

Saskatchewan Agriculture Exports 2024



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Saskatchewan 

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All export calculations are based on international exports from Saskatchewan. Some of the totals of Saskatchewan's lesser exported commodities may have been over or under-reported, which is a result of interprovincial trade. All trade statistics were taken from Global Trade Tracker and are subject to revision and change.

Export values are rounded totals. The year-to-year percentage change is calculated using actual export values. This approach was used in all subsequent tables.

Fundamental Factors

Saskatchewan's annual agri-food exports reached \$18.5 billion (B) in 2024 – the second highest value on record, second only to the 2023 agri-food export value of \$20.3B. This can be attributed to a combination of factors, including geopolitical events, market dynamics, and environmental conditions.

In 2023-2024, Saskatchewan's value-added revenue was \$7.9B¹, an 86 per cent growth since 2014. Saskatchewan's food manufacturing sector represented approximately 94 per cent of the province's total value-added revenue. Furthermore, approximately 77 per cent of the total food manufacturing revenue is attributed to grain and oilseed processing. In 2024, value-added exports were \$5.1B – a growth of 100 per cent since 2014. Value-added exports comprised 27 per cent of total agri-food exports in 2024.

There was a five per cent increase in export volume, due to a large production of crops in 2023 and 2024 at 33 million metric tonnes (MMT) and 35.5 MMT respectively. This increase in production enhanced the available supplies for exports, which aligns well with the increasing need for agriculture to address global concerns about food security.

Although prices in 2024 decreased from 2023 (except for livestock), prices have stabilized relative to historical prices. This stabilization, combined with higher volumes, allowed for exports of \$18.5B in 2024.

A strong United States (U.S.) dollar has been advantageous for Canadian exports, particularly enhancing the competitiveness of Canadian and Saskatchewan wheat in the global market. In 2024, this helped offset and minimize the drop in value of agri-food exports.

Political dynamics have disrupted global trade. With the disruptions many countries are exploring diversification options for their sources of agri-food products. During this period Canada can reinforce its reputation as a reliable and trusted source of high-quality agricultural products.

In recent years, Canada has seen increased competition in traditional export markets for peas. In 2024, Russia exported significant quantities of peas to India and China. Additionally, the increasing geopolitical tension between Canada and other parts of the world are threatening agri-food exports of canola products and peas.

¹Calculations for food and beverage manufacturing sectors are based on data from Statistics Canada's Annual Survey of Manufacturing and Logging Industries, where available. The data is presented in the fiscal period of April 1 to March 31. Revenue estimates from Saskatchewan's biofuel manufacturing sector are derived from internal estimates and may be subject to revision.

Agri-Food Exports Overview

Saskatchewan’s agricultural exports were worth a total of \$18.5B in 2024, the second largest on record behind 2023’s record setting year of \$20.3B.

Export values decreased by 8.5 per cent in 2024 compared to 2023. Leading agri-food export commodities in 2024 included canola seed, non-durum wheat, canola oil, lentils, durum wheat, canola meal and peas. The top five international market destinations included the U.S., China, India, Japan, and Algeria.

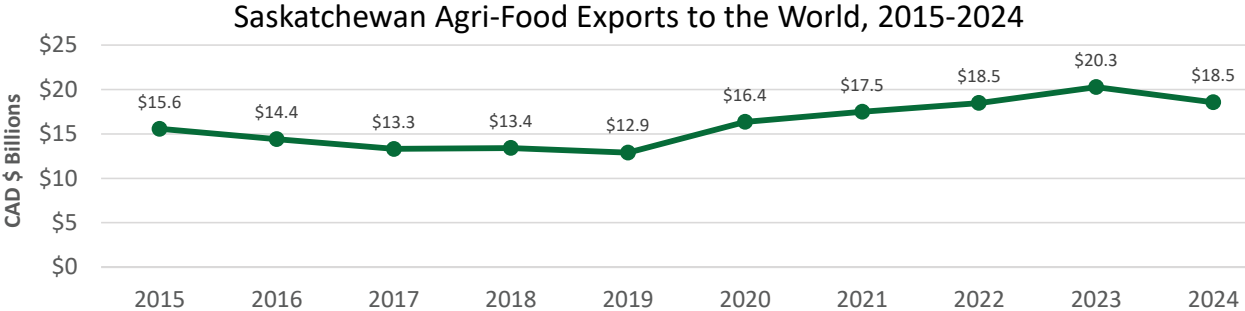
Agri-food exports represent more than 41 per cent of total Saskatchewan exports in 2024, valued at \$45.3B. Saskatchewan remains one of Canada’s leading agri-food exporters, with a global reputation as a reliable supplier of safe, high-quality, sustainably produced agri-food products.

