Gary Grewal was elected as the MLA for Regina Northeast in the 2020 provincial election. He is the first Indo-Canadian elected to the Saskatchewan Assembly. He is currently a Member of the Intergovernmental Affairs and Justice committee.

When Gary immigrated to Canada almost 40 years ago, he chose Saskatchewan to build his future. Gary is a successful entrepreneur and long-standing community leader in Regina.

Gary has spent thousands of hours volunteering in the community.
