Introduction

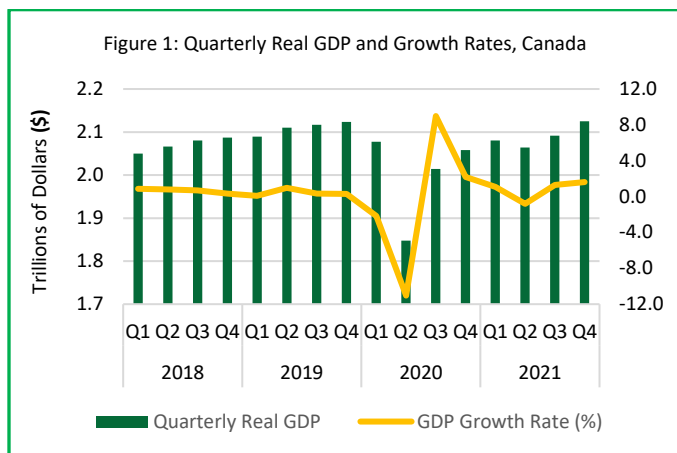
In 2021, the effect of the COVID-19 pandemic on Saskatchewan's economy lessened, and most economic indicators showed signs of recovery. The output of most sectors of the economy expanded. Manufacturing was up by 12.0 per cent, mining and oil and gas increased by 6.7 per cent, and utilities were up by 3.2 per cent. Service-producing industries also remained strong, regardless of a percentage dip in transportation and warehousing.

Internationally, the Fraser Institute ranked Saskatchewan as the second most attractive jurisdiction in the world for mining investment in 2021. However, amidst these gains, the Saskatchewan economy contracted by 0.3 per cent in 2021 due to a significant decline in agricultural crop production caused by drought.

Canadian Economic Growth

According to Statistics Canada, the real national GDP at market price increased by 4.5 per cent in 2021, as many sectors of the Canadian economy emerged from significant contractions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020.

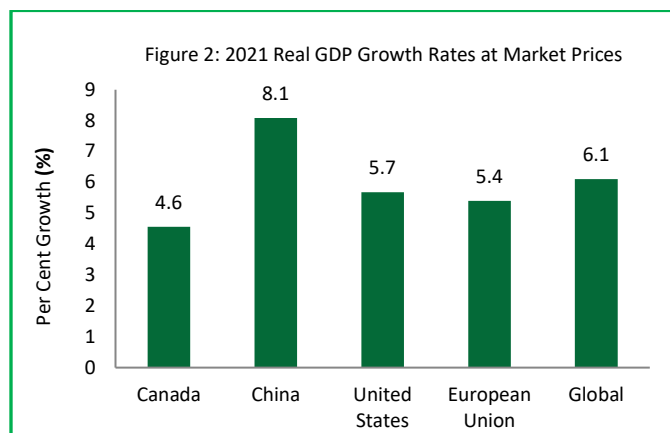
Targeted government support programs boosted household incomes and enabled business recovery, providing stability and resiliency to the economy.



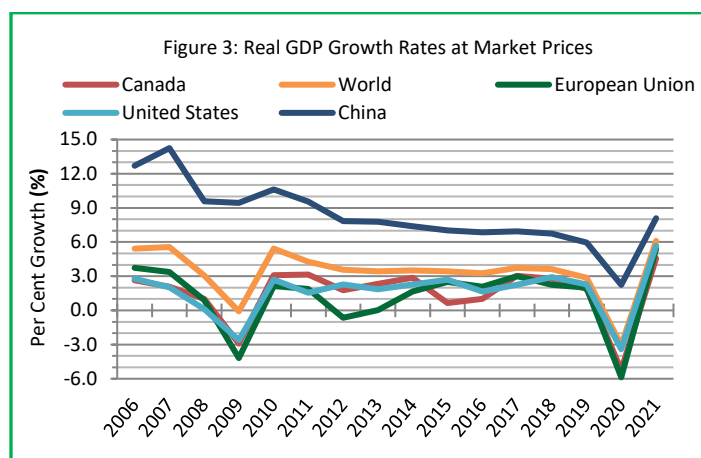
Global Economic Growth

According to the International Monetary Fund (IMF), the global economy grew by 6.1 per cent. The robust recovery in 2021 was driven by solid consumer spending and some uptake in investment, with trade in goods surpassing pre-pandemic levels.

There was a rebound in GDP for all G7 countries, with the United Kingdom having the highest GDP of 7.4 per cent.



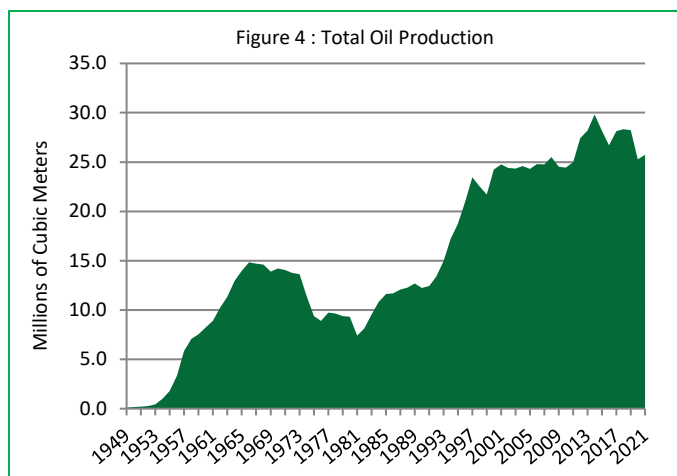
The European union reflected a similar pattern in recovery with an expansion of 5.4 per cent. China's GDP grew by 8.1 per cent, surpassing its 10-year average of 6.8 per cent.



Oil & Natural Gas

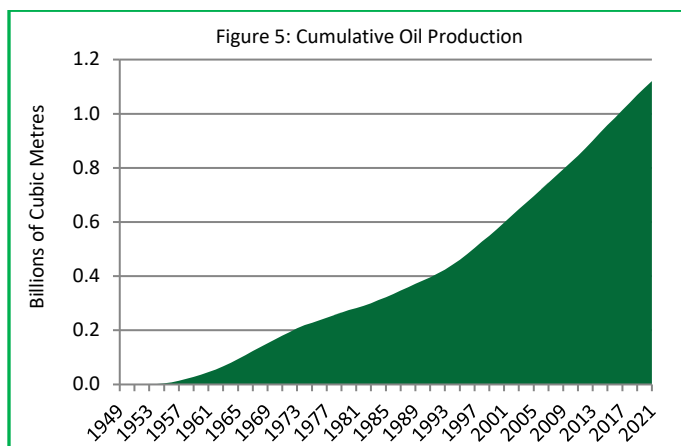
In 2021, the total value of Saskatchewan's natural gas sales rose significantly by 45.0 per cent, making it the most significant growth since 2014. Similarly, the full value of oil sales increased from \$5.6 billion in 2020 to \$10.9 billion in 2021. However, during this same period, Saskatchewan remained the third-largest natural gas-producing province in Canada, with an annual production of 4.0 billion cubic metres, which is a decrease of 435.6 million cubic metres from 2020.

Annual oil production in 2021 was 25.4 million cubic metres (159.5 million barrels), an increase of 61.6 thousand cubic metres (387.6 thousand barrels) from the previous year.

On a cumulative basis, Saskatchewan's lifetime oil production reached 1.12 billion cubic metres in 2021.

A total of 1,319 new oil and gas wells were drilled in 2021. This is an increase of 261 wells from the 1,058 drilling in 2020. However, horizontal well drilling remained the predominant approach to drilling oil wells in Saskatchewan. In 2021, 82.4 per cent of drilled wells were horizontal, and the average in Kilometres drilled per well was 2.3 compared to 2.2 in 2020.

Potash

In 2021, potash production declined by 4.6 per cent from 13.7 million tonnes in 2020 to 13.1 million tonnes. In the same period, the average price of a tonne of potash (K_2O) was \$576.9, an increase of 44.8 per cent from \$398.4/tonne in 2020. As a result, the total value of potash sales increased from \$5.5 billion in 2020 to \$7.6 billion in 2021. Potash remained Saskatchewan's second-largest mineral export.

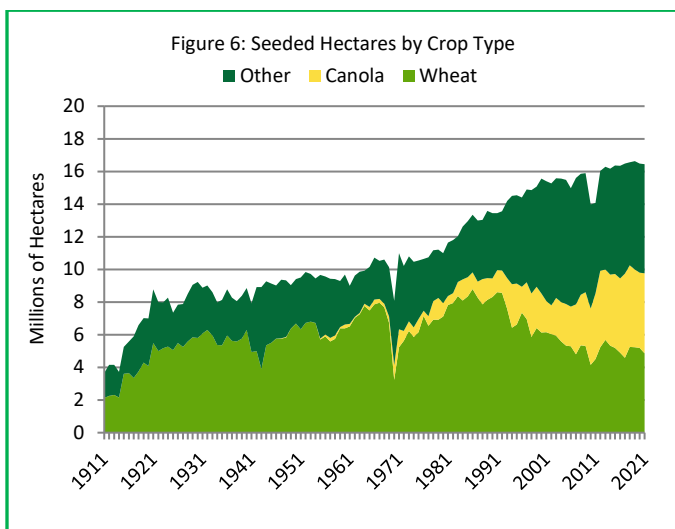
The United States, Brazil, Indonesia, and China accounted for 83.8 per cent of Saskatchewan's potash exports.

Agriculture

In 2021 Saskatchewan's growing conditions deteriorated during the planting season. Scorching conditions in Saskatchewan and the lack of precipitation negatively impacted crop yields. As a result, total crop production decreased by 46.9 per cent to 21.1 million tonnes from 39.8 million tonnes in 2020. This decline in production was across all types of crops harvested for the same period.

Wheat yields across the province dropped significantly by 43.4 per cent from an average of 3.1 tonnes/hectare (45.9bsh/ac) in 2020 to 1.7 tonnes/hectare (26.0bsh/ac). However, higher prices for commodities, especially in the grains sector, accounted for a 0.6 per cent increase in the value of grain and oil seed export for the period under review.

China was Saskatchewan's top export market for grains and oil seeds with a value of \$2.2 billion in 2021, up from \$1.8 billion in 2020.

Employment & Income

Saskatchewan's economy added 14,100 new jobs in 2021. Unemployment rate dropped by 1.9 per cent to 6.5 per cent in 2021. The labour force increased by 3,200 persons to 597,100 persons in the same period.

Average weekly earnings in Saskatchewan went up 1.5 per cent from a 2020 level of \$1,092 to \$1,108 per week in 2021.

