SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 252/78

THE MUNICIPAL REVENUE SHARING ACT, 1978—SECTION 13

Order in Council 1114/78, dated July 18, 1978.

(Filed July 21, 1978.)

ORDER:

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, pursuant to Section (13) of The Municipal Revenue Sharing Act, 1978, orders Regulations in accordance with Schedule "B" attached hereto effective the date of this Order.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE MUNICIPAL REVENUE SHARING ACT, 1978 SCHEDULE "B"

TITLE

1. These regulations may be cited as The Regulations Respecting Revenue Sharing for Rural Municipalities.

2. In this part of the regulations:

- (a) "construction" includes the application of a gravel surface to a road;
- (b) "deputy minister" means the deputy minister of the Rural Affairs Division of the Department of Municipal Affairs;
- (c) "grid road" means any road approved by the minister as and designated as a grid road;
- (d) "industrial access road" means any road approved by the minister as and designated as an industrial access road, and includes any road designated as an oil access road;
- (e) "main farm access road" means any road approved by the minister as and designated as a main farm access road;
- (f) "maintenance area" means any group of municipalities approved by the minister as and designated as a maintenance area;
- (g) "reconstruction" includes the application of a gravel surface to a road;
- (h) "regional park access road" means any road approved by the minister as and designated as a regional park access road;
- (i) "resort road" means any road approved by the minister as and designated as a resort road;
- (j) "super grid road" means any road approved by the minister as and designated as a super grid road.

BASIC GRANT

3. (1) The factor to be utilized in calculating the basic grant shall be .0363;

(2) Notwithstanding the amount of the basic grant calculated in accordance with section 8(a) of the Municipal Revenue Sharing Act, 1978, each rural municipality shall be entitled to receive a basic grant of not less than \$3,000.00.

EQUALIZATION GRANT

4. (1) The amount to be included for:

- (a) municipal administration;
- (b) road construction;
- (c) road maintenance;
- (d) snow removal services;
- (e) bridge construction and maintenance

in the determination of the annual service cost for each rural municipality shall be the amount set out in Table A.

(2) For the purpose of calculating the annual service cost of a rural municipality, grants in lieu of taxes shall include any amount received by the municipality pursuant to The Municipal Tax Sharing (Potash) Act, 1968.

5. The computational mill rate to be utilized by the minister in determining the recognized local revenue of a rural municipality shall be 40 mills.

6. The factor to be utilized in calculating the equalization grant shall be .8436.

7. Notwithstanding the amount of the equalization grant so calculated, the equalization grant payable to a rural municipality shall not be less than the amount listed for that rural municipality in Table B.

GRANTS FOR MUNICIPAL ROAD SERVICES

8. Grants for the construction, reconstruction or oil surfacing of super grid roads shall be paid on the following basis:

(a) subject to clause (c), the grant for any rural municipality shall be calculated in accordance with the applicable percentage rate as set out in Table C;

(b) In addition to any grant payable in accordance with clauses (a) or (c), as the case may be, where the cost per kilometre exceeds \$9,000.00, the rural municipality shall be entitled to a sum equal to 15% of that portion of the costs in excess of \$9,000.00 per kilometre;

(c) where a rural municipality is part of a maintenance area, the grant to which it shall be entitled shall not be that as provided for by clause (a) but rather shall be calculated on the basis of the average of the percentage rates as set out in Table C for all the rural municipalities that are part of the maintenance area, plus an additional 10%;

(d) grants for oil surfacing shall only be provided where the rural municipality is part of a maintenance area;

(e) grants issued under the authority of this section shall only be paid where the work complies with the super grid road standards set by the Rural Affairs Division of the Department of Municipal Affairs.

9.—(1) Grants for the construction of main farm access roads shall be paid on the following basis:

(a) The grant for any rural municipality shall be calculated in accordance with the applicable percentage rate as set out in Table C;

(b) in addition to any grant payable in accordance with clause (a):

(i) where the cost per kilometre exceeds \$3,000.00, the rural municipality shall be entitled to a sum equal to 15% of that portion of the costs in excess of \$3,000.00 per kilometre; and

(ii) where the cost per kilometre exceeds \$6,000.00, the rural municipality, in addition to the sum referred to in subclause (i), shall be entitled to a sum equal to 10% of that portion of the costs in excess of \$6,000.00 per kilometre.

(2) Grants for the reconstruction of main farm access roads shall be calculated in accordance with the applicable percentage rate set out in Table C.

10. Grants for the construction or reconstruction of industrial access roads shall be paid on the following basis:

(a) the grant for any rural municipality shall be calculated in accordance with the applicable percentage rate set out in Table C plus an additional 20%;

(b) in addition to any grant payable in accordance with clause (a):

(i) where the cost per kilometre exceeds \$3,000.00, the rural municipality shall be entitled to a sum equal to 15% of that portion of the cost in excess of \$3,000.00 per kilometre; and

(ii) where the cost per kilometre exceeds \$6,000.00, the rural municipality, in addition to the sum referred to in subclause (i), shall be entitled to a sum equal to 10% of that portion of the cost in excess of \$6,000.00 per kilometre;

(c) notwithstanding anything contained in this section, the maximum grant payable hereunder shall not exceed 80% of the cost associated with the construction or reconstruction of an industrial access road, as the case may be.