At the national level, Canadian agri-food exports to the world in 2024 increased by one per cent compared to 2023, with sales of \$100.3B. Saskatchewan is the nation’s second largest agri-food exporter, representing 18.5 per cent of total Canadian agri-food exports, behind Ontario at \$28.1B.

Saskatchewan has grown its agricultural exports by more than 33 per cent since 2014. The province’s expanding international market presence is supported through the network of international trade and investment offices in Germany, the United Kingdom, the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Mexico, Vietnam, Japan, India, China and Singapore.

The agriculture and value-added processing sectors are major components of Saskatchewan’s Growth Plan, which includes the targets of increasing crop production to 45 MMT, agriculture exports to \$20B, and value-added revenue to \$10B by 2030.

The strength and diversity of Saskatchewan’s production base is ideal for many types of ingredient processing, including ingredients for a variety of healthy foods such as plant-based alternatives, cereals, beverages, baked goods, snacks, and bars. The most recent example of progress towards Growth Plan targets includes the expansion of canola processing facilities in the province. Exports of canola oil and meal products are expected to increase in the years ahead.

Agri-Food Exports by Product

Saskatchewan exported more than \$7B worth of canola products, \$6B worth of cereals and \$3B worth of pulse products in 2024.

In 2024, the value for Saskatchewan's top 10 export commodities were either flat or decreased. There was a five per cent increase in export volume, primarily due to a better growing season in 2023 and 2024 relative to 2022. Volumes increased for six of Saskatchewan's top 10 exported commodities in 2024 compared to 2023. The volume of canola seed increased by 26 per cent, canola meal by 14 per cent and flaxseed by 10 per cent.

Oilseeds²

In 2024, Saskatchewan exported \$3.9B worth of oilseeds (canola seeds, soybeans and flaxseed) to the world, which was comparable to 2023 (\$3.9B). Key markets continued to be China, Japan, Mexico and the U.S.

Exports to the European Union (E.U.) increased by 135 per cent, up from \$129 million (M) in 2023 to \$304M in 2024. The E.U. imports canola seed/rapeseed mainly for their biofuels industry while flaxseed is regaining historical market share. Exports remain down significantly from 2020 when the exports of oilseeds to the E.U. exceeded \$1B. There are dynamic shifts in the E.U. market that affect Saskatchewan's trade.

Canola

In 2024, canola exports (seed, meal and oil) from Saskatchewan were a record \$7.9B, almost 30 per cent of Saskatchewan's agri-food exports.

Saskatchewan's canola seed exports grew by one per cent in 2024 compared to 2023, with an export value of \$3.2B. Significant increases in the export value to the top 10 markets included China (seven per cent), UAE (21 per cent) and France (246 per cent). Export values decreased in three of the top 10 markets, most notably, Japan (16 per cent), Mexico (46 per cent) and the U.S. (13 per cent).

In 2024, Saskatchewan's canola oil exports totalled \$3.0B, a decrease in value of 15 per cent compared to record levels in 2023. However, the volume of exports increased by nine per cent, which somewhat compensated for an overall drop in prices in 2024. The U.S. is by far the largest market, with exports of \$2.8B or 94 per cent of our canola oil exports. Mexico is our second largest market, with exports of \$97M, about three per cent of our canola oil exports.

In 2024, Saskatchewan's exports of canola meal totalled \$1.2B which is comparable to 2023. The U.S. and China are Saskatchewan's top canola meal markets. Exports to the U.S. decreased by eight per cent, with exports worth \$681M. Canola meal exports to China grew by 8.5 per cent, with exports of \$496M. Exports by volume increased overall by 14 per cent in 2024 totalling 2.5 MMT².

²Saskatchewan does not currently produce sizable quantities of soybeans. Saskatchewan soybean export figures do not match production levels, as there is the potential a portion of Manitoba's production is included in Saskatchewan export totals.

