### ***The Medical Profession Act, 1981***

#### BYLAW AMENDMENTS

Bylaw 18(10) is established as follows:

#### Section 18

#### (10) Practice Enhancement Committee

- (a) There shall be a standing committee appointed pursuant to clauses 6(2)(p) and (q) of the Act for the purpose of peer assessment of medical office practices which shall be known as the Practice Enhancement Committee.
- (b) The purpose of the Practice Enhancement Committee is to establish, develop and administer an ongoing program of peer assessment of the office practice of members of the College in the member's chosen field to the end that the public may be served by helping members of the College to maintain proper standards of practice in the care of patients and the keeping of records.

- (c) The Practice Enhancement Committee shall be composed of six persons appointed by the Council, three of whom shall be nominated by the Saskatchewan Medical Association.
- (d) The members of the Practice Enhancement Committee shall be appointed by the Council annually. The Council may fill a vacancy in the Committee by appointing such person or persons as the Council thinks appropriate.
- (e) Subject always to the direction of the Council, the Practice Enhancement Committee shall conduct its business in such manner and may adopt, use and vary such programs and forms as it sees fit.
- (f) The Practice Enhancement Committee may from time to time appoint any one or more of its members or other persons as assessors and delegate to persons so appointed the authority to conduct an assessment and to report thereon to the Practice Enhancement Committee.
- (g) Every member of the College whose standards of practice are the subject of an assessment as part of a peer assessment program shall co-operate fully with the Practice Enhancement Committee and with its assessors. The co-operation required of a member includes:
  - (i) permitting assessors appointed by the Practice Enhancement Committee to enter and inspect the premises where the member engages in the practice of medicine;
  - (ii) permitting assessors appointed by the Practice Enhancement Committee to inspect the member's records of the care of patients;
  - (iii) providing to the Practice Enhancement Committee or its assessors information requested by the Practice Enhancement Committee or the assessors in respect of the care of patients by the member or the member's records of the care of patients;
  - (iv) providing the information mentioned in paragraph 18(10)(g)(iii) in the form requested by the Practice Enhancement Committee or its assessors; and
  - (v) conferring with the Practice Enhancement Committee or its assessors when requested to do so by the Practice Enhancement Committee or its assessors.
- (h) Where the Practice Enhancement Committee forms the opinion that the information it has gathered respecting a physician indicates that:
  - (i) the public is at an immediate risk of harm; or
  - (ii) the physician has failed, after due notice, to comply with provisions of these bylaws pertaining to the Practice Enhancement Program, or has otherwise failed or refused to co-operate with the Practice Enhancement Committee in its assessment; or
  - (iii) the physician has refused to undertake remedial measures recommended by the Committee and the Committee considers that such refusal is unreasonable; or
  - (iv) the physician has done or failed to do something that is a serious breach of ethics, it shall report the matter to the Council in accordance with clauses 18(10)(i) and (j).
- (i) Where the Practice Enhancement Committee concludes that one or more of the conditions in clause 18(10)(h) have been satisfied, the Practice Enhancement Committee shall report the matter to the College. When reporting such matter to the College, the Practice Enhancement Committee shall, at first instance, provide only sufficient information to permit the College to fulfill its responsibilities pursuant to *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*. Such information shall, at first instance, be limited to:
  - (i) where the Committee has formed the opinion that the public is at immediate risk of harm, the name of the physician, the conclusion of the Committee and general information pertaining to the harm perceived by the Committee;

