**Introduction**

In 2024, Saskatchewan’s real gross domestic product (GDP) grew by 3.4 per cent, representing the second-highest growth rate among all provinces. The province’s total economic output reached \$80.5 billion, up from \$77.9 billion in 2023, significantly outpacing the national average growth rate of 1.6 per cent.

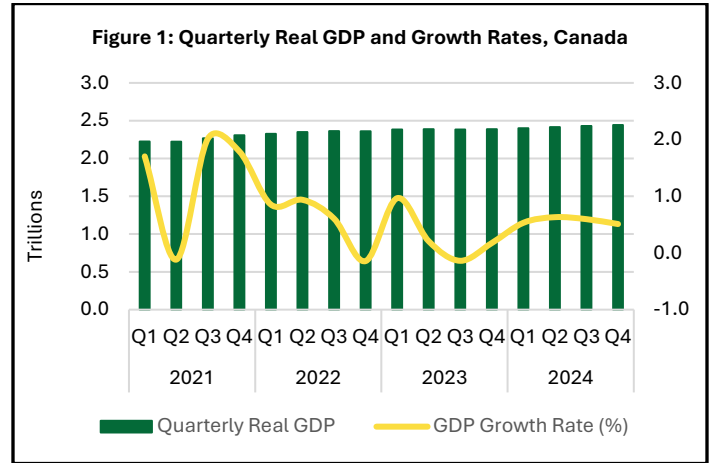
Growth was broad-based, with goods-producing industries expanding by 5.4 per cent and service-producing industries by 1.6 per cent. The construction sector led the gains, growing by 13.2 per cent, followed by the agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting sector, which increased by 7.8 per cent due to strong crop yields. The mining and energy sector also posted solid growth of 5.6 per cent. However, these gains were partially offset by a 4.6 per cent decline in the manufacturing sector.

According to the Fraser Institute’s Annual Survey of Mining Companies 2023, Saskatchewan was ranked the third most attractive jurisdiction in the world for mining investment.

**Canadian Economic Growth**

According to the International Monetary Fund (IMF), Canada’s real GDP at market prices grew by 1.5 per cent in 2024 (see Figure 2). Quarterly data show consistent growth, with GDP rising by 0.5 per cent in the first quarter and 0.6 per cent in the second, driven by increased government spending, business investment and household demand for services. These gains were partially offset by weaker exports, declining residential construction, and softer goods consumption.

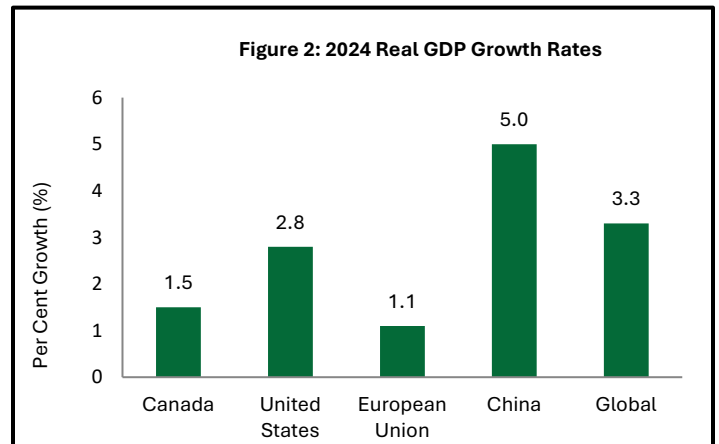
In the second half of the year, GDP advanced by 0.6 per cent in the third quarter and 0.5 per cent in the fourth. Growth was supported by household consumption, a rebound in exports, and sustained capital investment, though tempered by inventory drawdowns and higher imports (see Figure 1).

**Global Economic Growth**

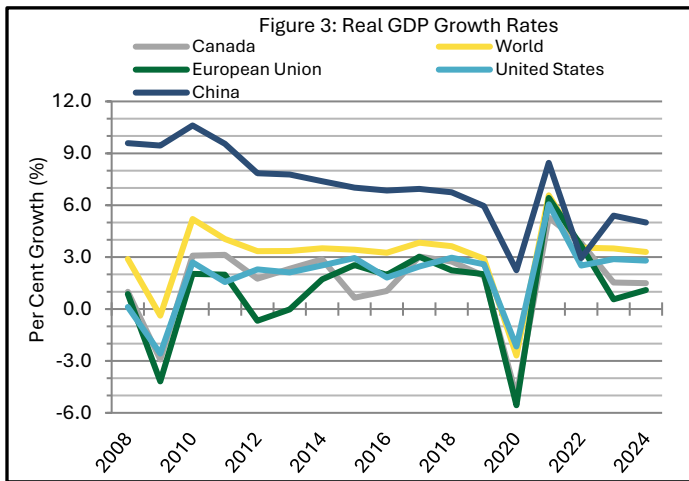
In 2024, the global economy demonstrated resilience in the face of persistent geopolitical tensions, maintaining a steady growth trajectory. According to the IMF, global output expanded by 3.3 per cent, a slight moderation from the 3.5 per cent growth in 2023 (see Figures 2 and 3).