The mining, oil, and gas sector continued to offer the highest average wages in the province at \$2,100 per week.

Investment

New capital investment in 2021 was \$12.3 billion, up \$234.7 million from 2020. Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction remained the sector with the highest share of capital spending at 35.2 per cent in 2021.

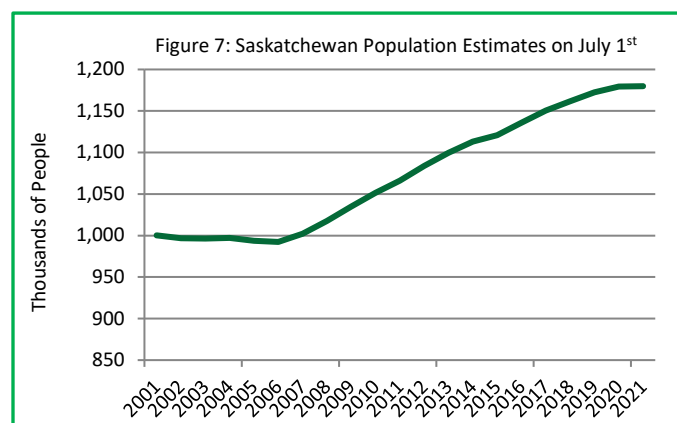
Between 2020 and 2021, housing starts rose by 35.1 per cent, the highest growth since 2012. During the same period, the value of building permits was up 25.5 per cent, and investment in non-residential building construction fell by 18.5 per cent. Investment in industrial components represented the highest

decrease of 27.8 per cent. The commercial, institutional and governmental components decreased by 17.7 per cent and 8.6 per cent, respectively.

Population

According to Statistics Canada, Saskatchewan's May 2021 Census population count was 1,132,505. This is an increase of 34,153 persons (3.1%) from the 2016 Census population of 1,098,352.

As of July 1, 2021, Statistics Canada's quarterly population estimates reported Saskatchewan's population to be 1.18 million. According to population estimates, there were 13,837 births and 10,630 deaths in the province between July 1, 2020, and June 30, 2021, with the number of deaths in 2021 above the 10-year average of 9,556 deaths. Natural increase of population dipped by 31.9 per cent to 3,207. In 2021, 2,663 more people left than moved to Saskatchewan.

Retail Trade

Saskatchewan retailers ended 2021 with \$22.8 billion in sales, up 14.6 per cent from 2020. On a per-capita basis, retail trade increased between 2020 and 2021 by \$2,462 per person to \$19,341. Sales were up in 10 out of 11 subsectors; the only decline was recorded by electronics and appliance stores.

Motor vehicles and parts remained the largest share of retail trade at 27.6 per cent or \$6.3 billion, an increase from \$5.3 billion in 2020.

Saskatchewan retail sales recorded the third-highest increase in percentage change among the provinces from 2020 to 2021. During the same period, national retail sales increased by 11.8 per cent.

Vehicles

The number of registered vehicles in Saskatchewan went up by 29,050 from 2020 to 1,183,514. Growth in the light (2.7%) and heavy trucks (4.4%) categories, which account for almost 60.0 per cent of total registrations, significantly contributed to the increase. Meanwhile, the cars segment decreased by 2.6 per cent.

In 2021, electric vehicle registrations increased by 84.9 per cent and have risen steadily since 2010. Registrations for diesel-powered and gasoline-powered vehicles increased slightly by 3.2 per cent and 1.6 per cent, respectively.

Utilities

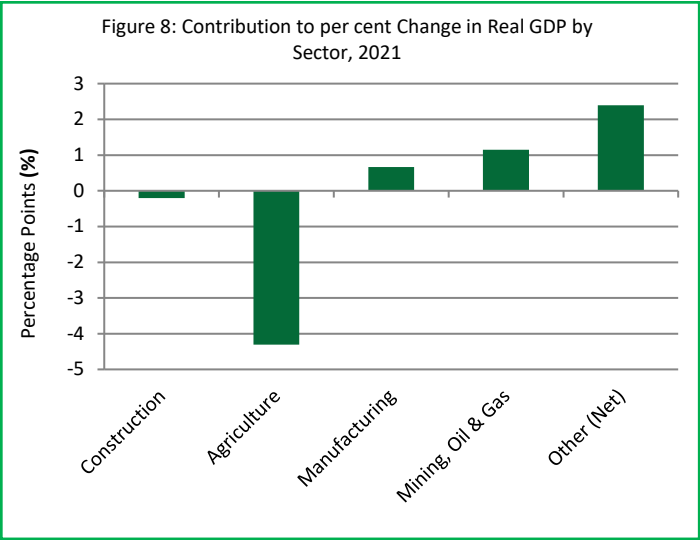
Saskatchewan’s electricity consumption increased from 24,536 GWh in 2020 to 25,544 GWh in 2021. The increase resulted from a significant increase in consumption by commercial, industry, oil fields, and residential components. Wind power generation increased by 42.5 per cent to 1,282 GWh in 2021.

Gas, coal, and hydropower generation accounted for 91.7 per cent of the total electricity production in Saskatchewan.

Conclusion

In 2021, Saskatchewan’s real GDP at basic prices contracted by 0.3 per cent. Despite the dip in growth, the manufacturing, mining, oil and gas industries expanded for the same period. The slump in growth was mainly as a result of the substantial decline in crop production caused by drought.

Saskatchewan’s population marginally increased in 2021. However, Saskatchewan’s economy added 14,100 new jobs and the unemployment rate dropped by 1.9 per cent to 6.5 per cent for the year 2021.

