



# 2022 Saskatchewan Resident Big Game Draw Supplement

The 2022 Big Game Draw Supplement provides Saskatchewan resident hunters with information on the seasons and quotas for draw species, as well as advance notice of changes to this fall's Big Game Draw seasons.

Most qualified applicants for the 2021 Legacy pool were successfully drawn and the number of hunters moving from the Super A pool to Legacy pool remains low. The chances of eligible applicants being drawn in the Legacy pool are very good.

Please be aware of your pool status when completing your draw application and plan appropriately.

You are not required to submit an application to progress through D, C, and B pools – you will automatically advance. Once you are in A pool you must submit an application to advance to Super A pool, and apply each year thereafter to retain your Super A pool status. If you miss applying, you will go back to A pool and remain there until you apply again.

If you do not wish to hunt but want to retain your pool status, submit an application for zone 99.

The 2022 Big Game Draw application period opens May 1 and closes May 25 at 11:59 p.m. Carefully review your application and submit it prior to the deadline.

## Hunters, please apply early!

The 2022 draw will run from May 1 to May 25 at 11:59 p.m. Please ensure you have enough time to complete your application. Draw results will be available in June. Check your HAL account for updates.

## Licence Information

All awarded Big Game Draw licences will be available on your HAL account beginning August 1, 2022.

Licences will not be mailed to successful applicants.

If you are selected for a draw licence, you will not be allowed to purchase a regular licence for the same species.

# What's New for 2022

## Changes to Trespass Legislation

The rules for accessing land for hunting have changed. As of January 1, 2022, it is illegal to hunt wildlife on any land except with the consent of the owner or occupant of the land. Hunters seeking access to land are obligated to ensure they have consent prior to entry. This requirement does not apply to vacant provincial land as defined in *The Provincial Lands Act, 2016*, road allowances or other land or Crown land that is prescribed in the regulations.

## SK Hunt and Fish Mobile App

The new SK Hunt & Fish Mobile App provides essential fishing, hunting and wildlife information, and conveniently stores all your purchased licences. The app is available in the Apple App Store and Google Play Store.

## Pronghorn Opportunities

Pronghorn populations have shown strong growth across their range, but some populations may have been affected by recent winter weather. Wildlife managers are proposing to maintain current hunting opportunities in 2022, with either-sex quotas in all eight pronghorn management units. Ground surveys conducted in July will help confirm population status and whether quotas will be adjusted this year.

Pronghorn draw applications must be submitted during the Big Game Draw application period in May. However,

the pronghorn draw will not be conducted until July, following the ground survey. Check the listed WMZ combinations to ensure you are applying for your preferred hunting areas. Draw results will be released once the draw is completed. The status will be posted on the HAL website and an email notice will be sent out.

## Moose Opportunities

In non-forest WMZs (1-54) the ministry is transitioning from a liberal to base harvest strategy to maintain moose populations near current levels and ensure sustainable harvest of moose for all hunters. To reduce harvest pressure on cow and calf moose, these zones will have exclusively either-sex seasons, except urban WMZs (Regina and Saskatoon) which retain antlerless seasons.

For 2022, the total quota will remain generally the same, except in some WMZs along the Manitoba border and WMZs in the Grassland region where there is consistent concern regarding low moose populations. Mandatory harvest reporting will help assess the impact of this change. Season dates for draw either-sex moose have been aligned in all non-forest WMZs. The reduction of moose habitat remains a concern in many areas.

Moose populations in the forest remain low in most northern areas and stable in others. Moose hunting opportunities in all forest WMZs will remain bulls only.

## Mule Deer Opportunities

Mule deer populations in some eastern Grassland and Parkland regions of the province are at or close to long-term averages. Therefore, there will be additional draw hunting opportunities in many WMZs in 2022.

Over-the-counter, quota-limited antlerless mule deer licences will continue to be available on a first-come, first-served basis through HAL in WMZs where the total draw quota was found to exceed the total number of draw applications. This will include WMZs 3, 7E, 7W, 8, 11, 12 and 14W for 2022. Additional details will be provided in the 2022 Hunters and Trappers Guide.

## Elk Opportunities

Elk populations continue to support strong hunting opportunities across much of the province. Liberal quotas and late antlerless seasons remain available within several WMZs for the 2022 hunting season, with minor adjustments occurring in three WMZs, including the implementation of a new draw opportunity for antlerless elk in WMZ 53. Hunters are encouraged to take advantage of the two-bag limit opportunity for draw antlerless elk in WMZ 33 (including Moose Mountain Provincial Park). Regular and draw elk season dates will remain unchanged from last year.

