2 months	<a href="#">DTaP-IPV-Hib</a> (Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio & <i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> type b) <a href="#">Pneu-C-13</a> (Pneumococcal conjugate 13) <a href="#">Rot-5</a> (Rotavirus)
4 months	<a href="#">DTaP-IPV-Hib</a> (Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio & <i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> type b) <a href="#">Pneu-C-13</a> (Pneumococcal conjugate 13) <a href="#">Rot-5</a> (Rotavirus)

12 months	<a href="#">MMRV</a> (Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella) <a href="#">Men-C-C</a> (Meningococcal conjugate C) <a href="#">Pneu-C-13</a> (Pneumococcal conjugate 13) <a href="#">HA</a> (Hepatitis A for children living on reserves and select Northern communities)
18 months	<a href="#">DTaP-IPV-Hib</a> (Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio & <i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> type b) <a href="#">MMRV</a> (Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella) <a href="#">HA</a> (Hepatitis A for children living on reserves and select Northern communities)
4-6 years	<a href="#">Tdap-IPV</a> (Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio)
Grade 6	<a href="#">HB</a> (Hepatitis B) <a href="#">Men-C-ACYW-135</a> (Meningococcal conjugate ACYW-135) <a href="#">HPV-9</a> (Human papillomavirus – 9 types)
Grade 8	<a href="#">Tdap</a> (Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis)
6 months-17 years	<a href="#">Influenza</a> (recommended every year)
Adult Immunization Schedule	
18 years & older	<a href="#">Influenza</a> (every year) <a href="#">Td</a> (Tetanus, Diphtheria) every 10 years. <a href="#">Tdap</a> (Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis) should replace 1 of the Td doses. <a href="#">MMR</a> (Measles, Mumps, Rubella for those born since January 1, 1970) <a href="#">IPV</a> (inactivated Polio for eligible adults) <a href="#">Varicella</a> – (chickenpox for eligible adults)
65 years & older	<a href="#">Pneu-P-23</a> (Pneumococcal polysaccharide 23 - one lifetime dose for most)
Individuals with Select Risk Factors	
Some people are eligible to receive these vaccines. Check with a Public Health Nurse	<a href="#">Hepatitis A</a> <a href="#">Hepatitis B</a> <a href="#">Meningococcal conjugate ACYW-135</a> <a href="#">Meningococcal B</a> <a href="#">Pneumococcal conjugate 13</a> <a href="#">Pneumococcal polysaccharide 23</a> <a href="#">Tdap</a> (Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis) in every pregnancy to protect the baby from whooping cough.