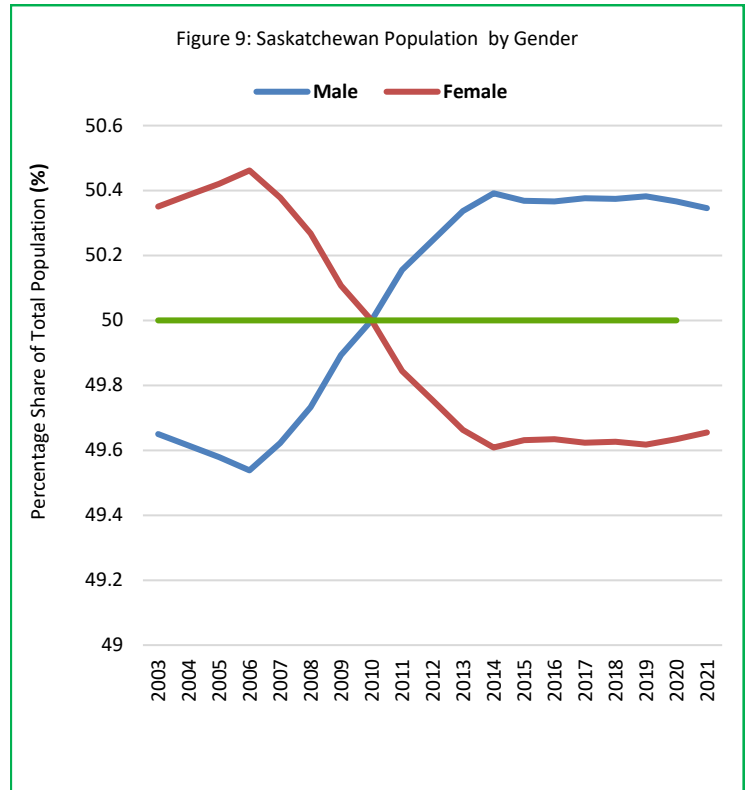

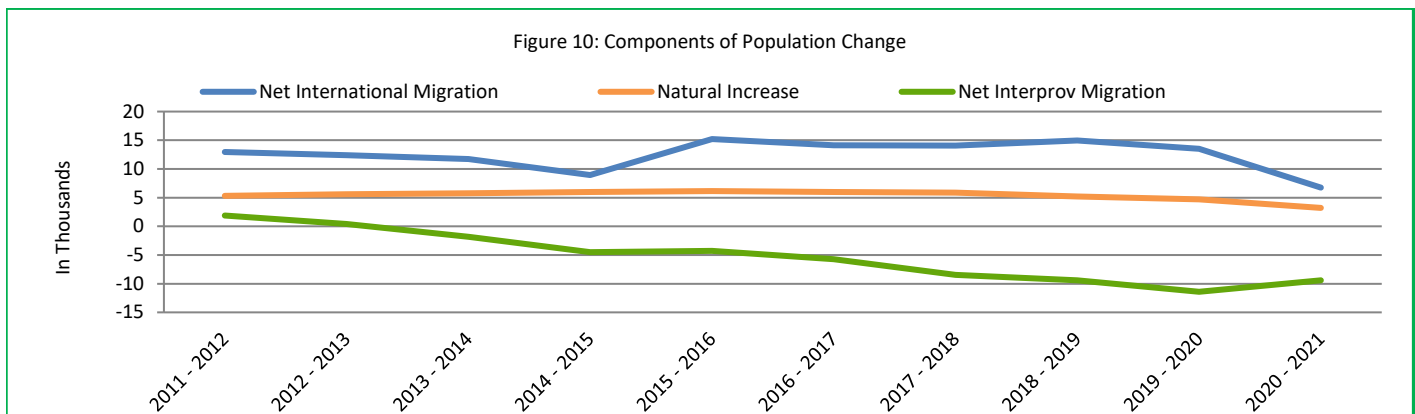

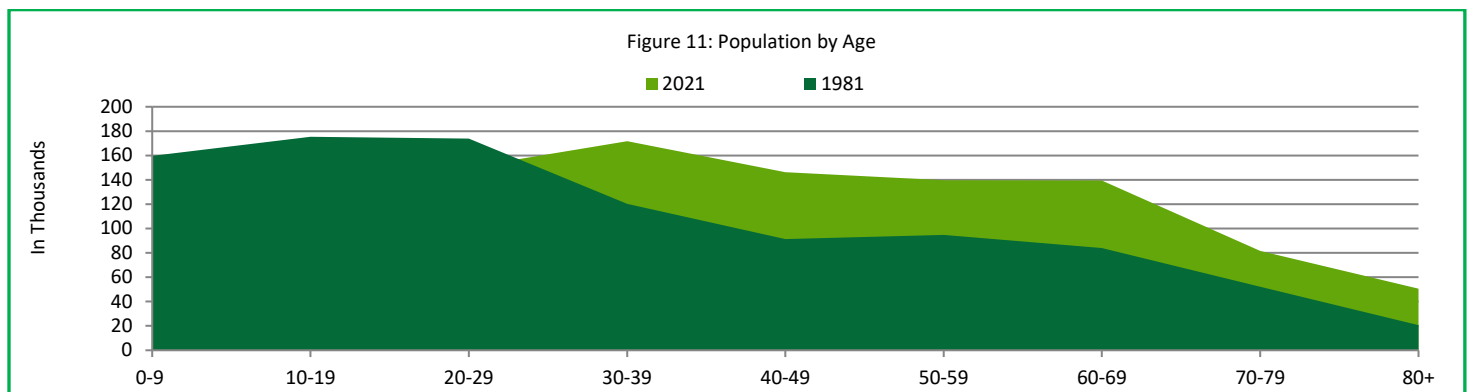

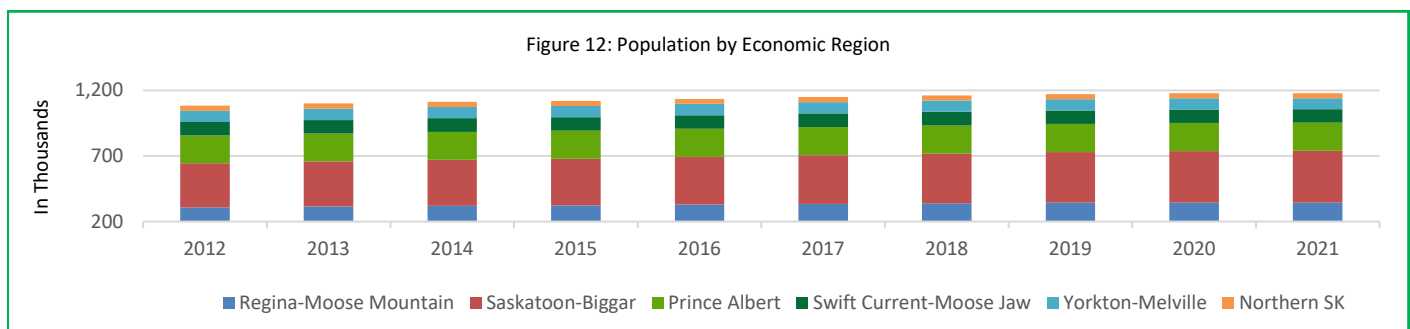

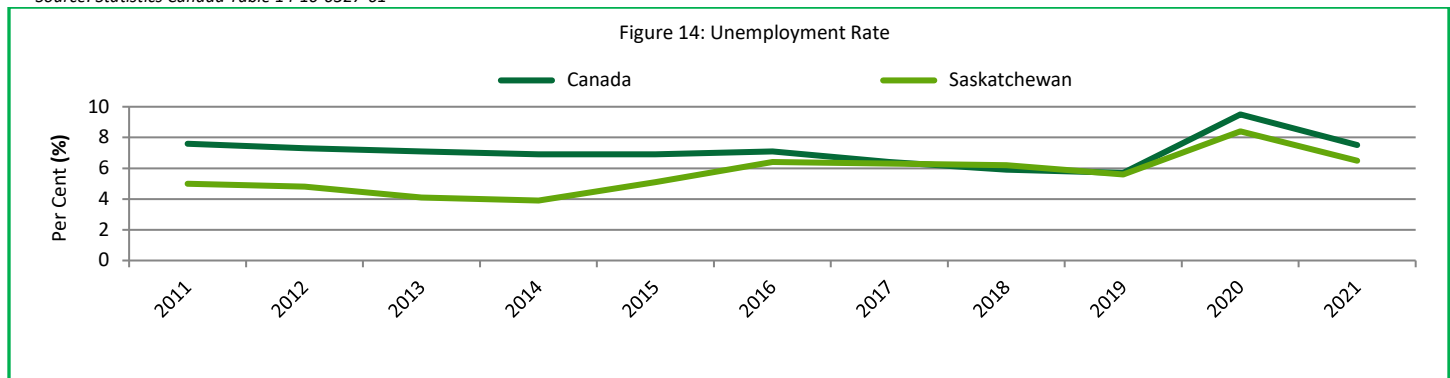

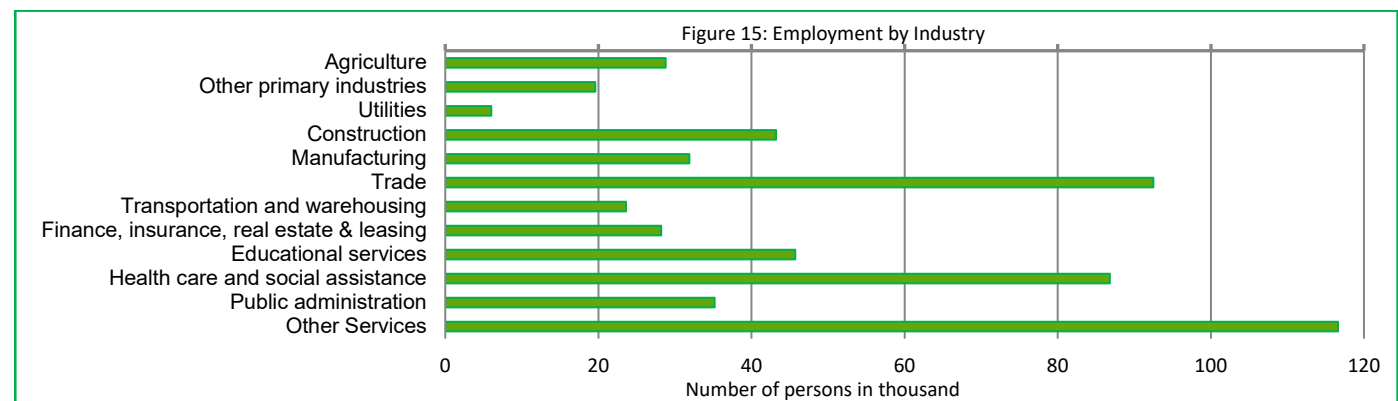