# 2022 Saskatchewan Resident Big Game Draw Checklist

Use this checklist to avoid common mistakes and ensure your application is submitted successfully. Improperly submitted applications may be rejected from the draw or have an undesirable result. Avoid disappointment and take time to read the information carefully. Detailed instructions are available at [saskatchewanhal.ca](http://saskatchewanhal.ca) to ensure a trouble-free application process.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to apply early and review their applications for accuracy, prior to the deadline. You can review and edit your application in your HAL account at any time, as well as check on your draw status.

## Make sure you are eligible to apply

- At the time of application, all listed hunters must meet residency and age requirements, comply with firearm safety/hunter education regulations and not be suspended from hunting in Saskatchewan. If anyone on your application is found to be ineligible, the application will be rejected from the draw.
- Each person may submit only one application for each species or species type. If a person is found to have submitted more than one application for the same species type, each of the applications will be rejected from the draw. The exception is mule deer, as either-sex mule deer and antlerless mule deer are considered separate species types for the Big Game Draw. Youth hunters may submit a youth draw application and an antlerless mule deer application.
- Any applications containing false information will be rejected from the draw. Providing false information is an offence under *The Wildlife Regulations*.

## Obtain group member information

- If applying as a group, the HAL number and date of birth for each group member must be included on the application.
- Group members with valid email addresses on their HAL accounts will receive notification emails.

## Confirm your pool status

- Make sure you know the pool status of each group member on your application. Your application will be placed into the priority pool of the group member with the lowest pool status.
- You can view your pool status through your HAL account by visiting the My Account section. If there are any issues with your pool status, contact the ministry's Inquiry Centre at 1-800-567-4224 or [centre.inquiry@gov.sk.ca](mailto:centre.inquiry@gov.sk.ca).

## Complete your application

- Review the application guide at [saskatchewanhal.ca](http://saskatchewanhal.ca) for detailed instructions on how to submit your application.
- You may submit your application anytime between May 1-25. Apply early to resolve any problems you may encounter.
- Select your hunt choices carefully. You may select up to six choices in order of preference. The system will consider your choices in the order listed on the application.
- All applications are subject to review regarding eligibility and pool status prior to the Big Game Draw. If there are any issues with your application, contact the ministry's Inquiry Centre at 1-800-567-4224 or [centre.inquiry@gov.sk.ca](mailto:centre.inquiry@gov.sk.ca).

## Review your application(s) before the deadline

- It's a good idea to review your application prior to the deadline to confirm that all information is correct.
- Big Game Draw applications can be changed at any time before the application period closes. Only the individual who submitted the application can change zone choices and/or group members. These changes can be made on the group leader's HAL account.
- Other members of the group can view, but not edit, the application.
- Once the draw period closes, no further applications will be accepted and changes cannot be made to submitted applications.

## Confirm your draw results

- Draw results will be available in June. Pronghorn draw results will be available in July.
- Once the draw has been completed, the results of your application will be available through your HAL account.
- Applicants are responsible for checking their draw results.
- Notification emails will be sent with your draw results, but successful email delivery cannot be guaranteed. Do not assume you are not drawn if you do not receive an email notification.

## Purchasing your licence

- If drawn, purchase your licence through your HAL account beginning August 1.
- Successful applicants will move to the D pool the following year, regardless of whether you purchase the draw licence you are awarded. Applicants are not eligible to purchase a regular licence for the same species.

## Declining a Big Game Draw licence

- Hunters who were successfully drawn for:
  - ~ three Big Game Draw licences may decline one draw licence of their choice;
  - ~ four Big Game Draw licences may decline one or two draw licences of their choice; or
  - ~ five Big Game Draw licences may decline up to three draw licences of their choice.
- Eligible applicants who decline a licence will have their pool status reinstated for that species. Declined licences will not be reallocated.
- You must send an email to the Ministry of Environment at [centre.inquiry@gov.sk.ca](mailto:centre.inquiry@gov.sk.ca) by July 31 to provide written notice of your intention to decline your draw licence.

# Draw Seasons

Hunting is allowed in wildlife management units (WMU) and national wildlife areas that are within a wildlife management zone (WMZ) that is open for big game. The exception is Fort à La Corne WMU and the St. Denis National Wildlife Research Area. Only the provincial parks and recreation sites listed below are open to hunting. Proposed new season dates, open wildlife management zones or open zone combinations are indicated in **bold and red**.

### Hunting, Angling and Trapping Licence (HAL) System Audits

The ministry periodically audits its licence programming to ensure regulations are being followed. It is your responsibility to understand all eligibility requirements prior to applying for or purchasing licences. Any suspected fraudulent account activity will be investigated and charges laid, as appropriate.

### Hunter Harvest Survey

Hunter harvest surveys are now mandatory as a condition of your licence. Following your hunt, please complete your hunter harvest survey through your HAL account or by calling 1-888-773-8450.
