Security and Site Closure Regulations*, as published in Part II of the Gazette on June 25, 2021 are corrected:

- (a) in subsection 4-2(1) by striking out the equation and substituting the following:

$$\text{“TD} = \left[\left(\frac{\text{ILT}}{\text{PA}_{\text{te}}} - \frac{\text{ILT}}{\text{PA}_{\text{to}}} \right) \times \text{ILT} \right] - \text{TD}_{\text{ut}}, \text{ where } 0 \leq \text{TD} \leq \text{ILT} \text{”};$$

- (b) in subsection 4-2(5) in the denominator of the equation by striking out “Deemed Reclamation Liability” and substituting “Deemed Reclamation Liability”; and
- (c) in the equation in subsection 7-3(1) by striking out “Orphan fund Levy” and substituting “Orphan fund levy”.

SASKATCHEWAN REGULATIONS 104/2021*The Public Health Act, 1994*

Section 46

Order in Council 488/2021, dated September 29, 2021

(Filed September 29, 2021)

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Disease Control (COVID-19 Measures) Amendment Regulations, 2021*.

RRS c P-37.1 Reg 11 amended

2 *The Disease Control Regulations* are amended in the manner set forth in these regulations.

Section 2 amended

3 **Clause 2(1)(b) is amended by striking out “*The Regional Health Services Act*” and substituting “*The Provincial Health Authority Act*”.**

Section 25.2 amended

4(1) **Clause 25.2(3)(d) is amended by striking out “, except testing,”.**

(2) The following subsection is added after subsection 25.2(7):

“(7.1) Publishing an order made pursuant to subsection (2) on the Government of Saskatchewan’s website constitutes posting the order in a public place in accordance with clause 45(5)(c) of the Act”.

New section 25.5

5 The following section is added after section 25.4:

“Proof of vaccination or negative test result

25.5 For the purposes of the Act, a regulation, bylaw or order made pursuant to the Act that requires persons to provide evidence of any of the following in order to be allowed access to certain places frequented by others is not to be interpreted as making immunization mandatory:

- (a) evidence of being vaccinated against a communicable disease;
- (b) evidence of having a valid negative test result for a communicable disease”.

Coming into force

6(1) Subject to subsection (2), these regulations come into force on October 1, 2021.

(2) If these regulations are filed with the Registrar of Regulations after October 1, 2021, these regulations come into force on the day on which they are filed with the Registrar of Regulations, but are retroactive and are deemed to have been in force on and from October 1, 2021.
