**Introduction**

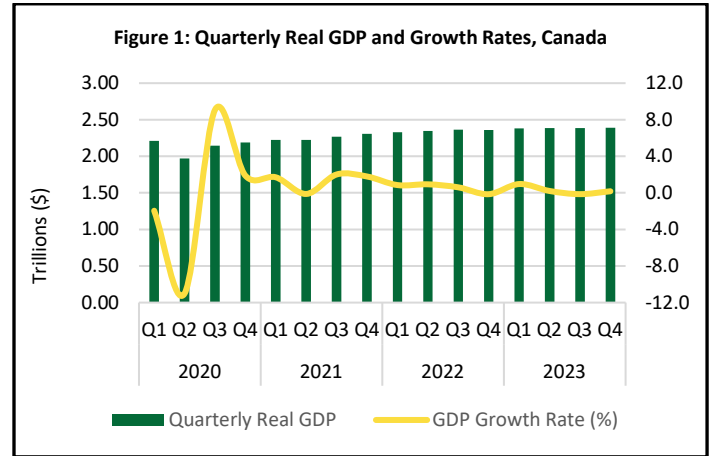
In 2023, Saskatchewan’s real GDP grew by 2.3 per cent, ranking it second highest among the provinces (tied with Alberta). The performance across its industrial sectors was largely positive, with only three out of 20 experiencing a slowdown.

Services-producing industries rose by 2.9 per cent, while goods-producing industries grew by 1.8 per cent. Within the goods-producing industries, the agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting sector faced a significant downturn of 3.9 per cent, primarily attributable to a 4.2 per cent drop in crop production due to drought conditions. Conversely, the construction sector emerged as the leading contributor to goods-producing industries, with a growth rate of 8.4 per cent. Among services-producing industries, wholesale trade led with a growth rate of 5.7 per cent.

On the international front, Saskatchewan ranked third most attractive jurisdiction globally for mining investment in 2023, according to the Fraser Institute’s industry survey.

**Canadian Economic Growth**

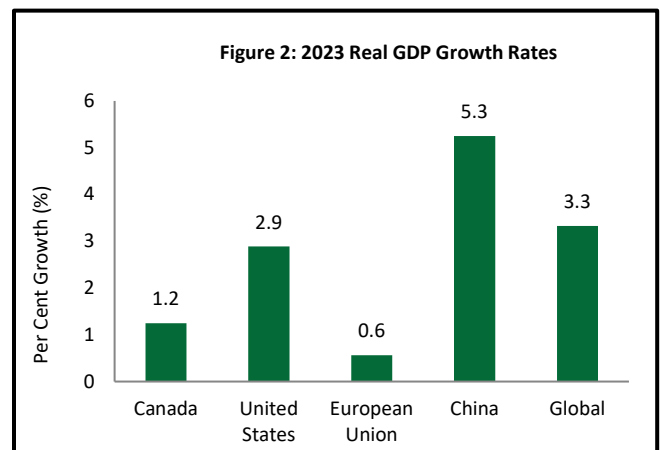
According to the International Monetary Fund, Canada’s real GDP at market prices increased by 1.2 per cent in 2023 (see Figure 2), a decline from the 3.8 per cent growth rate observed in 2022. The first quarter of 2023 saw the highest increase at 1 per cent, driven by higher exports of goods and services (3.1%) and household spending on both goods (1.2%) and services (0.7%). Subsequently, the Canadian economy experienced a slowdown in the following quarters, ultimately finishing the year with real GDP at 0.2 per cent (see Figure 1).

**Global Economic Growth**

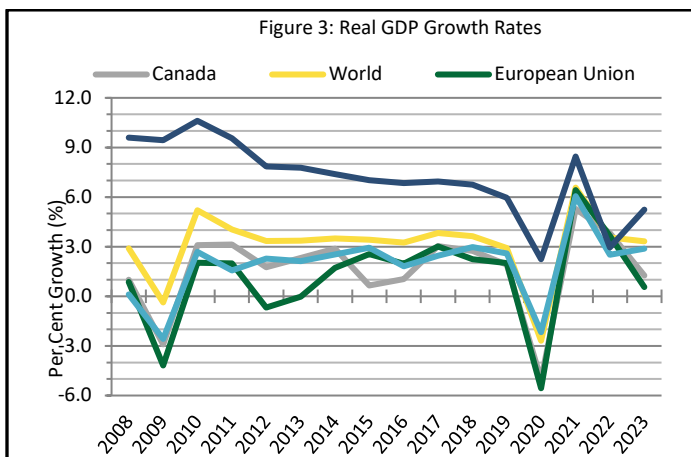
In 2023, geopolitical tensions and inflationary pressures contributed to a slowdown in the global economy. According to the International Monetary Fund (IMF), the global economy expanded by 3.3 per cent in 2023, down from 3.6 per cent in 2022 (see Figures 2 and 3).