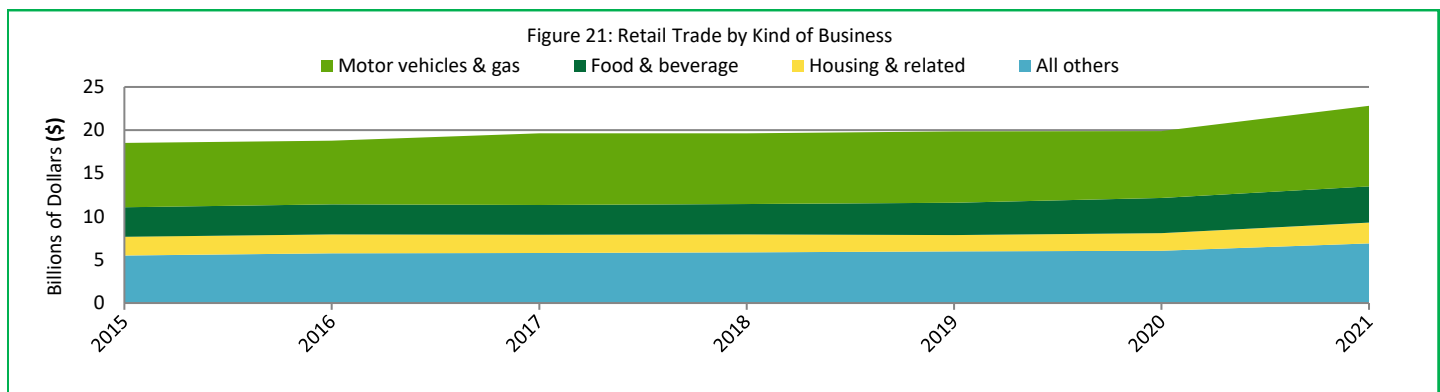

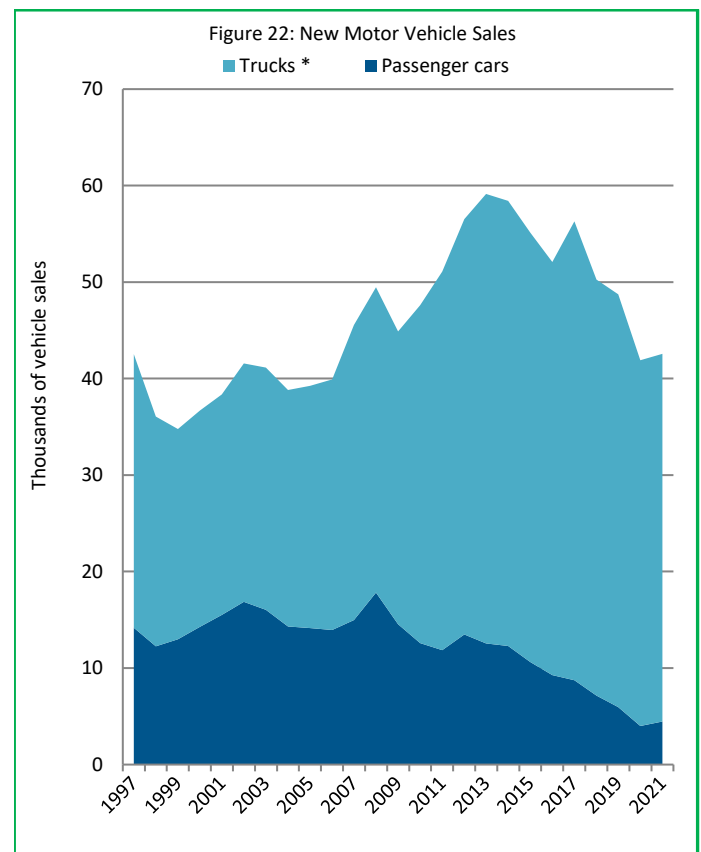

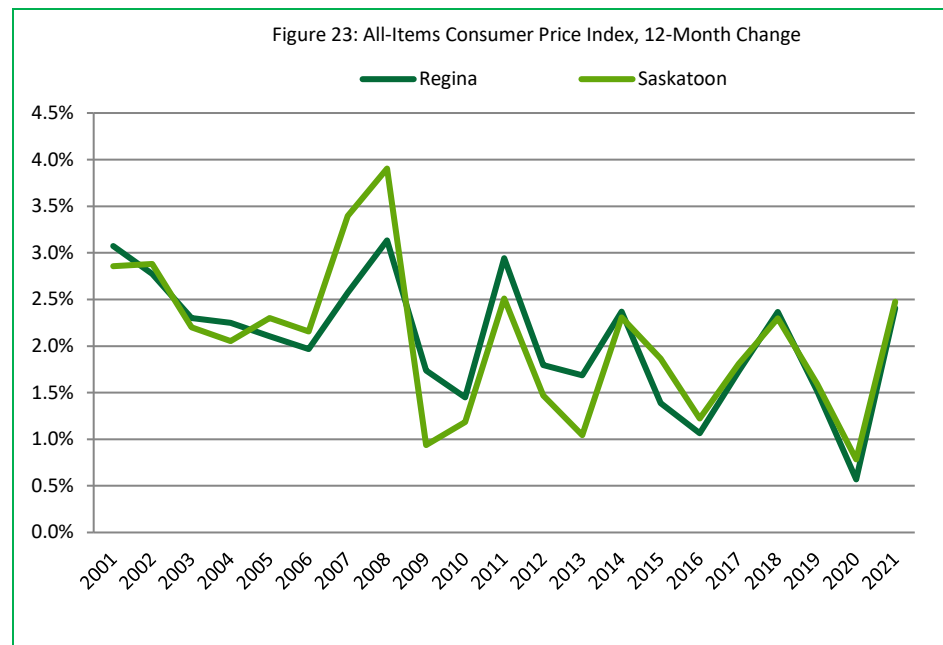

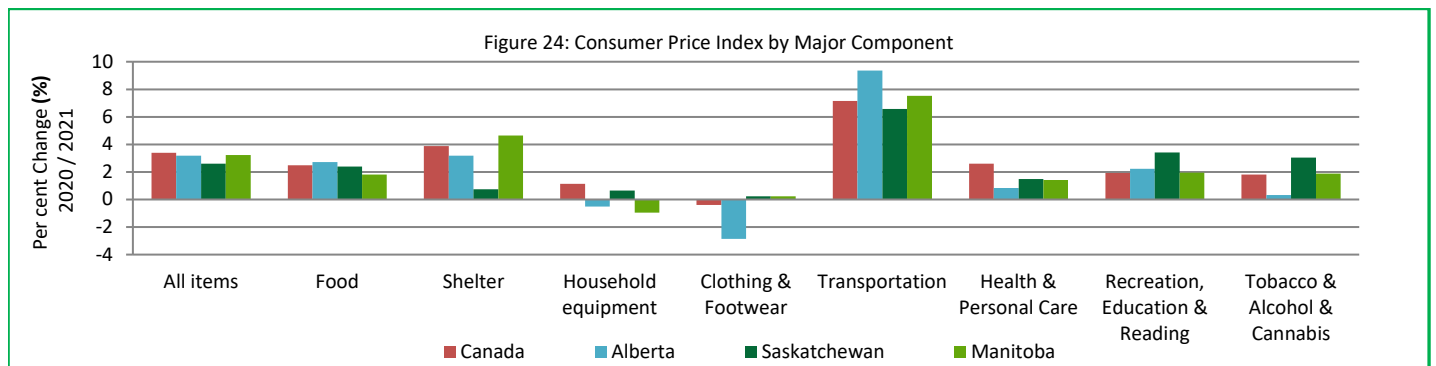


Table 18: Value of Building Permits Issued for Construction, Saskatchewan, Regina, Saskatoon

