



Oil and gas is one of Saskatchewan's leading industries. In 2021, the combined value of oil and gas production was \$11.3 billion.

Our Energy Industry

Saskatchewan has a wealth of natural resources with oil and gas being one of the leading industries. Saskatchewan is the second-largest oil-producing jurisdiction in Canada and fifth-largest onshore oil producing jurisdiction in Canada and the United States behind Texas, Alberta, North Dakota and New Mexico and accounts for 9.4% of total Canadian oil production. In 2021, Saskatchewan produced 162.1 million barrels (25.8 million cubic metres) oil and remaining recoverable reserves of 1.2 billion barrels of oil in place.

Improvements to horizontal oil well drilling and completion techniques have greatly improved production in the last several years. Currently, approximately 12% of the 56 billion barrels (8.9 billion cubic metres) of oil In-place is recoverable based on current and expected conditions, implying excellent potential for the development of supply chain opportunities and new technologies.

Current plays that are driving the industry include: The Bakken, Viking, Birdbear, Shaunavon, Mississippian Ratcliffe Beds and Torquay.

Saskatchewan is the third-largest natural gas producer in Canada with 143 billion cubic feet (4.0 billion cubic metres) of gas produced in 2021 and remaining recoverable reserves are 1.2 billion barrels (193.9 million cubic metres)

- Oil production (2021): 162.1 million barrels
- Exploration and development expenditures (2020): \$1.8 billion and an estimated 2.5 billion was spent in 2021
- Crude oil refining capacity: 109,000 barrels per day
- Heavy crude oil upgrading capacity: 137,000 barrels per day

Potential Areas of Entry in the Oil and Gas Supply Chain

Potential supply chain opportunities exist throughout the oil and gas life cycle. Examples of typical goods and services are grouped below.

Opportunities Requiring Moderate Investment and Training:

- Coiled tubing units
- Small filters and other small assemblies
- Valve installations, service and instrumentations solutions
- Hydrovac trucks; hydroexcavator, custom ydrovac
- Pumping equipment both installation and startup; decanter centrifuges, submersible pumps

Opportunities Requiring Significant Capital:

- Maintenance, tooling, repair, retrofit
- Equipment rentals, loaders, dozers, trucking, hauling
- Remanufactured wellhead equipment

Saskatchewan's Energy Supply Chain

Opportunities Requiring Large Capital Investment, Specialized Knowledge and Equipment

- Service rigs
- Oil and storage tank fabrication; horizontal double wall tanks, free fracture sand storage, rig mud and storage tanks
- Surface equipment rentals
- Equipment fabrication, manufacturing or assembly of separator units, compressors packages and pump assemblies

Significant work will be required by both existing and new suppliers to determine the best opportunities and approach for their businesses.