All major advanced economies (G7) experienced modest growth in 2023, except Germany, which saw a decline of 0.3 per cent. For instance, the United States, Saskatchewan’s largest trading partner, had an economic growth of 2.9 per cent.

The European Union economy grew by 0.6 per cent, a significant drop from 3.7 per cent in 2022, while China's economy grew by 5.3 per cent.



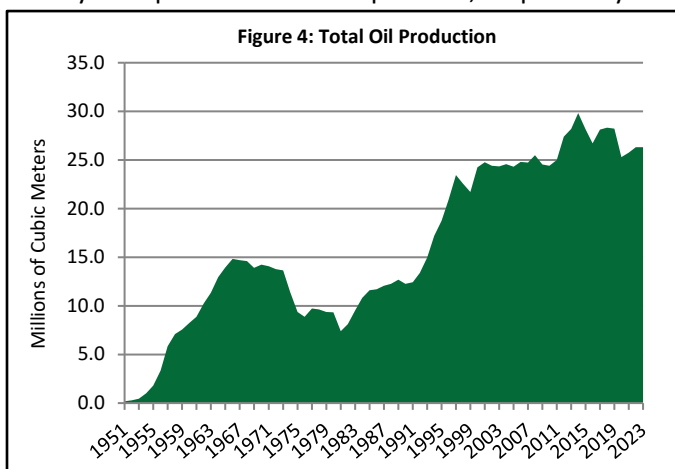

## Oil & Natural Gas

Saskatchewan continued to rank second among Canadian provinces for oil production in 2023, accounting for 10.2 per cent of the country's total crude oil output. Oil production in 2023 totaled 26.3 million cubic metres (165.7 million barrels), a decrease of 15.4 thousand cubic metres (97.0 thousand barrels) from 2022 (see Figure 4).

During this period, Saskatchewan remained Canada's third-largest natural gas-producing province, producing 3.9 billion cubic meters of natural gas, a decrease of 19.2 million cubic metres from 2022.

In 2023, both Saskatchewan oil and gas value of exports decreased to \$11.7 billion and \$98.3 million respectively, resulting in a decrease of their value of sale by 20.0 per cent and 45.2 per cent, respectively.

On a cumulative basis, Saskatchewan's lifetime oil production reached 1.17 billion cubic meters in 2023. A total of 1,301 new oil and gas wells were drilled in 2023. This is 185 wells down from 2022.

## Potash

2023 potash production fell by 2.5 per cent from 14.4 million tonnes in 2022 to 14.0 million tonnes. During the same period, the average price of a tonne of potash (K<sub>2</sub>O) was \$776/tonne, a decrease of 38.0 per cent from \$1252/tonne in 2022. Consequently, the total value of potash sales declined from \$18.0 billion in 2022 to \$10.9 billion in 2023.

Potash was the second-ranked commodity by value of exports in Saskatchewan in 2023 with a value of \$11.5 billion.

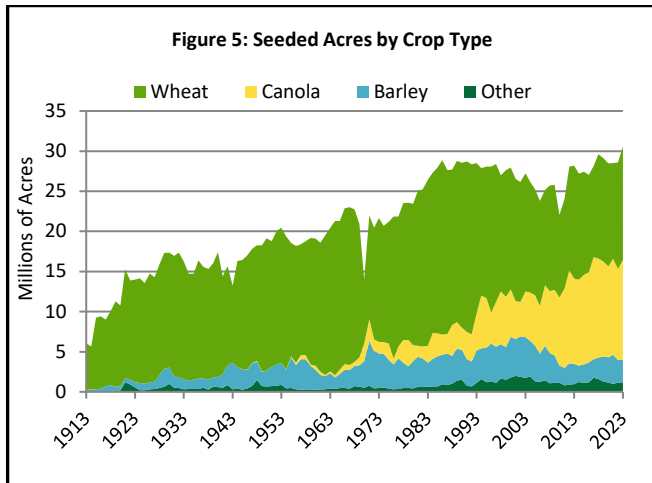
The United States, Brazil, China, and India accounted for 77.2 per cent of Saskatchewan's potash exports.