Figure 25: Value of Building Permits

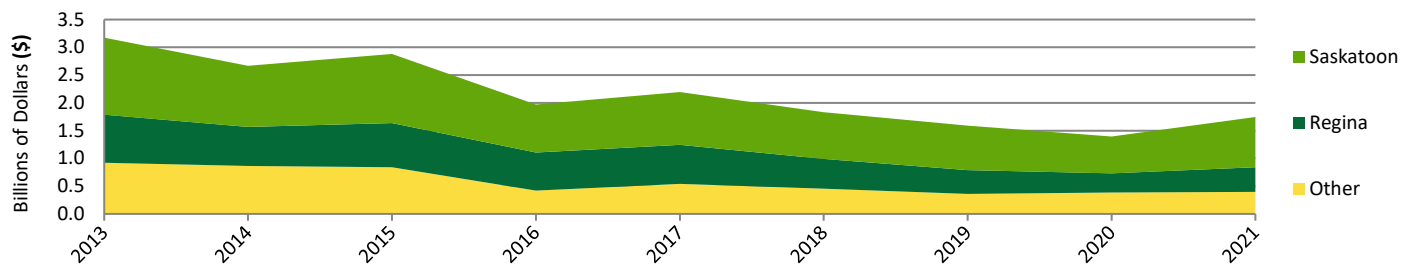

Figure 26: Saskatchewan Housing Statistics

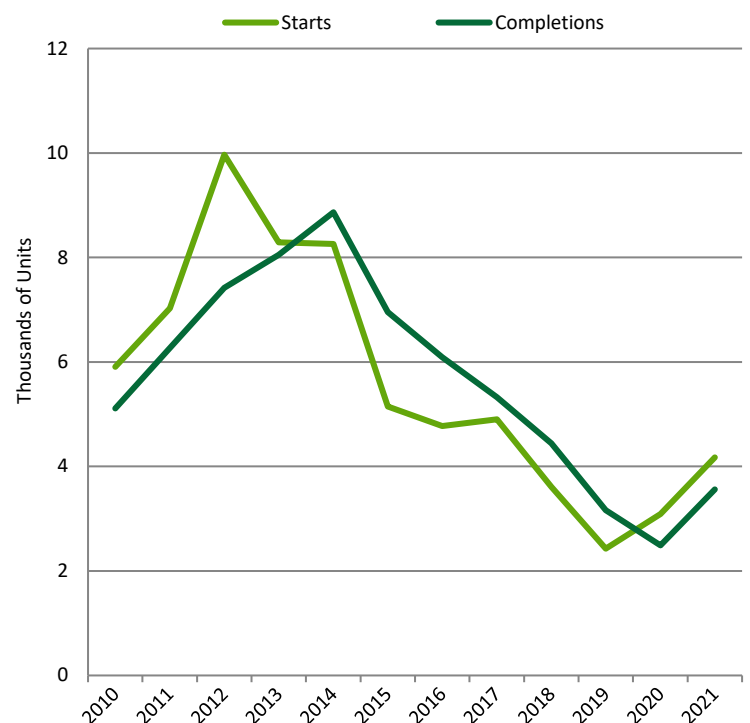

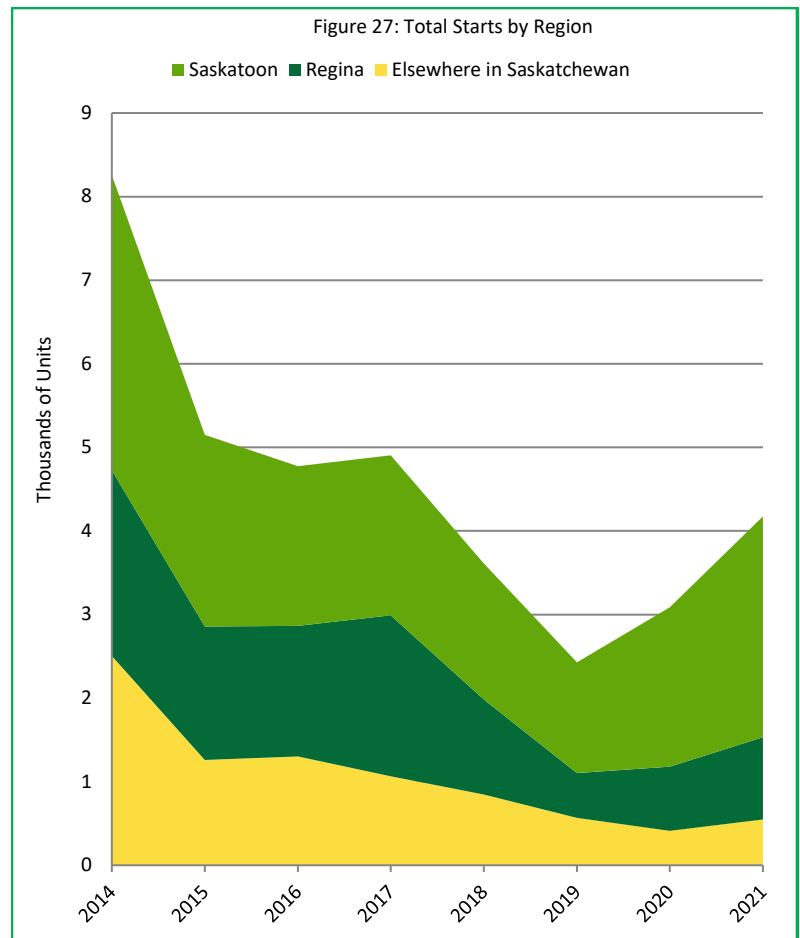

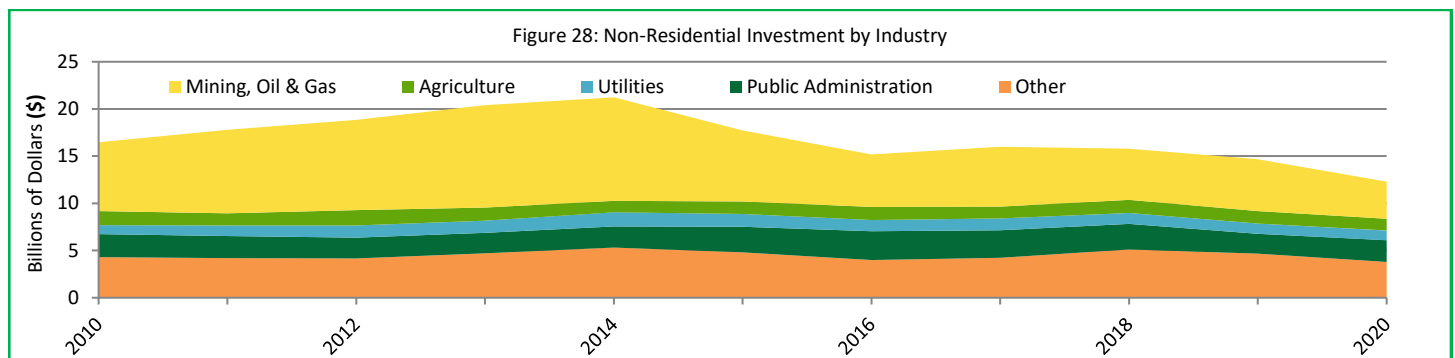

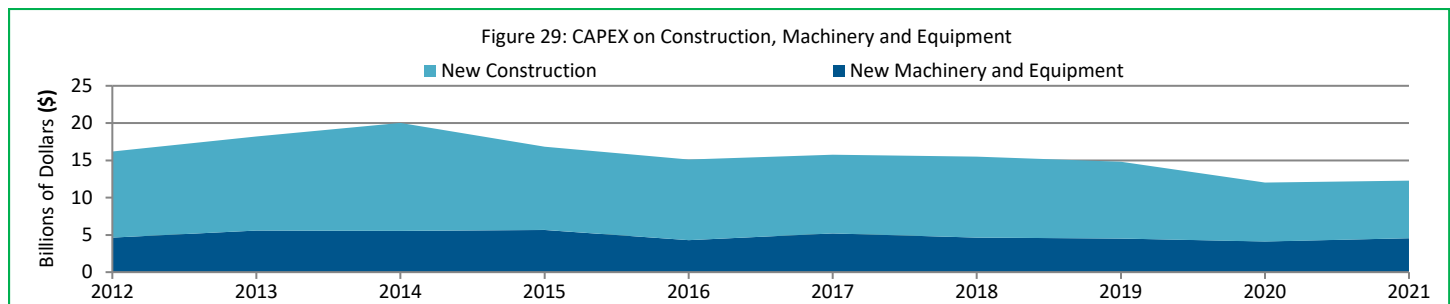

