SAMA'S RESUMPTION OF VALUATION SERVICES

This is an Order of the Agency ("SAMA") pursuant to clause 12(1)(q) and subsection 22(8) of *The Assessment Management Agency Act* ("AMA Act"). This Order repeals SAMA Board Order "SAMA's Reassumption of Assessment Valuation Services for a Municipality" dated January 31, 2020.

The following requirements must be met by a municipality before SAMA will consent to reassume the responsibility for carrying out the municipality's valuations and revaluations in accordance with the appropriate municipal Act, and any rules, orders or manuals that SAMA may make or establish:

1 The municipality shall provide to SAMA:

- (a) written notice of the municipality's decision to request SAMA to reassume responsibility for providing assessment services; and
- (b) a copy of the written consent from the Minister for the municipality to have SAMA reassume responsibility for providing assessment services.

2 Within 30 days of the municipality's written notice in section 1 to SAMA, or such longer period as SAMA may allow, the municipality will provide to SAMA an electronic copy of all the municipality's assessment and assessment related data. If SAMA consents to reassuming responsibility for carrying out the municipality's valuations and revaluations and prior to SAMA actually reassuming the carrying out of such services, SAMA may request updated assessment data from the municipality, and the municipality shall provide that information to SAMA within 30 days of the request, or such longer period as SAMA may allow. The data to be provided to SAMA by the municipality in this section will be in an electronic format that is accessible and useable by SAMA, unless SAMA directs the data be provided in another format.

3 Within three months, or such longer period as SAMA may require, of receiving the assessment data outlined in section 2, SAMA will provide to the municipality an estimate of the following:

- (a) the estimated start-up fee that SAMA considers necessary to facilitate reassuming responsibility for carrying out the municipality's valuations and revaluations;
- (b) the estimated date for payment of the start-up fee;
- (c) the steps and estimated timelines required to be completed prior to SAMA reassuming responsibility for carrying out the municipality's valuations and revaluations; and
- (d) an estimate of SAMA's annual municipal requisition fee for the municipality and the estimated payment dates for the same.

Amounts and timelines estimated by SAMA in this section are subject to change and do not constitute final commitments by SAMA until the municipality and SAMA reach agreement in accordance with section 4.

4 Within three months of SAMA providing to the municipality the estimates noted in section 3, or such longer period as SAMA may allow:

- (a) the municipality and SAMA will agree upon the items referenced in section 3;
- (b) the municipality will agree to a payment schedule for the municipality to pay to SAMA all of the fee amounts reference in section 3; and
- (c) provided agreement is reached in relation to items 4(a) and (b), SAMA will consent to reassuming responsibility for carrying out the municipality's valuations and revaluations.

Until there is an agreement between the municipality and SAMA in accordance with this section 4 and SAMA consents to reassuming responsibility for carrying out the municipality's valuations and revaluations, SAMA will have no obligation to reassume the provision of such services to the municipality.

If a municipality fails to meet one or more of the above requirements, the municipality may submit a written request to SAMA for a grant of further time for the municipality to meet the requirement(s). SAMA may grant the municipality such further time as it deems appropriate. If the municipality meets the requirement(s) within the further time granted, then subject to any necessary amendments to the timelines, SAMA will consent to reassuming responsibility for carrying out the municipality's valuations and revaluations, notwithstanding that the municipality did not initially meet the requirements.

For the purpose of determining if any timeline in this order will be extended, SAMA's Board of Directors may designate its Chief Executive Officer with authority to make such determinations.

- (i) meets the requirements applicable to all classes of licences in paragraph 2.3; and,
- (ii) has been approved by the Council to participate in an assessment; and,
- (iii) has been successful in the assessment which demonstrates to the satisfaction of the Council that the applicant has appropriate skill, knowledge and suitability to practise independently.

“(t) Notwithstanding any of the other provisions of the regulatory bylaws pertaining to licensure, a physician who has been issued a Ministerial Licence to practise anesthesiology may be issued a regular licence if the physician:

- (i) meets the requirements applicable to all classes of licences in paragraph 2.3; and,
- (ii) has successfully engaged in practice on a licence issued under this bylaw for five years”.

REGULATORY BYLAW AMENDMENTS

Whereas *The Midwifery Regulatory Bylaws, 2023* require amendment to revise requirements for student membership to establish a non-clinical membership category; and

Therefore, be it resolved that *The Midwifery Regulatory Bylaw Amendments, 2024*, as set out in Schedule A, be made in accordance with subsection 13(1) of *The Midwifery Act*.

SCHEDULE A

Title

1 These bylaws may be referred to as *The Midwifery Regulatory Bylaw Amendments, 2024*.

Regulatory Bylaws amended

2 *The Midwifery Regulatory Bylaws, 2023* are amended in the manner set out in these bylaws.

Section 6 amended

3 **Section 6 is amended by adding the following clause after clause (b):**

“(b.1) non-clinical membership”.

Section 7 amended

4 **Section 7 is amended:**

(a) **by striking out “and” after clause (c); and**

(b) **by repealing clause (d) and substituting the following:**

“(d) in the case of a full practising, restricted practising or student member:

(i) proof of liability insurance for professional negligence in an amount that is at least \$10,000,000 per incident and \$20,000,000 per year;

(ii) proof of current certification in neonatal resuscitation and cardiopulmonary resuscitation from a program that is recognized by the council; and

“(e) in the case of a full practising or restricted member, proof of current obstetrical emergency skills”.

New section 10.1

5 **The following section is added after section 10:**

“Non-clinical membership

“10.1(1) Non-clinical membership and initial licensure in the college is available to an applicant who meets the requirements of subsection 20(1) of the Act and section 7 of these bylaws and has clinical experience as a primary midwife.

“(2) Non-clinical membership entitles a person to the following privileges:

(a) to engage in management, administration, research or education in relation to the practice of midwifery;

(b) to use the title “Registered Midwife” or “RM”, followed by “(Non-clinical)”; and

(c) to vote and hold office in the college;

- (d) to have voice and vote at the annual and special meetings of the college;
- (e) to be appointed to committees of the college;
- (f) to receive a copy of college documents designed for distribution to practising members; and
- (g) to receive the publications of the college”.

Section 13 amended

6 Section 13 is amended by striking out “or restricted” and substituting “, restricted practising licence or non-clinical”.

New section 15.1

7 The following section is added after section 15:

“Renewal of non-clinical practising licence

“15.1(1) Renewal of a non-clinical licence is available to a non-clinical member who completes the continuing competence requirements in accordance with clause 17(1)(b)”.

**SUSPENSION OF MAILING OF NOTICES AND VERIFICATIONS
BY THE CORPORATE REGISTRY – POSTAL LABOUR DISRUPTION**

Whereas subsection 15(1) of *The Operation of Public Registry Statutes Act* reads as follows:
