Protect our community's trees. Dispose of elm wood properly.

Elm wood can spread Dutch elm disease, a deadly fungus that is killing Saskatchewan's high-value elm trees. A single piece of elm wood can put all our community's elm trees at risk.

Here's what you can do:

- Don't store, use, sell or transport elm wood for any purpose, except to the nearest disposal site. It's against the law!
- Dispose of elm wood at the nearest elm disposal site during its next operating hours after you cut the wood.
- If you're pruning or removing elms in a rural or northern municipality, you can dispose of the wood on the land where you removed it, but you must either burn all the bark, if that's allowed where you are, or bury the wood at least 25 cm (10 inches) deep.