Flax

The value of Saskatchewan's exports of flaxseed decreased slightly in 2024 to \$178M from \$182M in 2023, although export volume increased by 11 per cent. The U.S. and China remain the province's major markets for flaxseed with \$98M and \$26M, respectively. Exports to Belgium rebounded to more historical norms in 2024 with exports valued at \$33M.

Cereals

Exports of Saskatchewan cereal grains decreased almost 13 per cent in 2024, from \$6.9B in 2023 to \$6.0B in 2024.

Non-durum wheat

In 2024, the province's exports of non-durum wheat (mostly Canadian Western Red Spring Wheat) totaled \$3.2B, a 16 per cent decrease in value compared to 2023. Non-durum exports also experienced a three per cent decline in volume during that same time period. All the major export destinations including China, Indonesia, Japan, U.S., Peru and Bangladesh saw decreases in non-durum wheat shipments in 2024. Non-durum wheat exports to China experienced the largest decrease with drops of 23 per cent by value and 15 per cent by volume.

Durum wheat

The value of Saskatchewan durum exports decreased 8.5 per cent to \$1.8B in 2024 from \$2.0B in 2023. The volume of exports, however, increased by 4 per cent, reaching 3.7 MMT. Morocco was our top durum export destination with sales of \$429M, an increase of 18 per cent compared to 2023. There was a decrease of durum wheat exports to Italy and Algeria by six per cent and 29 per cent respectively.

Oats

In 2024, the value of the province's exports of oats decreased by 9.5 per cent to \$334M, while the volume decreased by 10 per cent. The U.S. is the largest oats destination by far, accounting for almost 75 per cent of oats exports. Other export markets such as Mexico and Japan saw export increases in 2024.

Barley

Saskatchewan's exports of barley decreased 23 per cent to \$447M in 2024, from \$581M in 2023. Exports to China decreased but overall remained strong at \$316M, accounting for almost 71 per cent of Saskatchewan's barley exports. Japan and the U.S. account for most of the remaining exports at \$90M and \$41M respectively.

Pulses

Saskatchewan's total pulse (lentils, peas, and chickpeas) exports of \$3.2B in 2024 was a decrease of 3.5 per cent compared to 2023.

Lentils

In 2024, lentil exports remained relatively the same compared to 2022 and 2023. Saskatchewan exported 1.6 MMT of lentils worth \$2.0B in 2024. India, Turkey and the UAE continue to dominate lentil trade, responsible for almost 52 per cent of total lentil export sales. Exports to India decreased by 22 per cent and Turkey by 17 per cent in 2024. Lentil exports to Bangladesh, however, increased to \$77M in 2024 from \$200,000 in 2023.

Peas

Pea exports declined by two per cent in 2024 to \$965M, down from \$987M in 2023. China remains a priority pea destination; however, increased competition from Russia has begun to erode Saskatchewan's market share. Exports to India have increased to levels more inline with historical norms with exports of \$480M in 2024. Export increases to India are a result of enhanced market access and global production fluctuations.

Chickpeas

Saskatchewan's chickpea export market was worth \$204M in 2024, with Turkey and the U.S. dominating destinations with 24 and 17 per cent, respectively, of total Saskatchewan exports. Other destinations include Italy, Pakistan and Spain.

Livestock

Live cattle

Saskatchewan's livestock industry depends on both inter-provincial and international trade. Based on Saskatchewan inspection certificates for cattle in 2024, 1.1 million head of cattle left the province that year. Most of Saskatchewan inter-provincial exports of cattle were to Alberta in 2024, at over 897,178 head.

The U.S. market makes up 99 per cent of Saskatchewan's international live cattle exports. In 2024, Saskatchewan's exports of live cattle decreased by 41 per cent in number of head (55,311 head) and almost 24 per cent in value at \$158M.

The U.S. cattle herd has shrunk to a 73-year low; drought and high input costs compelled ranchers to market a higher-than-normal percentage of female cattle that would typically be held back for replacement (breeding) purposes. Because of the lower inventories in addition to inflation and continued high demand for beef, producers are still seeing elevated prices for their cattle, further incentivizing them to reduce their herds.

Live swine

The value of exports of live swine did not change by value in 2024 compared to 2023 with exports totalling \$35M. The U.S. is Saskatchewan's largest swine export market, with exports of \$32M in 2024, a decrease of almost three per cent compared to 2023. In 2024, Saskatchewan exported 468,667 head compared to 601,732 in 2023, a decline of 22 per cent.