Economic performance among the G7 countries was generally modest. All member nations posted growth, except for Germany, which experienced a slight contraction of 0.2 per cent. United States, Saskatchewan’s largest trading partner, recorded a solid growth rate of 2.8 per cent. The European Union economy expanded by 1.1 per cent, improving from 0.6 per cent in the previous year. Meanwhile, China continued to play a significant role in driving global

economic momentum, registering a growth rate of 5.0 per cent.

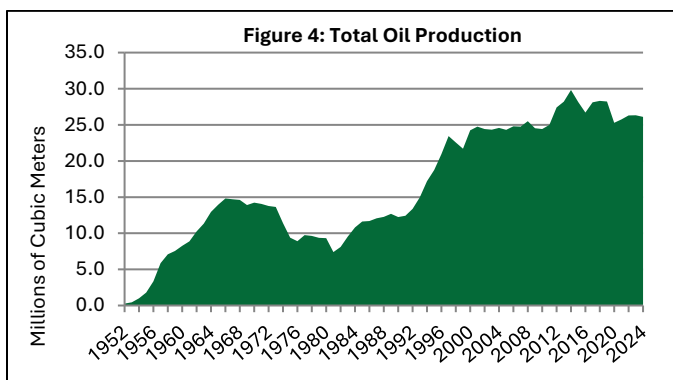

### Oil & Natural Gas

In 2024, Saskatchewan retained its position as the second-largest oil-producing province in Canada, contributing 10 per cent to the overall domestic crude oil output. The province recorded production of 26.1 million cubic metres of crude oil (equivalent to 164.3 million barrels), representing a year-over-year decline of 219.3 thousand cubic metres (1.4 million barrels) compared to 2023 (see Figure 4).

Saskatchewan also continued to rank third among provinces in natural gas production, with total output reaching 3.6 billion cubic metres in 2024, a decrease of 209.3 million cubic metres from the previous year.

Saskatchewan’s cumulative oil production reached 1.20 billion cubic meters in 2024.

A total of 1,281 new oil and gas wells were drilled

across the province, representing a 1.5 per cent (20 wells) decline from the 1,301 wells drilled in 2023.

In 2024, oil was Saskatchewan’s leading export by value, totaling \$12.4 billion. The United States was the exclusive destination for all of the province’s oil exports.

### Potash

In 2024, Saskatchewan’s potash production rose by 8.0 per cent, increasing from 14.0 million tonnes in 2023 to 15.1 million tonnes.

However, the average price per tonne of potash (K<sub>2</sub>O) declined by 33.1 per cent, falling from \$766/tonne in 2023 to \$519/tonne in 2024.

As a result, the total value of potash sales decreased from \$10.9 billion in 2023 to \$7.8 billion in 2024.

Potash remained a key export for the province, ranking as Saskatchewan’s second-highest commodity by export value in 2024.

The United States, Brazil, China, and India accounted for 78 per cent of Saskatchewan’s potash exports.

### Agriculture

In 2024, Saskatchewan’s agriculture sector demonstrated a rebound, expanding by 7.8 per cent after experiencing a 3.9 per cent decline in the previous year. This recovery was largely attributed to a notable 9.3 per cent increase in crop production.

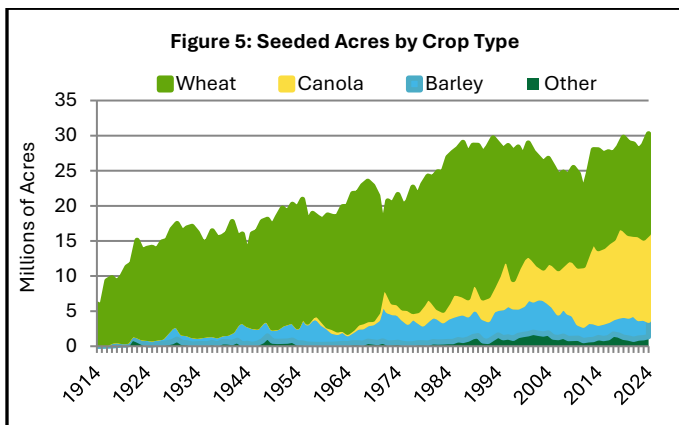
Wheat production saw a significant boost, with average yields reaching 43.0 bu/acre an 11.1 per cent increase from the 2023 average of 38.7 bu/acre. Barley yields also improved, rising by 13.1 per cent compared to the previous year. Canola yields experienced modest growth, averaging 38.1 bu/acre, up 3.0 per cent from 37.0 bu/acre in 2023.