## Agriculture

Saskatchewan's agriculture sector continued to be affected by drought conditions in 2023, leading to an 8.1 per cent decrease in major crop production. Wheat yields averaged 38.7 bu/acre, a decline of 9.8 per cent from 42.9 bu/acre in 2022. Barley yields fell by 9.5 per cent compared to the previous year, and canola yields averaged 37 bu/acre, down 4.1 per cent from 38.6 bu/acre in 2022.

Despite these challenges, Saskatchewan's grain and oilseed exports increased by 17.8 per cent, reversing the previous year's 7.2 per cent decline. This growth was primarily driven by a significant rise in exports to China, which surged by 61.8 per cent. China remained the leading export market for Saskatchewan's grains and oilseeds, with a value of \$3.3 billion in 2023, representing over a quarter of the province's total exports.

In 2023, Saskatchewan’s realized net farm income rose by 41 per cent to \$5.8 billion, marking the highest increase and the largest amount among Canadian provinces. Figure 5 shows the seeded area by major crop types.

## Employment & Income

In 2023, Saskatchewan’s economy added 10,700 new jobs, primarily in the services industries. During this period, the province's unemployment rate slightly increased from 4.7 per cent in 2022 to 4.8 per cent in 2023. Despite this rise, Saskatchewan had the second lowest annual average unemployment rates among the provinces. The labour force grew by 11,900, reaching a total of 621,900 people.

Saskatchewan's average weekly earnings rose 2.3 per cent, from \$1,141 in 2022 to \$1,167 in 2023. The mining, oil, and gas sector remains the highest-paying industry in the province, with weekly wages of \$2,184.

## Investment

New capital investment in Saskatchewan reached \$17.1 billion in 2023, up \$3.5 billion from 2022. Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction were the largest contributors to capital spending, accounting for 44.4 per cent of total capital expenditures in 2023.

Housing starts rose by 25.6 per cent from 2022 to 2023, while investment in non-residential building construction increased by 10.4 per cent. Additionally, the value of building permits grew by 13.0 per cent during the same period.

## Retail Trade

In 2023, Saskatchewan retailers achieved \$25.2 billion in sales, an increase of 0.3 per cent compared to 2022. During the same period, national retail sales rose by 1.9 per cent. Per capita retail trade fell by \$471 per person between 2022 and 2023, totaling \$20,823.

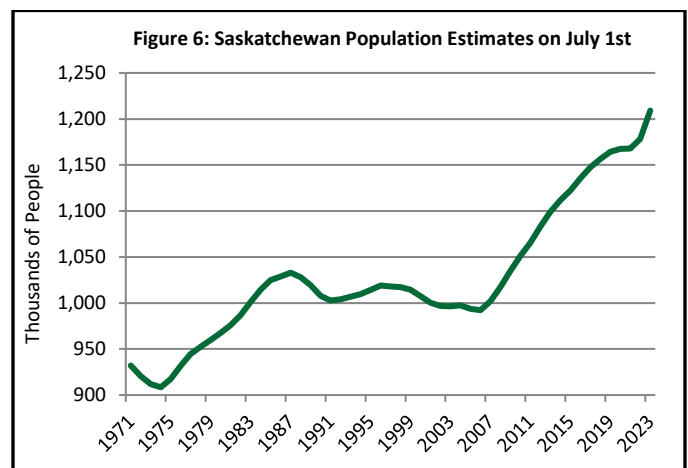
Sales decreased in four out of nine subsectors. The most significant decline occurred in gasoline stations and fuel vendors, with a drop of 11.2 per cent. Conversely, sales in motor vehicles and parts dealerships grew by 8.0 per cent, reaching \$6.9 billion and continuing to represent the largest share of retail sales at 27.5 per cent.

## Population

As of July 1, 2023, Saskatchewan’s population reached 1,209,307, an increase of 30,852 from July 1, 2022.

From July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, the province recorded 13,021 births and 11,503 deaths, resulting in a natural increase of 1,518, down from 2,394 reported in the previous year.

