## CHAPTER 22

An Act respecting the By-election in the  
Constituency of Thunder Creek

(Assented to April 11, 1985)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

Short title

**1** This Act may be cited as *The Thunder Creek Constituency By-election Act*.

Richard James Swenson deemed elected

**2** Notwithstanding any other Act, with respect to the by-election held in the constituency of Thunder Creek on March 27, 1985 for the purpose of electing a member of the Legislative Assembly, it is deemed that Richard James Swenson has been duly elected at that by-election.

Duties respecting election to be performed; powers and privileges under law preserved

**3(1)** All things and proceedings that are required by *The Election Act*, *The Controverted Elections Act* or any other Act to be done or taken in respect of the by-election described in section 2 are to be done or taken in the same manner as they would have been done or taken, and when done or taken have the same effect as they would have had, if this Act had not been passed.

(2) All things and proceedings that may, under *The Election Act*, *The Controverted Elections Act* or any other Act, be done or taken in respect of the by-election described in section 2 may be done or taken in the same manner as they might have been done or taken, and when done or taken have the same effect as they would have had, if this Act had not been passed.

Consequences if Richard James Swenson determined not to be duly elected

**4** If, after all things or proceedings mentioned in section 3 have been done or taken or the time within which any thing or proceeding may be done or taken has expired, it appears that Richard James Swenson was not duly elected, he thereupon ceases to be a member of the Legislative Assembly.