Saskatchewan's Top Agri-Food Export Markets, 2024

Out of Saskatchewan's top 15 agri-food export markets, six countries showed growth in the value of exports in 2024. The most significant increases were seen in India, Bangladesh, UAE and Belgium. Exports to the U.S., China, Japan, Algeria, Mexico, Morocco, Turkey, Indonesia, Peru and Colombia declined in 2024.

In 2024, Saskatchewan exported \$350M worth of agri-food products to 14 different markets. Saskatchewan agri-food export markets continue to be dominated by the U.S. with 31 per cent, followed by China with 20 per cent, and India with five per cent of total exports.

Saskatchewan's agri-food exports to many countries in the E.U., North Africa and Middle East fluctuate depending on weather conditions and their impact on local production, available supply and prices from competing jurisdictions, and other market considerations (stocks, supply chain, tariffs, and trade policies).

Over the last year, fundamental factors including rising global tensions and increased competition have caused uncertainty in global trade. As an effect, international markets have begun diversifying their suppliers of agri-food products due to the unreliability of certain markets and to ensure a secure food supply for their country.

Despite the uncertainty of the future, Canada and Saskatchewan have delivered outstanding results and are recognized as a trusted, safe, stable and reliable supplier of a wide range of high-quality agri-food products and commodities.



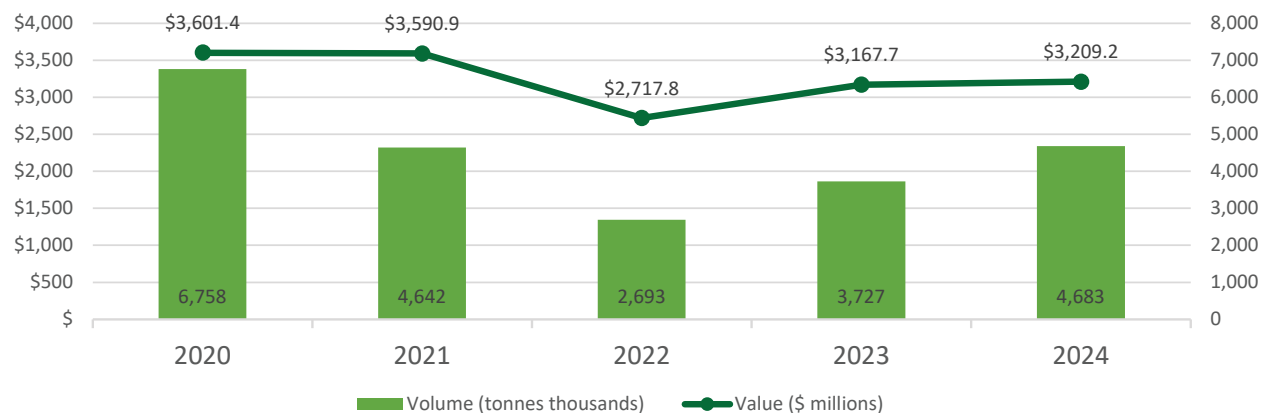

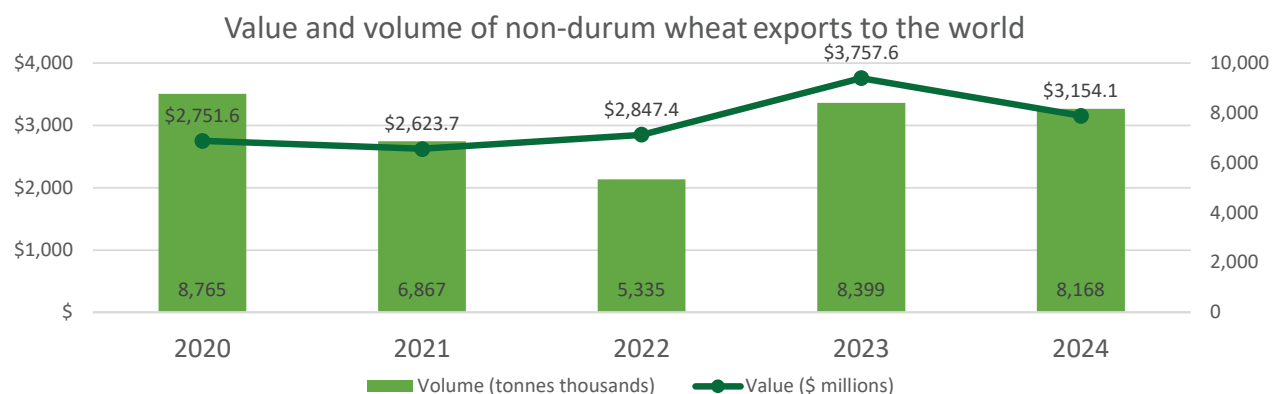
Value and volume of canola seed exports to the world