During the same period, interprovincial migration saw 15,048 people moving into Saskatchewan from other provinces and territories, while 21,704 people left, leading to a net loss of 6,656 persons. Net international migration added 35,990 people, more than double (+17,843) recorded last year. Combining the natural increase with net migration resulted in a total population increase of 30,852 over the year.

## Vehicles

In 2023, Saskatchewan had 1,206,894 registered vehicles, an increase of 16,860 from 2022. Registrations for light and heavy trucks increased by 2.8 per cent and 2.1 per cent, respectively, together comprising three-fifths of all registrations. Conversely, registrations for cars declined by 2.9 per cent.

Electric vehicle registrations surged by 58.5 per cent in 2023, continuing a consistent upward trend since 2010. Meanwhile, registrations for diesel and gasoline-powered vehicles increased slightly by 2.5 per cent and 1.3 per cent, respectively.

## Utilities

In 2023, Saskatchewan consumed 26,596 GWh of electricity, marking a slight increase of 1.7 per cent from 26,160 GWh in 2022. The largest increases in consumption were seen in industrial (3.9%), oil field (1.7%), and farm (1.3%) operations, whereas residential demand fell by 2.0 per cent, marking the first decline since 2019. There was a notable reduction in electricity generation from hydro, wind, and coal, while electricity generated from gas increased by 11.4 per cent.

In 2023, 83.8 per cent of the electricity was produced from gas, coal, and hydropower, with wind contributing 7.7 per cent of the total electricity generated.

## Conclusion

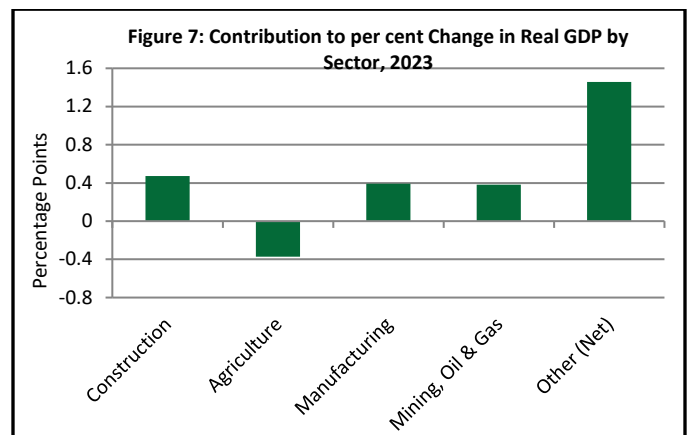
Despite challenging global market conditions and drought impacts on its agricultural sector, Saskatchewan's economy and population continued to grow in 2023.

As of July 1, 2023, Saskatchewan's population reached 1,209,307, an increase of 30,852 from the previous year. This growth was largely driven by net international migration, which contributed 35,990 new residents.

Saskatchewan ranked second among provinces for per capita investment, with \$14,149, slightly behind Alberta's \$14,807 but significantly surpassing the national average by 8,449.

Additionally, Saskatchewan's economy added 10,700 new jobs in 2023. The unemployment rate stood at 4.8 per cent, the second lowest among the provinces and notably below the national average of 5.4 per cent.

In 2023, Saskatchewan's real GDP growth of 2.3 per cent ranked second highest among provinces (tied with Alberta). The construction sector proved to be the foremost driver of real economic growth in Saskatchewan for the year. (see Figure 7).