- (ii) where the Committee has formed the opinion that the physician has failed, after due notice, to comply with the provisions of these bylaws pertaining to the Practice Enhancement Program, or has otherwise failed or refused to co-operate with the Practice Enhancement Committee in its assessment, the name of the physician and sufficient particulars of the physician's failure or refusal to permit the College to appoint a Preliminary Inquiry Committee to investigate such failure or refusal, or to permit the Council to lay a charge of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct against the physician;
- (iii) where the Committee has formed the opinion that the physician has refused to undertake remedial measures recommended by the Committee and the Committee considers that such refusal is unreasonable, the name of the physician, information respecting the remedial measures recommended by the Committee and information pertaining to the physician's refusal;
- (iv) where the Committee has formed the opinion that the physician has done or failed to do something which is a serious breach of ethics, the name of the physician and sufficient particulars of the physician's action or failure to permit the College to appoint a Preliminary Inquiry Committee to investigate such action or failure, or to permit the College to lay a charge of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct against the physician.
- (j) Notwithstanding clause (10)(i), if the physician with respect to whom the report is made applies to a court to prevent action being taken by the College, or if the physician seeks to quash an action taken by the College, or to appeal from a decision made by the College, or if the physician should oppose the appointment of a Preliminary Inquiry Committee or a Competency Committee by the College, the Practice Enhancement Committee shall provide to the College such additional information as may be necessary to provide the Court or the College with full information pertaining to the factual basis for the Committee's opinion.
- (k) Notwithstanding clauses (10)(i) and (j) above, the Committee may, in its absolute discretion, provide additional information to the College relating to the matters in clause 10(h) above, if the Committee concludes that the information is required by the College to protect the public interest.
- (l) The Practice Enhancement Committee shall keep confidential all information gathered in the course of an assessment of an individual, and shall disclose such information only in accordance with the provisions of clauses (10)(h), (i), (j) and (k). The Practice Enhancement Committee may provide information to the Council of a general nature, which does not identify the physicians involved, to permit the Council to assess the Practice Enhancement Program and to prepare reports of a general nature to the members of the College. The Council shall maintain confidential all information which it obtains from the Practice Enhancement Committee and shall not utilize such information unless:
- (i) if the Practice Enhancement Committee has provided this information to the Council pursuant to clauses (10)(h), (i), (j) or (k) above, the information may be used solely for the purpose of determining whether to lay a charge of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct, or to appoint a Preliminary Inquiry Committee or a Competency Committee, or for the purpose of an interview conducted by the Council or a Committee appointed by the Council, and for no other purpose; or
- (ii) for the purpose of preparing a report of a general nature by the Council to the members of the College. Such information shall not identify the physicians involved.
- (m) A witness before a discipline hearing committee or a competency hearing committee is not liable to be asked and is not permitted to answer any question or make any statement with respect to any proceeding before a Practice Enhancement Committee, and may not be asked to produce and is not permitted to produce any report, statement, memorandum, recommendation, document, information, data or record that is:
- (i) prepared exclusively for the use of or made by; or
- (ii) used exclusively in the course of, or arising out of, any investigation by a Practice Enhancement Committee.
- (n) No report, statement, memorandum, recommendation, document, information, data or record mentioned in clause 10(m) is admissible as evidence before a Discipline Hearing Committee or a Competency Committee.
- (o) Clauses 10(m) and (n) do not apply to hearings before a Discipline Hearing Committee on a charge that a physician is guilty of unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct for failing or refusing to co-operate with the Practice Enhancement Committee or for failing to comply with the provisions of these bylaws pertaining to the Practice Enhancement Program.
- (p) The Practice Enhancement Committee shall report to the Council and the Saskatchewan Medical Association on its activities and programs of assessment at such times and in such manner as the Council may from time to time direct.
- (q) The Practice Enhancement Committee will select the members of the College to be assessed and in doing so will endeavour to have due regard for the distribution of medical practitioners in the province and the differences in practices and specialties to the end that the benefits of the activities of the Practice Enhancement Committee may be fairly extended to the public and the members of the College throughout the province.

(5) **CODE OF ETHICS OF THE CANADIAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION**

(Approved by the General Council, August, 1996)

**PREFACE**

The Canadian Medical Association accepts the responsibility for delineating the standard of ethical behavior expected of Canadian physicians and has developed and approved this Code of Ethics as a guide for physicians.

The Code is an ethical document. Its sources are the traditional codes of medical ethics such as the Hippocratic Oath as well as developments in human rights and recent bioethical discussion. Legislation and court decisions may also influence medical ethics. Physicians should be aware of the legal and regulatory requirements for medical practice in their jurisdiction. However, the Code may set out different standards of behaviour than does the law.

The Code has been prepared by physicians for physicians. It is based on the fundamental ethical principles of medicine, especially compassion, beneficence, nonmaleficence, respect for persons and justice. It interprets these principles with respect to the responsibilities of physicians to individual patients and their families and significant others, to colleagues, to other health professionals and to society.

The Code is not, and cannot be, exhaustive. Its statements are general in nature, to be interpreted and applied in particular situations. Specific ethical issues such as abortion, transplantation and euthanasia are not mentioned; they are treated in appropriate detail in CMA policy statements.

Physicians may experience conflict between different ethical principles, between ethical and legal or regulatory requirements, or between their own ethical convictions and the demands of patients, proxy decision-makers, other health professionals, employers or other involved parties. Training in ethical analysis and decision-making during undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing medical education is recommended for physicians to develop the knowledge, skills and attitudes needed to deal with these conflicts. Consultation with colleagues, licensing authorities, ethicists, ethics committees or others who have expertise in these matters is also recommended.

The Code applies to physicians, including residents, and medical students.

**GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES**

1. Consider first the well-being of the patient.
2. Treat all patients with respect; do not exploit them for

personal advantage.

3. Provide for appropriate care for your patient, including physical comfort and spiritual and psychosocial support, even when cure is no longer possible.
4. Practise the art and science of medicine competently and without impairment.
5. Engage in lifelong learning to maintain and improve your professional knowledge, skills and attitudes.
6. Recognize your limitations and the competence of others, and, when indicated, recommend that additional opinions and services be sought.