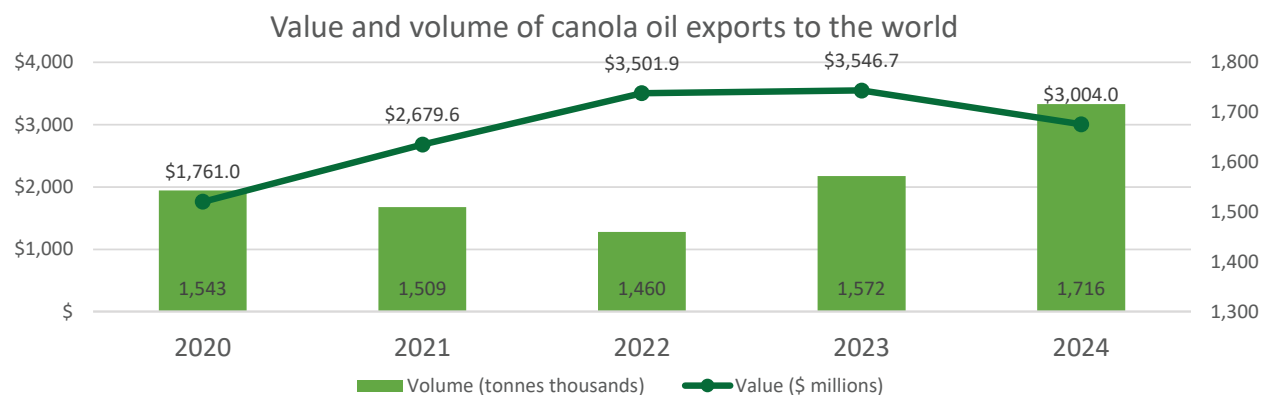

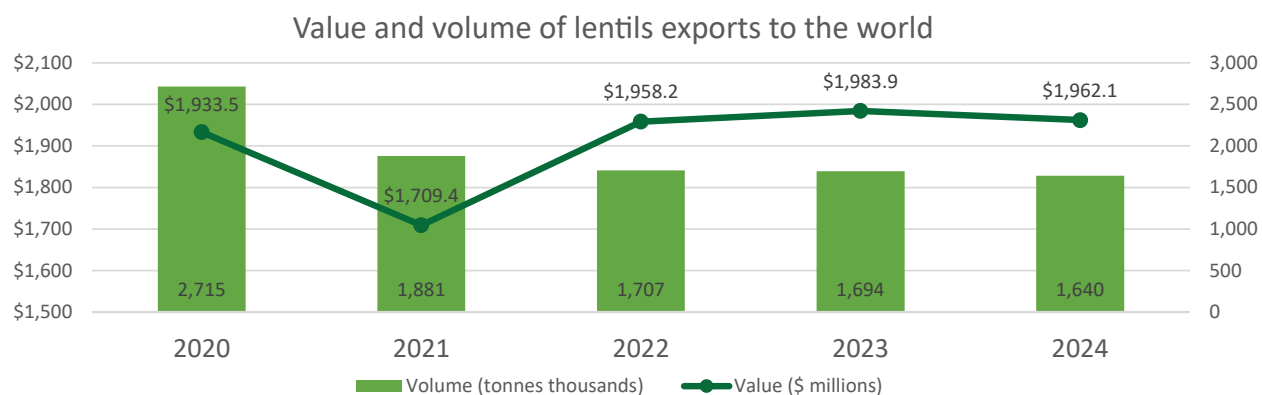