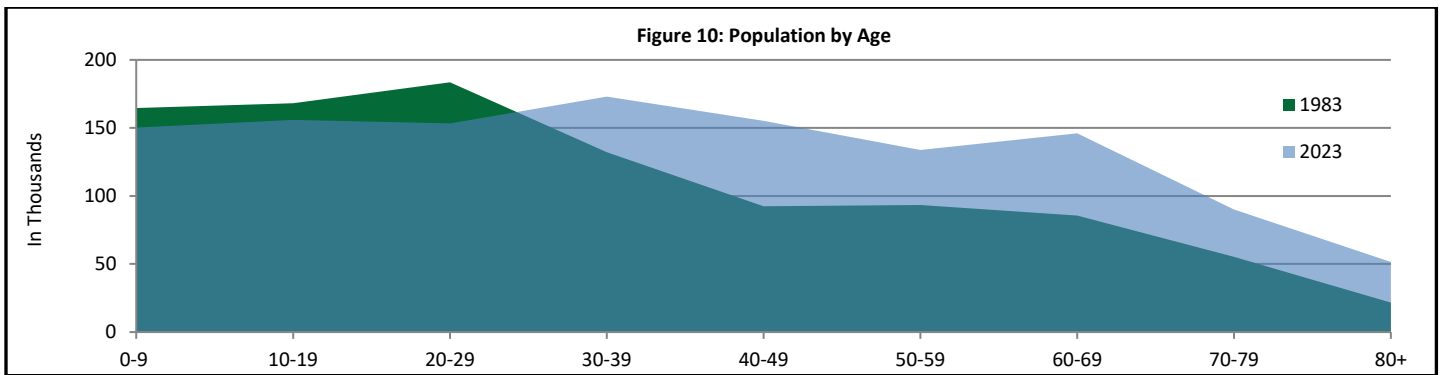

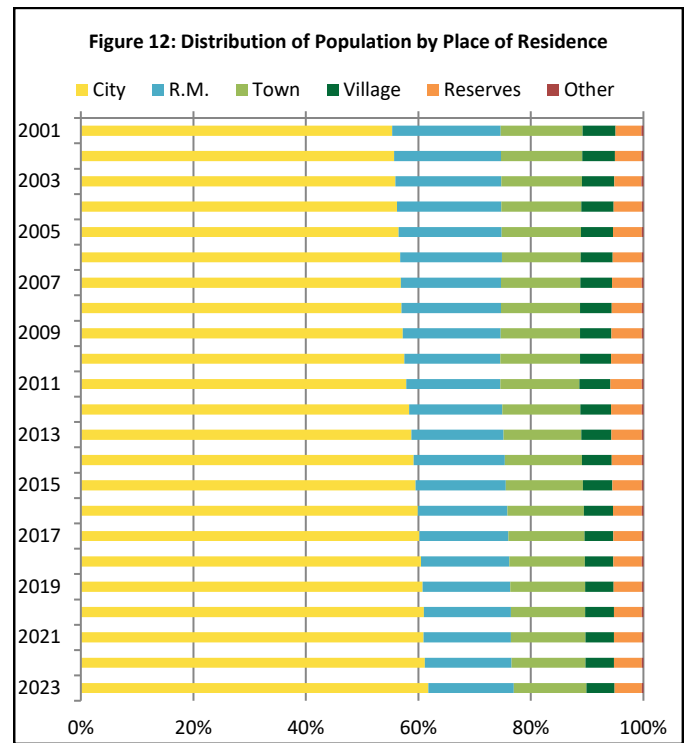

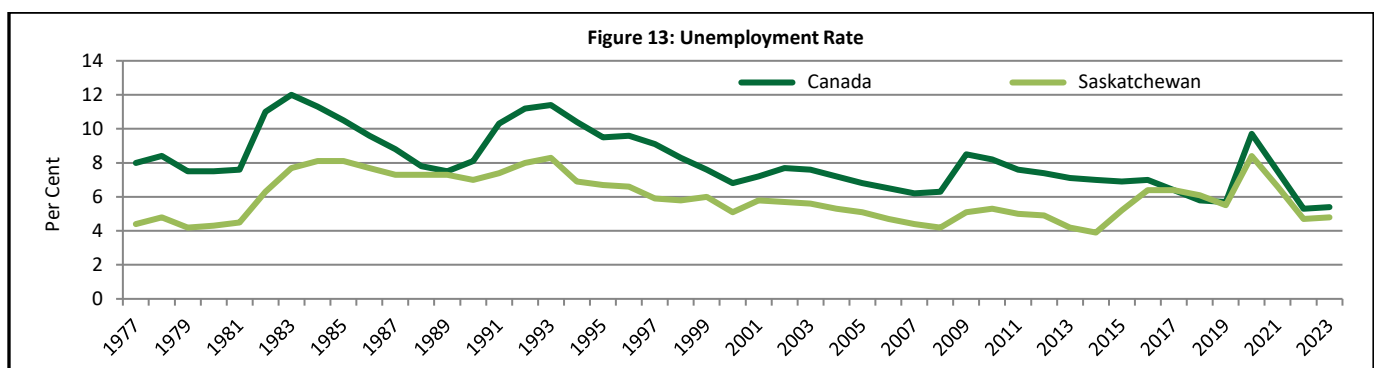