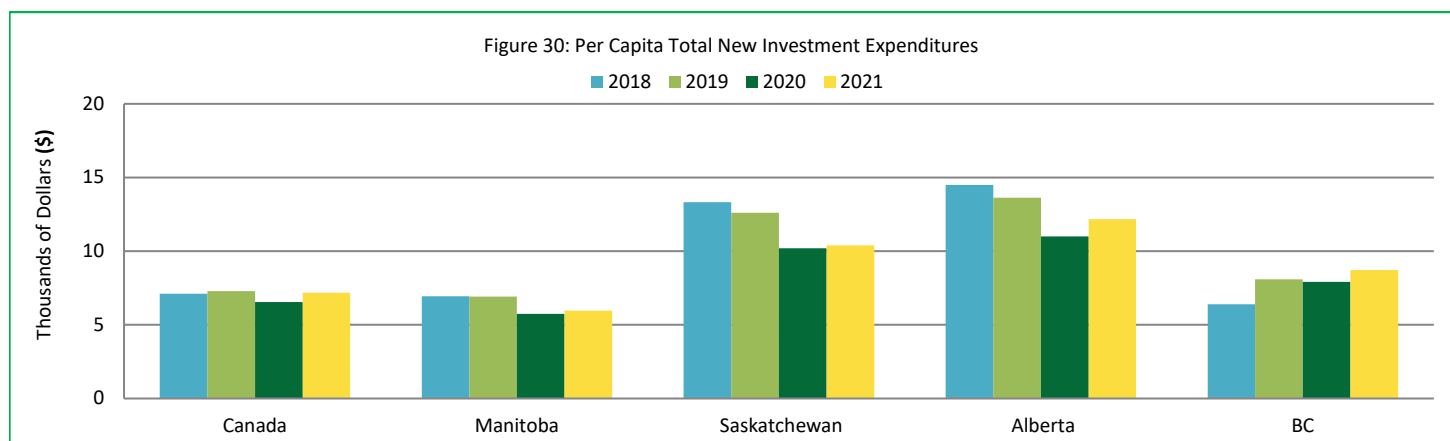

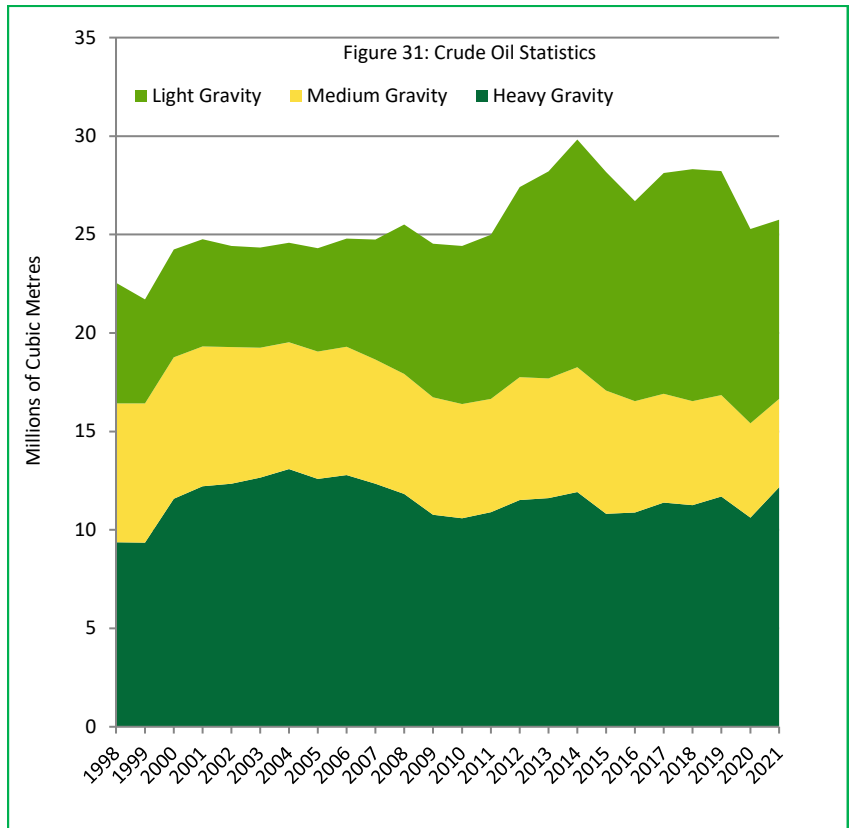

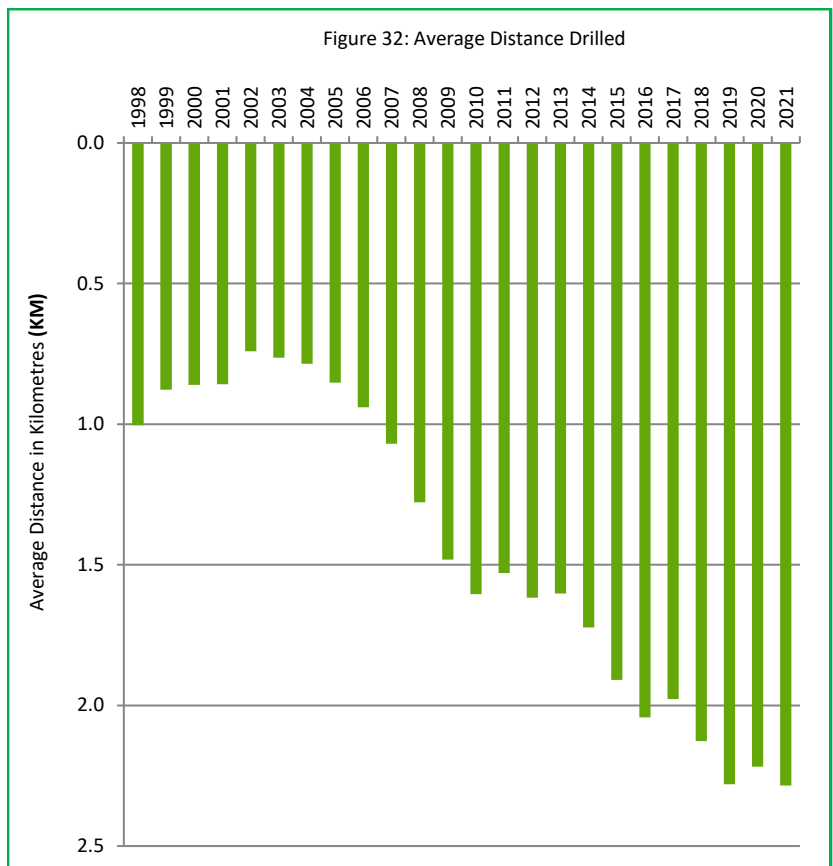

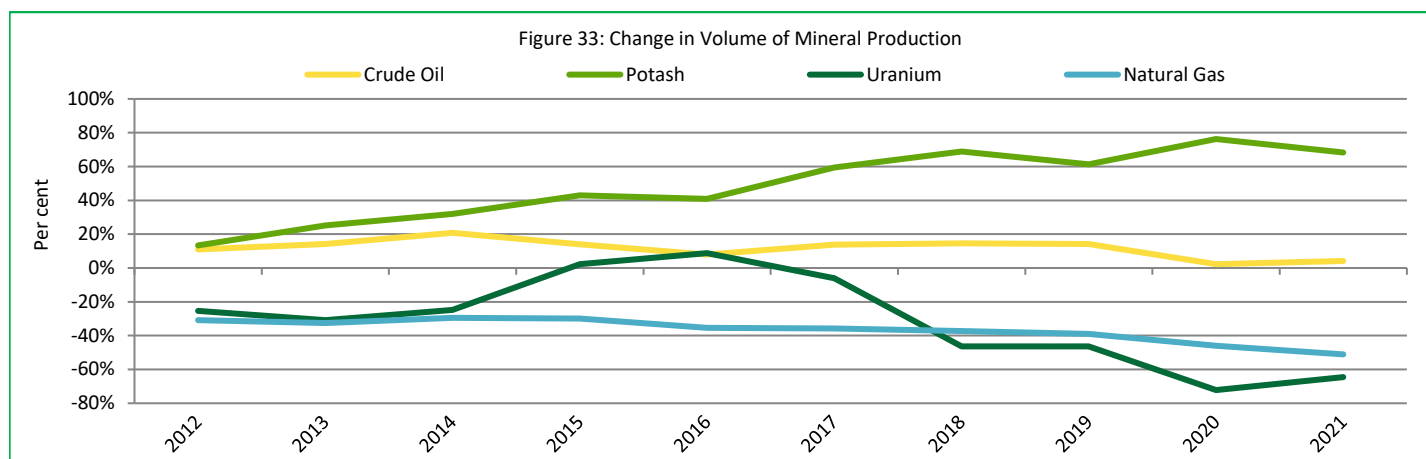

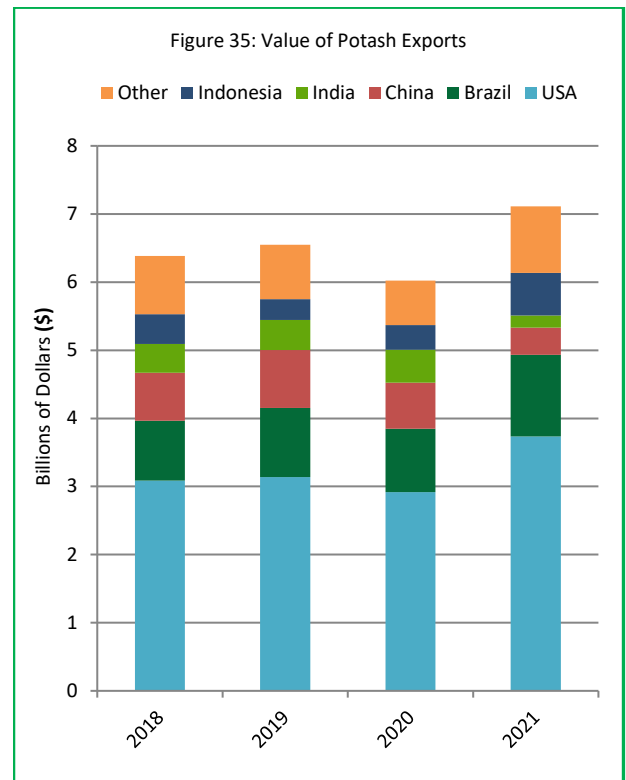

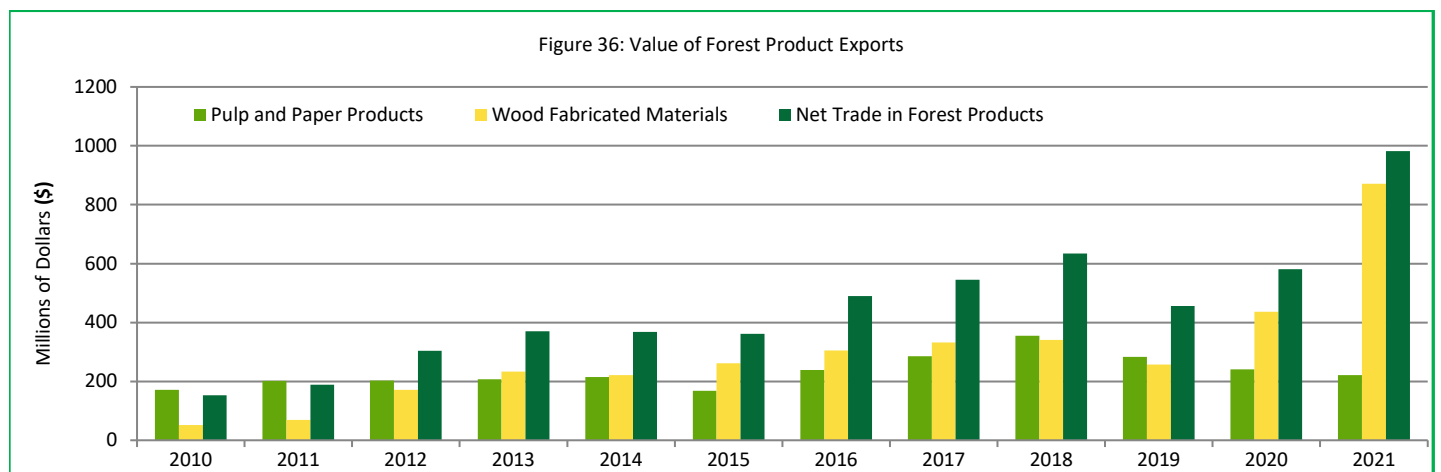

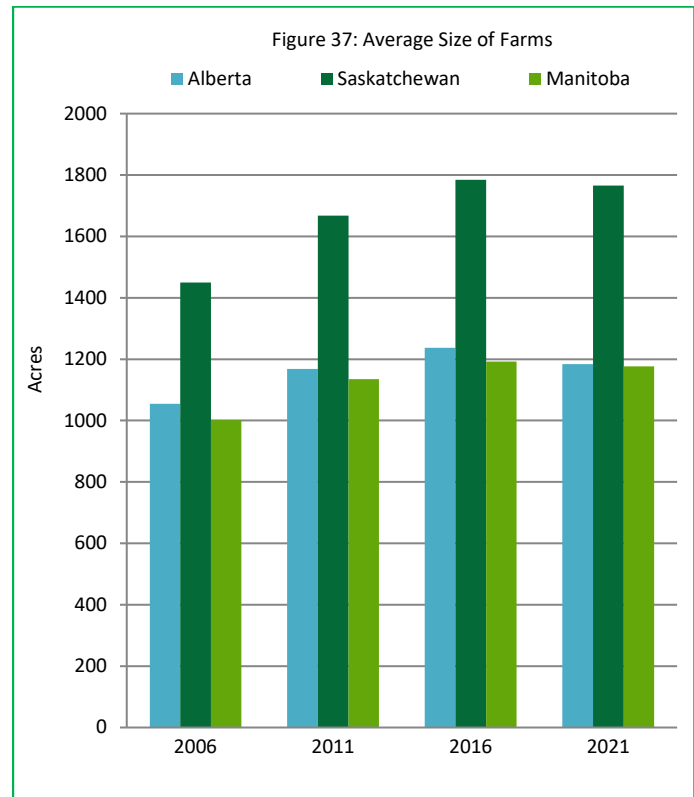

