CHAPTER F-12

An Act respecting The Federal Court of Canada

Short title

1 This Act may be cited as *The Federal Courts Act*.

Jurisdiction of court

2 The Federal Court of Canada has jurisdiction, in accordance with the *Federal Court Act* (Canada), in cases of:

- (a) controversies between Canada and Saskatchewan;
- (b) controversies between any other province or territory of Canada, that may have passed an Act or ordinance similar to this Act, and Saskatchewan.