The province’s agricultural and food exports totaled \$18.5 billion in 2024, accounting for more than one-third of Saskatchewan’s overall export value. Realized net farm income reached \$3.9 billion,

positioning Saskatchewan as the leading province in Canada in terms of farm profitability.

China remained the top international market for Saskatchewan's grain and oilseed exports, with trade valued at \$3.0 billion. However, this represented a slight decline from the \$3.3 billion recorded in 2023.

## Employment & Income

In 2024, Saskatchewan's economy added 15,200 new jobs, with most employment gains concentrated in the services-producing sector. Despite this growth, the province's unemployment rate increased slightly, rising from 4.7 per cent in 2023 to 5.4 per cent in 2024. Nevertheless, Saskatchewan maintained the second-lowest annual average unemployment rate among provinces. The labour force expanded by 20,800 individuals, reaching a total of 636,800.

Average weekly earnings in the province rose by 4.2 per cent, increasing from \$1,167 in 2023 to \$1,216 in 2024. The mining, oil, and gas extraction industry remained the highest-paying sector, with average weekly earnings of \$2,308.

## Investment

In 2024, capital investment in Saskatchewan reached \$19.9 billion, representing a \$2.9 billion increase from the previous year. The mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction sector remained the dominant driver of capital spending, accounting for 44.5 per cent of total expenditure.

Residential construction activity slowed down, with annual housing starts decreasing by 6.5 per cent in 2024. Non-residential building construction saw a substantial increase of 20.4 per cent. Additionally, the total value of building permits issued in the province grew by 19.1 per cent.

## Retail Trade

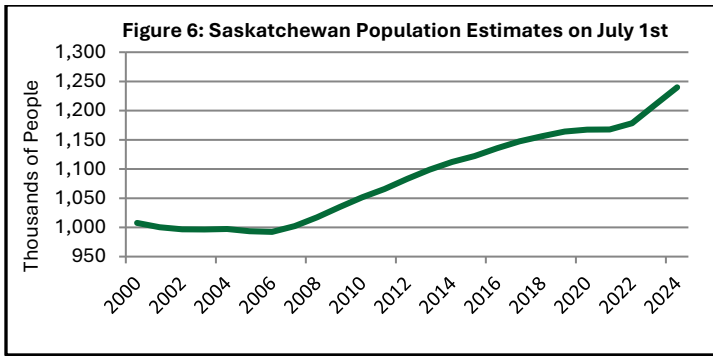
In 2024, Saskatchewan's retail sector generated \$25.7 billion in sales, reflecting a 2.1 per cent increase compared to the previous year. This growth exceeded the national average of 1.6 per cent. Despite the overall expansion, per capita retail trade declined by \$96, bringing the annual figure to \$20,727 per person.

Sales growth was observed in six of the nine major retail subsectors, with the most pronounced increase recorded in health and personal care retail, which rose by 9.2 per cent. Motor vehicles and parts dealerships continued to account for the largest proportion of total retail sales, comprising 26.8 per cent.

## Population

As of July 1, 2024, the population of Saskatchewan was estimated at 1,239,865, reflecting an annual increase of 30,558 individuals compared to July 1, 2023. Between July 1, 2023, and June 30, 2024, the province recorded 13,111 births and 11,680 deaths, resulting in a natural increase of 1,431. This represents a slight decline from the 1,518 natural increase reported in the previous year.

During the same period, interprovincial migration resulted in a net loss of 5,239 people, as departures from Saskatchewan exceeded arrivals from other provinces and territories. In contrast, net international migration contributed significantly to population growth, adding 34,366 individuals.

## Vehicles

In 2024, the number of registered vehicles in Saskatchewan reached 1,215,251, representing an increase of 8,357 compared to the previous year. Registrations for light trucks rose by 2.6 per cent, while heavy trucks saw a more modest increase of 0.9 per cent. Together, these vehicle types accounted for over 60 per cent of all registrations. In contrast, car registrations declined by 3.5 per cent.