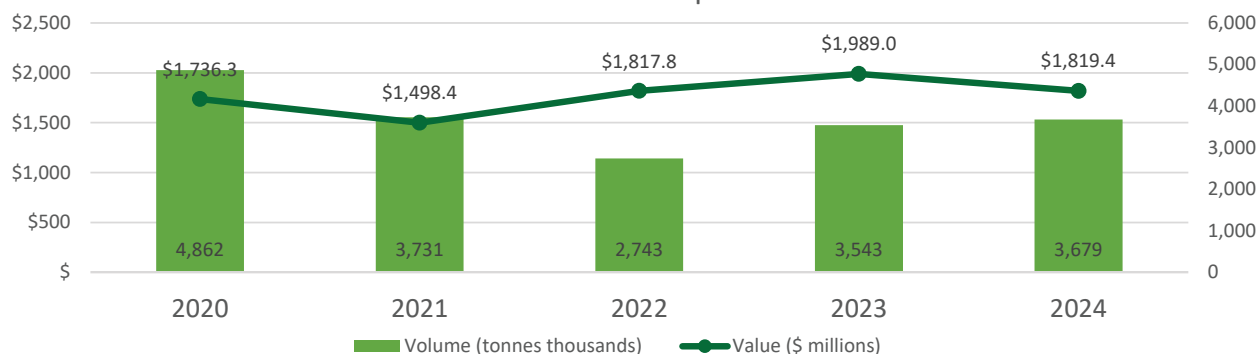

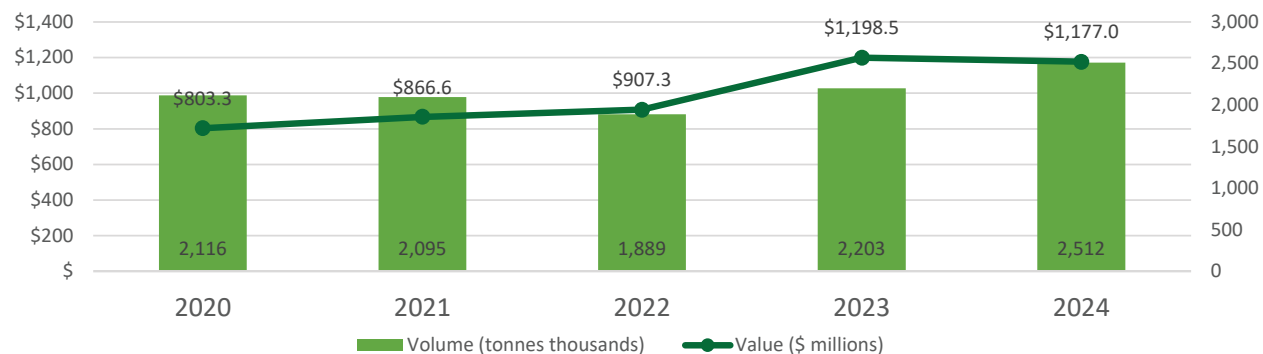

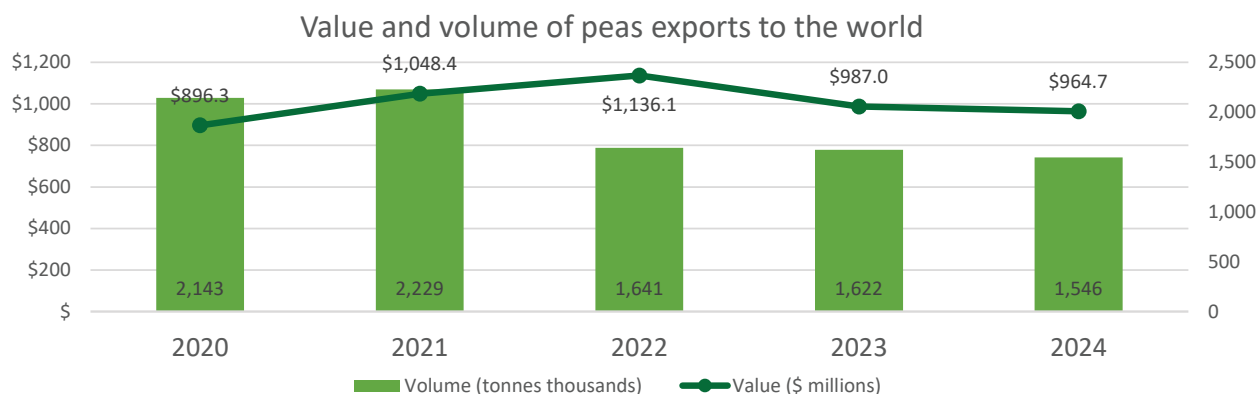
