CHAPTER H-3.01 REG 1

The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Highways and Transportation Act Regulations*.

Prescribed distance

2 For the purposes of section 32 of *The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997* the prescribed distance from the surveyed limit of a provincial highway is 90 metres.

Fees for automobile wreckers

2.1(1) In this section, “**automobile wrecker licence**” means an automobile wrecker licence issued pursuant to section 57 of *The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997*.

(2) Every person who applies for an automobile wrecker licence shall pay a fee of \$100.

(3) An automobile wrecker licence expires at the end of five years after the date it was issued.

(4) If a person who has been issued an automobile wrecker licence subsequently ceases to carry on business as an automobile wrecker at any time before the expiry of four years after the date the licence was issued, the person may apply to the minister for a refund of a portion of the licence fee.

(5) On an application pursuant to subsection (4), the minister may pay a refund to the person making the application in an amount equal to the licence fee, prorated to the last day of the year in which the person ceased to carry on business.
