

Become a Public Health Inspector Seats reserved for Saskatchewan students at BCIT

Public Health Inspectors are in high demand in Saskatchewan and there are many job opportunities available with the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA).

Public Health Inspectors play a critical role in ensuring the health and safety of citizens in communities across Saskatchewan. They work to improve and protect public health through ongoing planning, inspection and consultation in public facilities such as restaurants, recreation facilities, public water systems and more.

The salary range for a Public Health Inspector at the SHA is **\$38.137** - **\$46.554 per hour.** The SHA has a variety of job benefits including professional development opportunities.

What training do I need?

Saskatchewan reserves seats for eligible Saskatchewan students in the Environmental Public Health (EPH) program at the British Columbia Institute of Technology (BCIT). This two-year Bachelor program includes a mix of classroom studies on campus and practical learning through field trips, projects, hands-on learning and a three-month practicum back home in Saskatchewan.

Is this the right fit for me?

To be eligible for admission to the EPH program at BCIT, students must:

- have completed 60.0 credit hours (two years) of post-secondary education with a minimum grade of 67%;
- have one year of relevant work or volunteer experience;
- have completed a career discussion with a Public Health Inspector;
- have a valid driver's license; and
- be able to pass a criminal record check.

What's Important?

Students may be eligible for financial supports to help fund their education and connect them to careers in Sask.

Supports include <u>Saskatchewan Student Aid</u>, <u>Clinical</u> <u>Placement Bursaries</u>, the <u>Saskatchewan Advantage</u> <u>Scholarship</u> and the <u>Graduate Retention Program</u>.

Students in Saskatchewan's reserved seats complete their practical experience placement in Saskatchewan.

This helps ensure students can seamlessly transition into Saskatchewan's labour market after graduation.
