“(2) The services prescribed in clause (1)(g) may only be provided by a dental therapist who has successfully completed a course in orthodontic assisting duties approved by The College of Dental Surgeons of Saskatchewan continued pursuant to *The Dental Profession Act, 1978*”.

"HARDING ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE (HIGHWAY 928)

Harding Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as the Harding Road lying between Provincial Highway No. 120 and the provincial forest boundary in Section 14, in Township 54, in Range 16, west of the Second Meridian";

(f) by repealing the description of **HIGHWAY NO. 155 ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE** and substituting the following:

"HIGHWAY NO. 155 ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE

Highway No. 155 Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of Provincial Highway No. 155 lying between the Ross Lake Canal in the south-east quarter of Section 26, in Township 62, in Range 13, west of the Third Meridian, and the corporate limits of La Loche, excluding the corporate limits of Buffalo Narrows";

(g) by adding the following after the description of
HIGHWAY 167 ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE:

"HIGHWAY NO. 903 ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE

Highway No. 903 Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as Highway No. 903 lying between the Beaver River and Highway No. 965";

MACKLIN GAME PRESERVE:

"LISTEN LAKE ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE (HIGHWAY 922)

Listen Lake Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as the Listen Lake Road from the road commonly known as the Revo Lake Road (922) for a distance of 20 kilometres north east";

(i) by repealing the description of MYSTIC LAKE ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE and substituting the following:

“MORNING/CLAM LAKE ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE
(HIGHWAY NO. 935)

Morning/Clam Lake Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as the Morning and Clam Lake Road lying between Highway No. 165 and the road commonly known as the Besnard Lake Road (910).

“MYSTIC LAKE ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE

Mystic Lake Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the roads commonly known as the West Bend Mine Road and the Mystic Lake Road lying between Flin Flon and the road commonly known as the Mariache Lake Road”;

(j) by adding the following after the description of the PATTERSON LAKE GAME PRESERVE:

“PEAR LAKE ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE (HIGHWAY 937)

Pear Lake Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the road commonly known as the Pear Lake Road from the road commonly known as the Rock Lake Road for a distance of 14 kilometres north-west”;

(k) by adding the following after the description of RADISSON LAKE GAME PRESERVE:

“RANDALL LAKE ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE (HIGHWAY 921)

Randall Lake Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as the Randall Lake Road lying between the Elaine Lake Road (916) and the road commonly known as the Pear Lake Road (Highway No. 937).

“REVO LAKE ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE (HIGHWAY 922)

Revo Lake Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as the Revo Lake Road lying between the 15th base line at the provincial forest boundary and the road commonly known as the Elaine Lake Road (916).

“ROCK LAKE ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE (HIGHWAY 939)

Rock Lake Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as the Rock Lake Road from the road commonly known as the Elaine Lake Road (916) for a distance of 49 kilometres north-west”;

(l) by repealing the description of ST. PETER GAME PRESERVE;

(m) by adding the following after the description of SQUAW RAPIDS GAME PRESERVE:

“SWAN LAKE ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE (HIGHWAY 929)

Swan Lake Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as the Swan Lake Road from the road commonly known as the Elaine Lake Road (916) for 35 kilometres north west.

“TRACY LAKE ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE (HIGHWAY 939)

Tracy Lake Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as the Tracy Lake Road from Highway No. 2 for a distance of 48 kilometres north-west”; and

(n) by repealing the description WAPAWEPPA ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE and substituting the following:

“WAPAWEKKA HILLS ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE
(HIGHWAY 934)

Wapawekka Hills Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as the Wapawekka Hills Road extending from the road commonly known as the Wapawekka Lake Road (912) for a distance of 12 kilometres east.

“WAPAWEKKA ROAD CORRIDOR GAME PRESERVE (HIGHWAY NO. 912)

Wapawekka Road Corridor Game Preserve consists of all lands within 400 metres of the centre line of the road commonly known as the Wapawekka Lake Road lying between the 16th base line and Wapawekka Lake”.