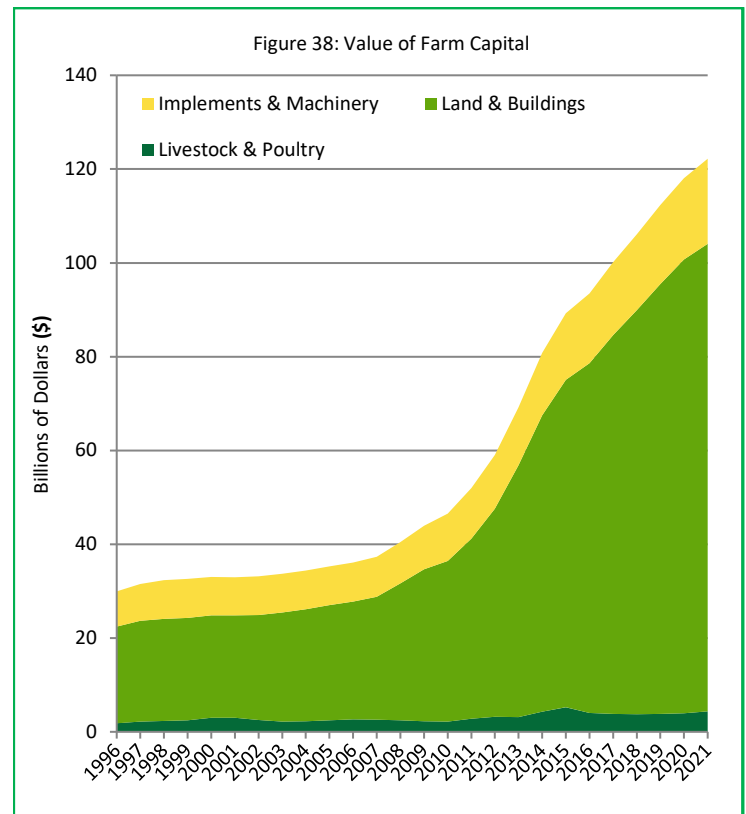

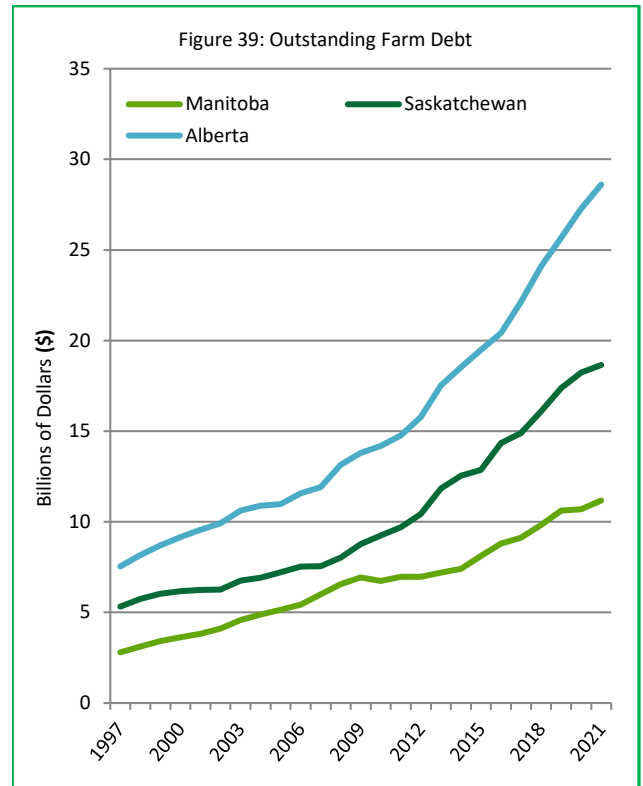

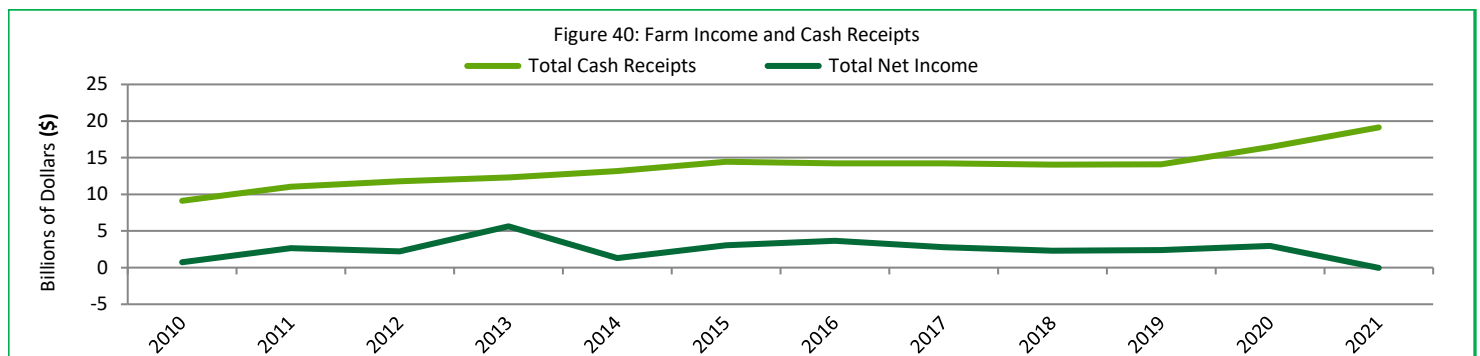

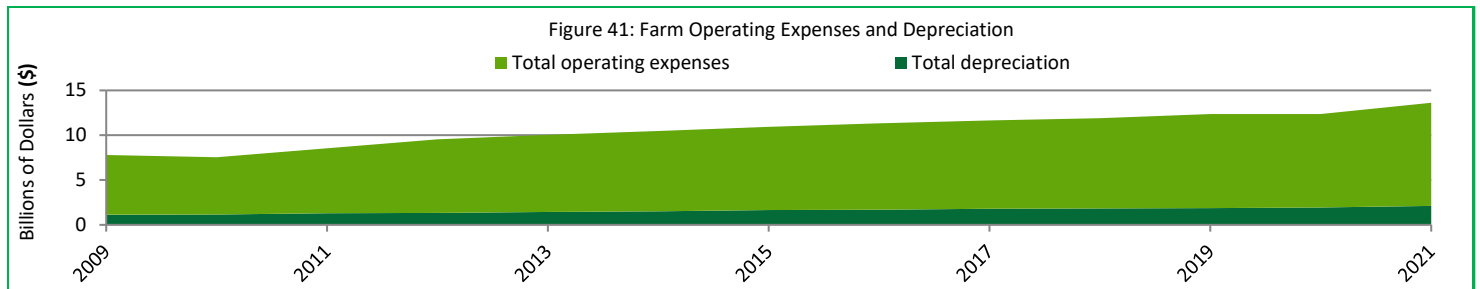

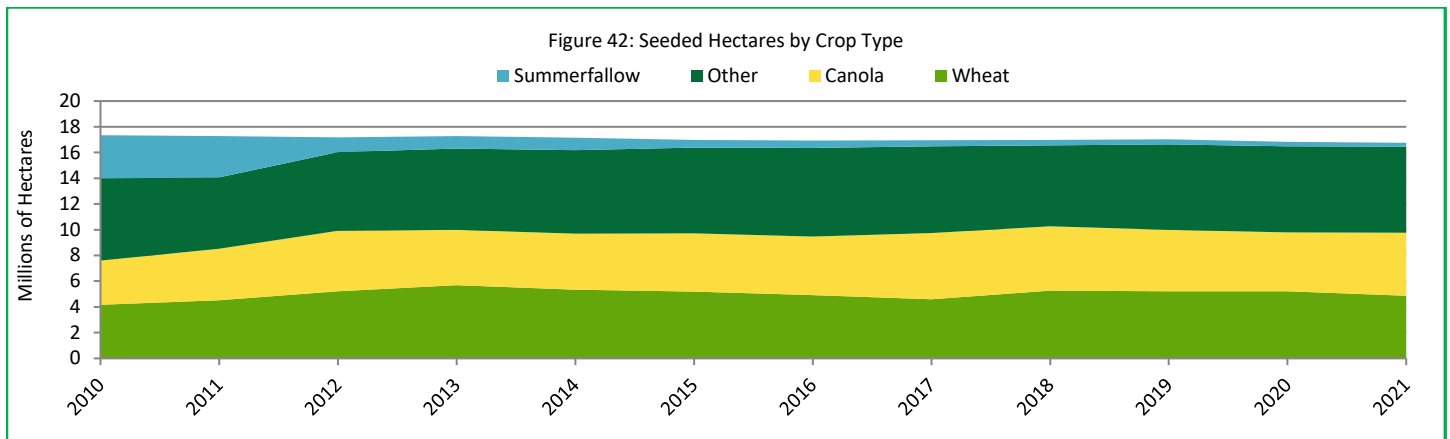

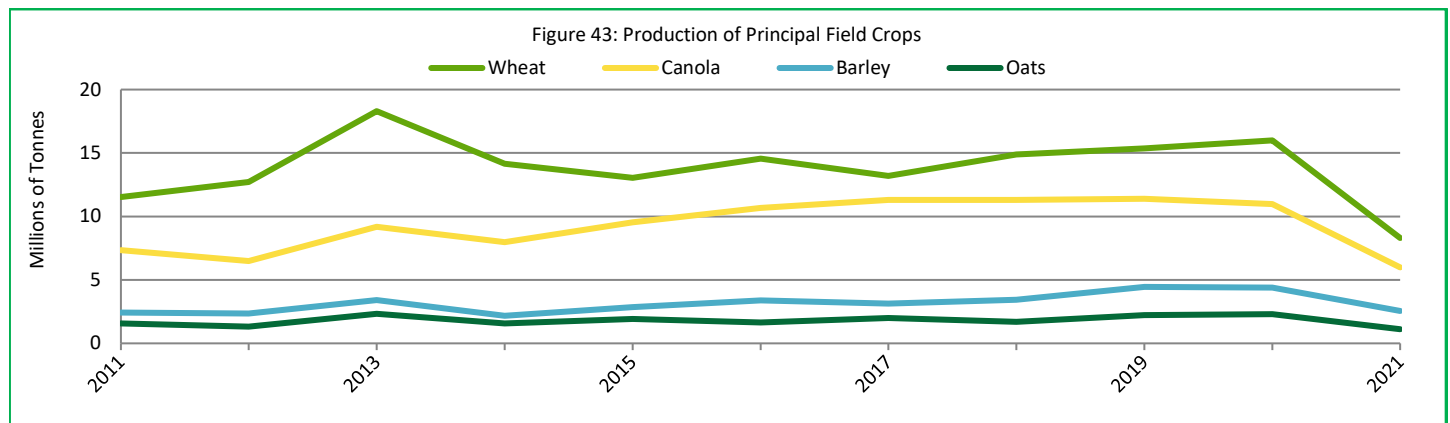

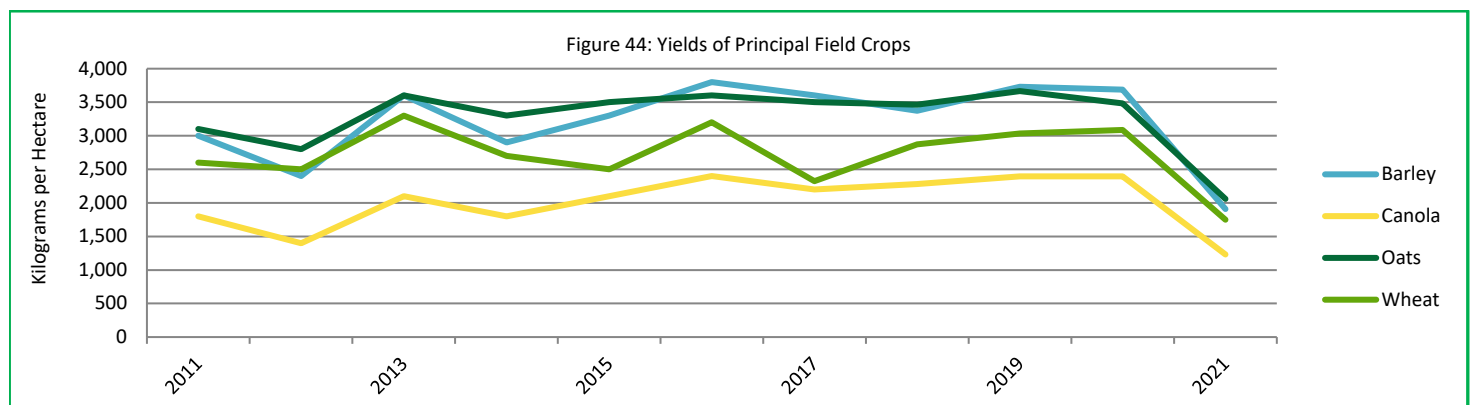

