

Cannington Manor Provincial Park

2022 Education Programs

Guided school programs are offered in the spring at Cannington Manor Provincial Park and are a great opportunity to immerse students in nature while investigating and applying learning objectives. Sask Parks' guided school programming connects the Saskatchewan Curriculum to nature-based learning.



Booking:

Bookings are accepted starting on Tuesday, January 4, on a first-come, first-served basis. Please complete the attached form and return by email to outdoorclassroom@gov.sk.ca

Cost:

School groups are no longer required to pay a program fee. A vehicle entry permit is required upon entry to the park for \$10/vehicle (buses and chaperone vehicles included). Permits are available for purchase from the Visitor Centre.

Program Dates:

Monday to Friday, May 16 to June 24, 2022.

Park Quick Facts:

- Located 30 minutes (27 km) from Moose Mountain Provincial Park
- 1880s settlement with reconstructed buildings and costumed staff
- Large picnic area with covered picnic shelter

In the Area:

- School programs and group camping available at Moose Mountain Provincial Park. Programs for both parks can be booked together.
- Original Humphry's/Hewlett House located just minutes from the park. Self-guided tours of the grounds available.

Historic/Social Programs

A Day at Cannington Manor (Grade 4-9)

Explore many aspects of settler life in this day long hands-on experience available for up to 30 students. This program includes a curriculum-linked village tour, exploration of Treaty and Canadian settlement policy through maps, hands-on activities and primary

and secondary resources. Students will play cricket and prepare an afternoon snack on the wood stove. Interpreters are certified in Food Safety. Additional materials are required for this program, a list will be provided at booking.

Experience the realities of settler life at Cannington Manor in this half-day program. This program includes a curriculum-linked village tour and a hands-on baking activity on the wood stove. Interpreters are certified in Food Safety.

Life and Leisure at Cannington Manor (Grade 4-12)

Take part in the life and leisure activities of the Victorian settlers at Cannington Manor. This program includes a curriculum-linked village tour and students will learn to play cricket.

Educational Programming:

Group Size:

Each program can accommodate 20-40 students. For larger group sizes, contact us at outdoorclassroom@gov.sk.ca to discuss program options.

Group Camping:

Group camping is available to school groups free of charge from September 7, 2021 to June 23, 2022! To book group campsites, please contact the park office at 306-577-2606. Standard nightly group camping fees apply from June 24, 2022 until September 6, 2022, in addition to a \$12 non-refundable reservation fee when booked online. Visit saskparks.com for standard nightly group rates. Valid vehicle entry permits are required.



Know Before You Go

Note: teachers and chaperones are required to participate in all programs.

Be Prepared for the Weather:

Bring sunscreen, insect repellent and warm and waterproof clothing. Rubber boots may also be required for your program.

Cell Coverage:

There is good cell service at Cannington Manor Provincial Park. Wi-Fi is not available.

Late Arrivals or Cancellations:

Programs are not usually cancelled due to weather unless requested by the school or in extreme/unsafe situations. Please phone us to let us know if you are late arriving. We will try to accommodate changes, however, late arrivals may result in program reduction or cancellation due to other school booking commitments.

Campfires:

Campfires are allowed in the park. Pack a lunch to extend your visit. Please bring matches, roasting sticks and an axe. Wood is provided on site. Please discuss campfire needs during your booking. In the case of a fire ban, campfires are prohibited. To find out if the park is under a fire restriction or ban head to saskparks.com.

Drinking Water:

Limited drinking water is available on site. Plan ahead and bring filled water bottles.

Safety:

In case of medical or other emergencies, all groups must maintain their own transportation while visiting the park.

In the Classroom:

Discuss with your students ways that they can reduce their impact — reduce packaging on food items, recycle materials and respect the natural environment during your visit.