**RESPONSIBILITIES TO THE PATIENT**

**Initiating and Dissolving a Patient-Physician Relationship**

7. In providing medical service, do not discriminate against any patient on such grounds as age, gender, marital status, medical condition, national or ethnic origin, physical or mental disability, political affiliation, race, religion, sexual orientation or socio-economic status. This does not abrogate the physician's right to refuse to accept a patient for legitimate reasons.
8. Inform your patient when your personal morality would influence the recommendation or practice of any medical procedure that the patient needs or wants.
9. Provide whatever appropriate assistance you can to any person with an urgent need for medical care.
10. Having accepted professional responsibility for a patient, continue to provide services until they are no longer required or wanted, until another suitable physician has assumed responsibility for the patient or until the patient has been given adequate notice that you intend to terminate the relationship.
11. Limit treatment of yourself or members of your immediate family to minor or emergency services and only when another physician is not readily available; there should be no fee for such treatment.

**COMMUNICATION, DECISION-MAKING AND CONSENT**

12. Provide your patients with the information they need to make informed decisions about their medical care, and answer their questions to the best of your ability.
13. Make every reasonable effort to communicate with your patients in such a way that information exchanged is understood.
14. Recommend only those diagnostic and therapeutic procedures that you consider to be beneficial to your patient or to others. If a procedure is recommended for the benefit of others, as for example in matters of public health, inform your patient of this fact and proceed only with explicit informed consent or where required by law.
15. Respect the right of a competent patient to accept or reject any medical care recommended.
16. Recognize the need to balance the developing competency of children and the role of families in medical decision-making.
17. Respect your patient's reasonable request for a second opinion from a physician of the patient's choice.
18. Ascertain wherever possible and recognize your patient's wishes about the initiation, continuation or cessation of life-sustaining treatment.
19. Respect the intentions of an incompetent patient as they were expressed (e.g., through an advance directive or proxy designation) before the patient became incompetent.
20. When the intentions of an incompetent patient are unknown and when no appropriate proxy is available, render such treatment as you believe to be in accordance with the patient's values or, if these are unknown, the patient's best interests.
21. Be considerate of the patient's family and significant others and co-operate with them in the patient's interest.

**CONFIDENTIALITY**

22. Respect the patient's right to confidentiality except when this right conflicts with your responsibility to the law, or when the maintenance of confidentiality would result in a significant risk of substantial harm to others or to the patient if the patient is incompetent; in such cases, take all reasonable steps to inform the patient that confidentiality will be breached.
23. When acting on behalf of a third party, take reasonable steps to ensure that the patient understands the nature and extent of your responsibility to the third party.
24. Upon a patient's request, provide the patient or a third party with a copy of his or her medical record, unless there is a compelling reason to believe that information contained in the record will result in substantial harm to the patient or others.

**CLINICAL RESEARCH**

25. Ensure that any research in which you participate is evaluated both scientifically and ethically, is approved by a responsible committee and is sufficiently planned and supervised that research subjects are unlikely to suffer disproportionate harm.
26. Inform the potential research subject, or proxy, about the purpose of the study, its source of funding, the nature and relative probability of harms and benefits, and the nature of your participation.
27. Before proceeding with the study, obtain the informed consent of the subject, or proxy, and advise prospective subjects that they have the right to decline or withdraw from the study at any time, without prejudice to their ongoing care.

**PROFESSIONAL FEES**

28. In determining professional fees to patients, consider both the nature of the service provided and the ability of the patient to pay, and be prepared to discuss the fee with the patient.

**RESPONSIBILITIES TO SOCIETY**

29. Recognize that community, society and the environment are important factors in the health of individual patients.
30. Accept a share of the profession's responsibility to society in matters relating to public health, health education, environmental protection, legislation affecting the health or well-being of the community and the need for testimony at judicial proceedings.
31. Recognize the responsibility of physicians to promote fair access to health care resources.
32. Use health care resources prudently.
33. Refuse to participate in or support practices that violate basic human rights.
34. Recognize a responsibility to give the generally held opinions of the profession when interpreting scientific knowledge to the public; when presenting an opinion that is contrary to the generally held opinion of the profession, so indicate.

**RESPONSIBILITIES TO THE PROFESSION**

35. Recognize that the self-regulation of the profession is a privilege and that each physician has a continuing responsibility to merit this privilege.
36. Teach and be taught.
37. Avoid impugning the reputation of colleagues for personal motives; however, report to the appropriate authority any unprofessional conduct by colleagues.
38. Be willing to participate in peer review of other physicians and to undergo review by your peers.
39. Enter into associations only if you can maintain your professional integrity.
40. Avoid promoting, as a member of the medical profession, any service (except your own) or product for personal gain.
41. Do not keep secret from colleagues the diagnostic or therapeutic agents and procedures that you employ.
42. Collaborate with other physicians and health professionals in the care of patients and the functioning and improvement of health services.

**RESPONSIBILITIES TO ONESELF**

43. Seek help from colleagues and appropriately qualified professionals for personal problems that adversely affect your service to patients, society or the profession.