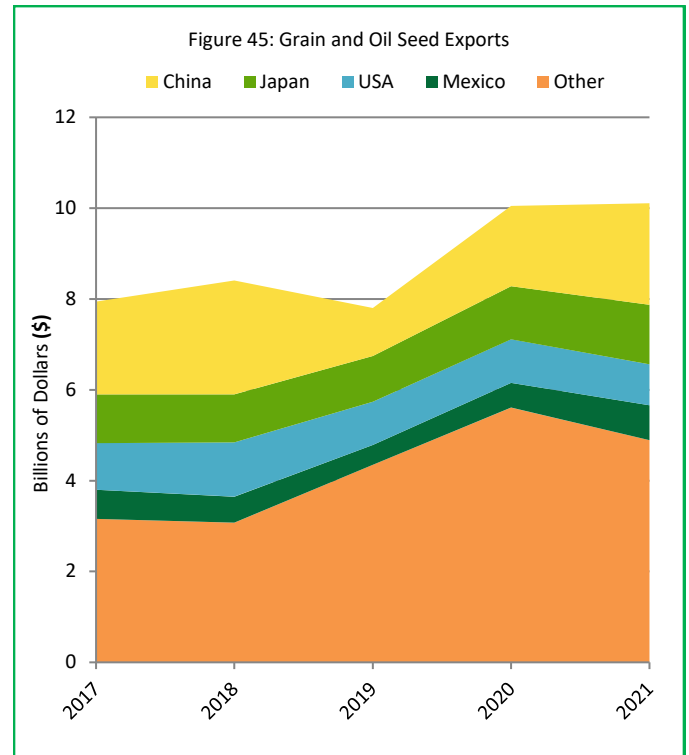

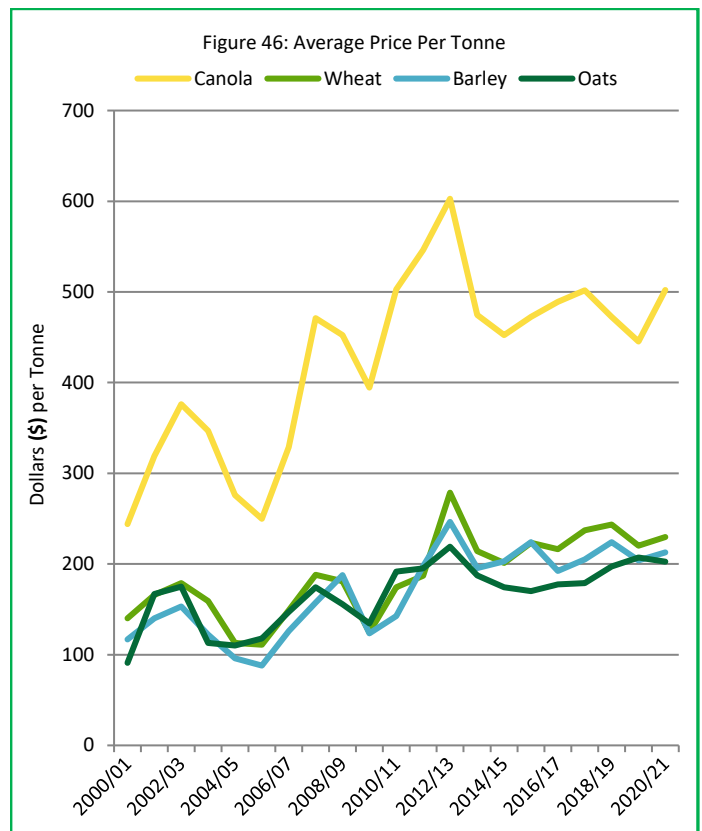

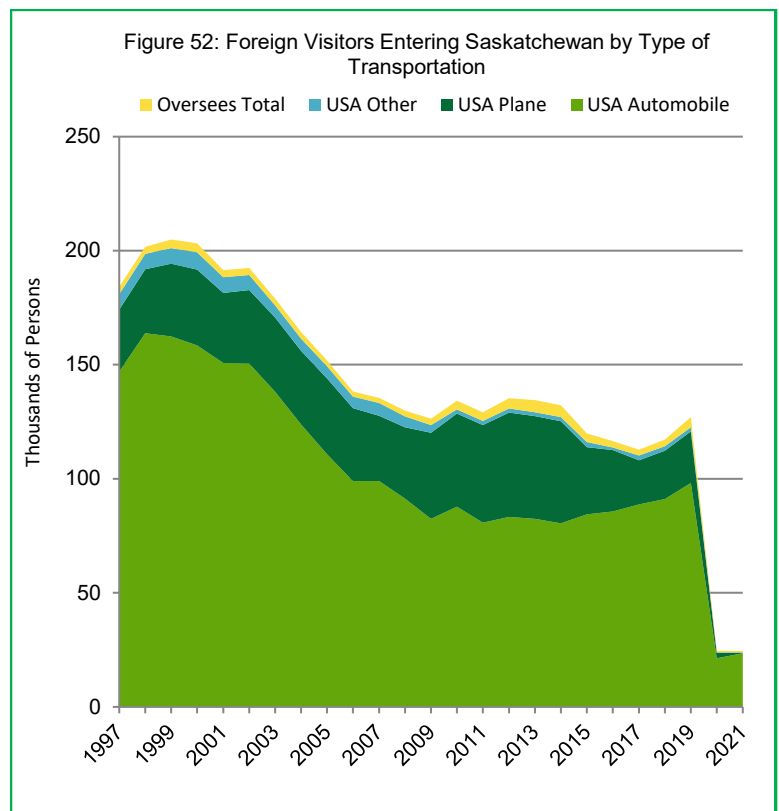

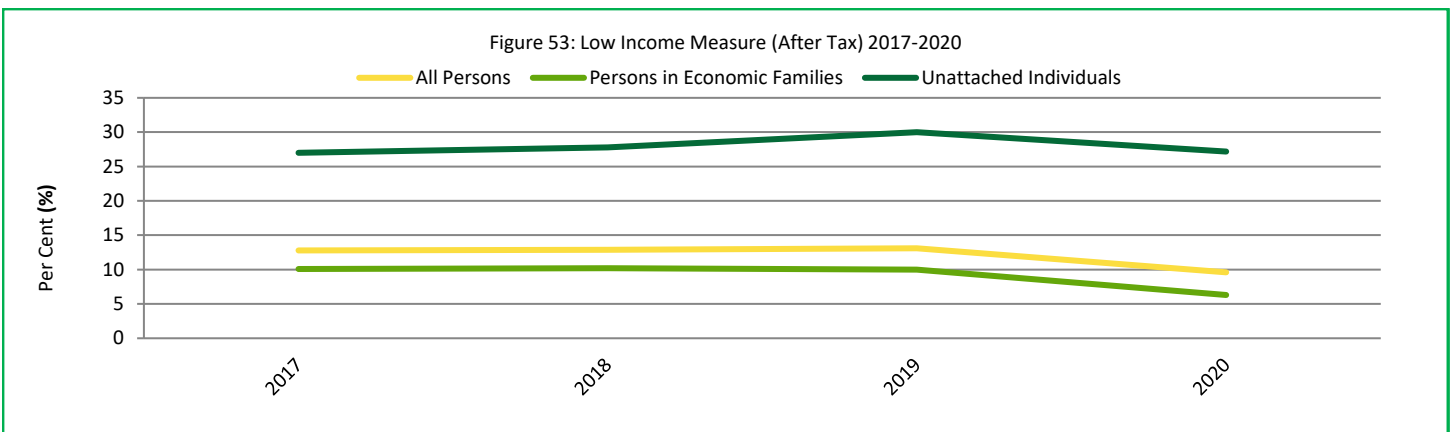

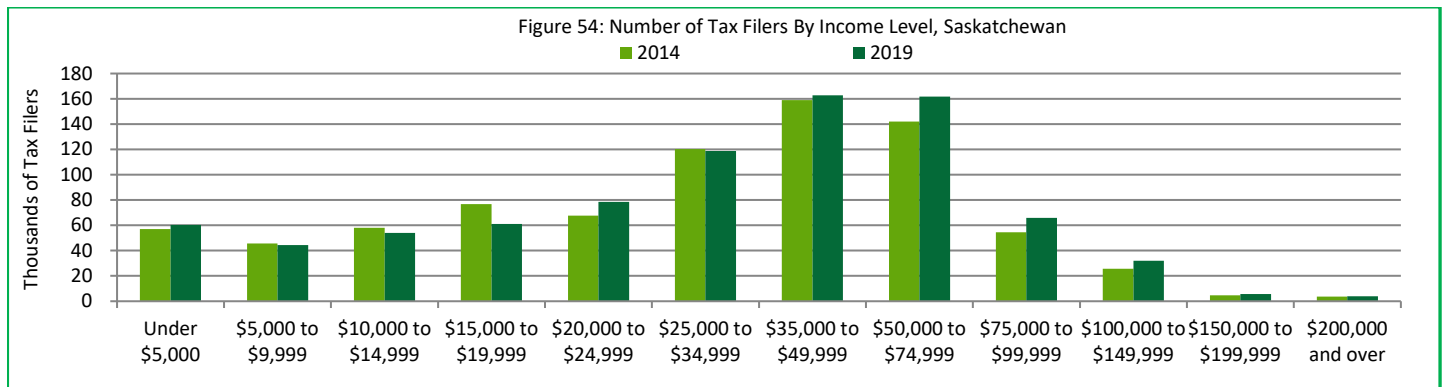

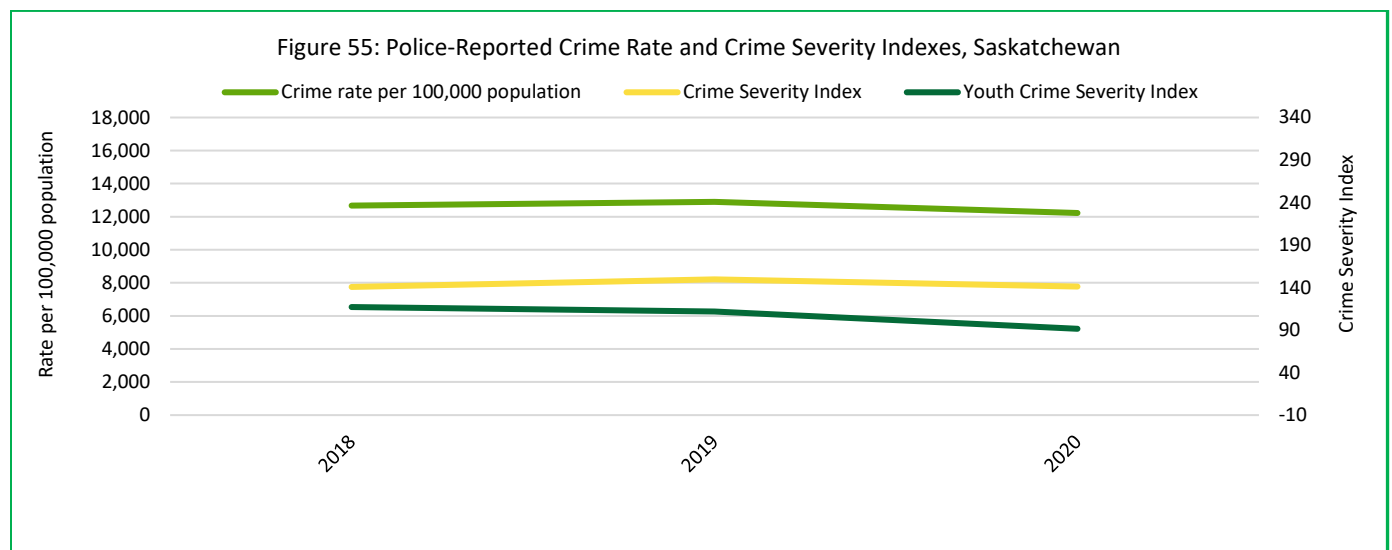

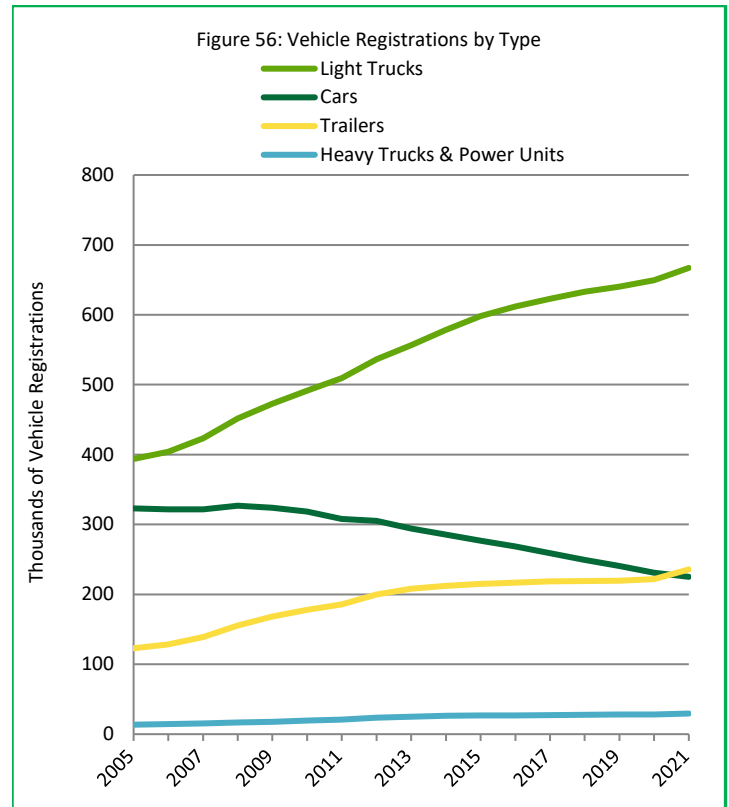