Electric vehicle (EV) registrations in Saskatchewan rose 17.2 per cent in 2024, from the previous years 1,460 to 1,711. EVs accounted for 0.18% of the province's total vehicle fleet. This growth is consistent with the steady upward trend observed since 2010. However, registrations of diesel and gasoline-powered vehicles declined by 2.0% and 3.6%, respectively, reflecting significant shifts in consumer preferences toward electric and hybrid vehicles.

## Utilities

In 2024, electricity consumption in Saskatchewan totaled 26,220 GWh, a 1.4 per cent decrease from 26,596 GWh in 2023. The largest demand increase was in the oil field, which rose by 3.3 per cent.

while output from natural gas and wind increased by 7.1 per cent and 7.2 per cent, respectively. Natural gas, coal, and hydro made up 83.1 per cent of total electricity generation in the province. Renewable sources contributed modestly, with wind accounting for 8.4 per cent and solar for 0.4 per cent of the generation mix.

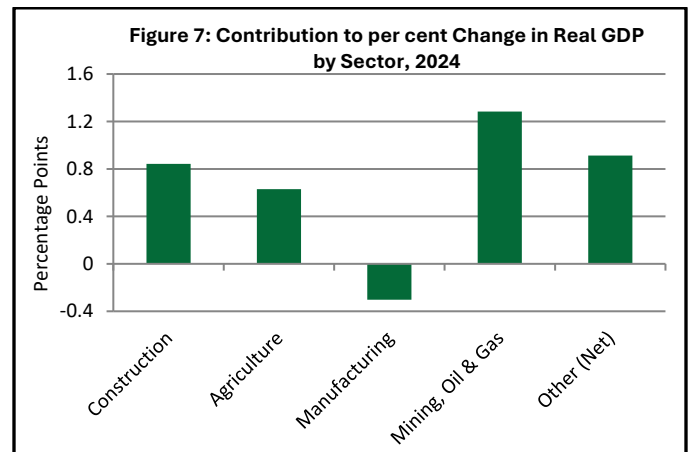
## Conclusion

Saskatchewan's economy posted solid growth in 2024, with real GDP increasing by 3.4 per cent, ranking second among all provinces.

As of July 1, 2024, Saskatchewan's population reached 1,239,865, reflecting an annual increase of 30,558 individuals. This growth was largely driven by net international migration, which accounted for 34,366 new residents.

The agriculture sector played a key role in the province's economic growth, expanding by 7.8 per cent following a decline in the previous year.

Saskatchewan's labour market continued to strengthen in 2024, with the addition of 15,200 jobs. The province's unemployment rate stood at 5.4 per cent, the second lowest among all provinces.

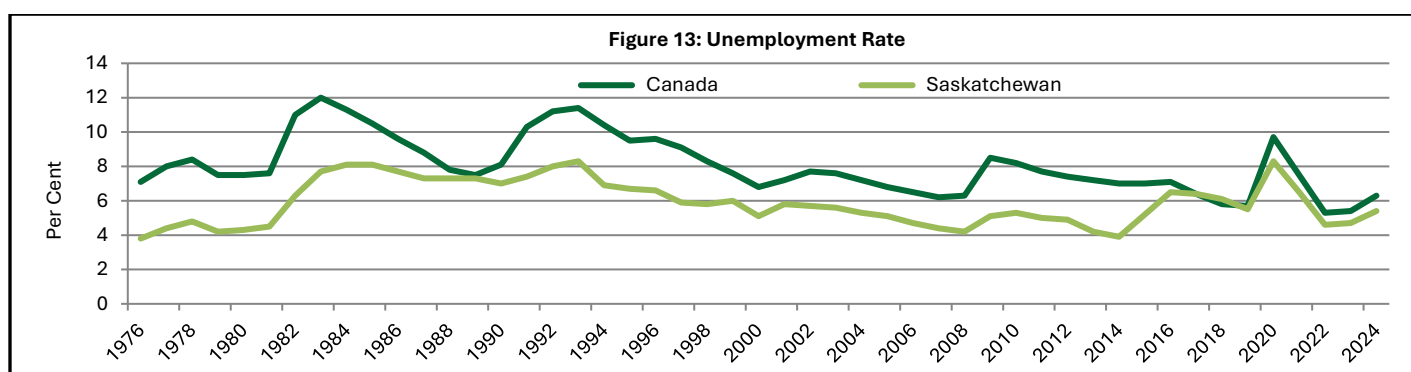