11. Grants for the construction or reconstruction of resort roads shall be paid on the following basis:

(a) the grant for any rural municipality shall be calculated in accordance with the applicable percentage rate set out in Table C plus an additional 15%;

(b) in addition to any grant payable in accordance with clause (a):

(i) where the cost per kilometre exceeds \$3,000.00, the rural municipality shall be entitled to a sum equal to 15% of that portion of the cost in excess of \$3,000.00 per kilometre; and

(ii) where the cost per kilometre exceeds \$6,000.00, the rural municipality, in addition to the sum referred to in subclause (i), shall be entitled to a sum equal to 10% of that portion of the cost in excess of \$6,000.00 per kilometre;

(c) notwithstanding anything contained in this section, the maximum grant payable hereunder shall not exceed 90% of the cost associated with the construction or reconstruction of a resort road, as the case may be.

12. Grants for the construction, reconstruction or oil surfacing of regional park roads shall be paid on the following basis:

(a) the grant for any rural municipality shall be calculated in accordance with the applicable percentage rate set out in Table C plus an additional 30%;

(b) in addition to any grant payable in accordance with clause (a):

(i) where the cost per kilometre exceeds \$3,000.00, the rural municipality shall be entitled to a sum equal to 15% of that portion of the cost in excess of \$3,000.00 per kilometre; and

(ii) where the cost per kilometre exceeds \$6,000.00, the rural municipality, in addition to the sum referred to in subclause (i), shall be entitled to a sum equal to 10% of that portion of the cost in excess of \$6,000.00 per kilometre;

(c) grants for oil surfacing shall only be provided where the rural municipality is part of a maintenance area;

(d) notwithstanding anything contained in this section, the maximum grant payable hereunder shall not exceed 90% of the cost associated with the construction, reconstruction or oil surfacing of a regional park access road, as the case may be.

13. Grants for the reconstruction of grid roads shall be calculated in accordance with the applicable percentage rate set out in Table C.

14. Grants for the maintenance of roads shall be paid on the following basis:

(a) for the maintenance of grid roads, industrial access roads, resort roads and the sub-grade and right-of-way portions of regional park access roads and super grid roads, the grant shall be calculated at the rate of \$60.00 per kilometre maintained, provided that for any kilometre sustaining a traffic flow in excess of 150 vehicles per day, the grant shall be calculated at the rate of \$70.00 per kilometre;

(b) for the maintenance of an oil surface on regional park access roads and super grid roads, the grant shall equal 50% of the costs associated with such a project and is conditional on the rural municipality being part of a maintenance area.

15. Notwithstanding any other provision in these regulations, a rural municipality shall be entitled to receive a grant:

(a) equal to the entire cost of:

(i) constructing or reconstructing that portion of a main farm access road, super grid road, regional park road or resort road that is located within an Indian reserve; and

(ii) applying an oil surface to that portion of a super grid road or regional park road located within an Indian reserve;

(b) for the maintenance of:

(i) that portion of any type of road located within an Indian reserve, calculated in accordance with the formula described in clause (a) of section 14; and

(ii) the oil surface on that portion of any road type located within an Indian reserve, calculated in accordance with clause (b) of section 14.

16. Notwithstanding any other provision in these regulations, a rural municipality shall be entitled to receive a grant equal to the entire cost of constructing that portion of a road that commences at the top of a hill, that is adjacent to a ferry landing, and that terminates at the said ferry landing.

GRANTS FOR MUNICIPAL BRIDGE SERVICES

17.—(1) Grants for the construction of grid bridges and municipal bridges shall be paid on the following basis:

(a) for the construction of a bridge having a span of not less than 6.1 metres nor more than 24.4 metres, a rural municipality shall be entitled to a grant calculated in accordance with the applicable percentage rate set out in Table D;

(b) for the construction of a bridge having a span of not less than 24.5 metres nor more than 30.5 metres, a rural municipality shall be entitled to a grant equal to the sum of:

(i) the amount provided for in clause (a); plus

(ii) 1/2 of the difference between the actual cost of the project and the amount provided for by clause (a);

(c) for the construction of a bridge having a span in excess of 30.5 metres, a rural municipality shall be entitled to receive a grant equal to the entire cost of such a project;

(d) for the construction of a bridge having a span that is less than 30.5 metres that replaces a bridge having a span of 30.5 metres or more, a rural municipality shall be entitled to receive a grant equal to the entire cost of such a project;

(e) for the construction of any bridge on a super grid road, the rural municipality shall be entitled to a grant equal to the higher of the sums that results when:

(i) the rural municipality's percentage rate, as set out in Table C, is applied to the costs of the project; or

- (ii) the percentage rate provided for by clause (c) of section 8 is applied to the cost of the project, provided the rural municipality is part of a maintenance area; or
- (iii) the applicable formula for calculating grant assistance, as provided for by clauses (a) to (d) hereof, is applied.
- (f) for the construction of any bridge on a grid road, industrial access road, main farm access road, regional park road or resort road, the rural municipality shall be entitled to a grant equal to the higher of the sums that results when:
 - (i) the rural municipality's percentage rate, as set out in Table C, is applied to the cost of the project; or
 - (ii) the applicable formula for calculating grant assistance, as provided for by clauses (a) to (d) hereof, is applied.
- (2) A rural municipality shall be entitled to receive a grant equal to the entire cost of maintaining and repairing a grid bridge or a municipal bridge that has a span in excess of 30.5 metres.
- (3) For the purpose of maintaining a grid bridge or a municipal bridge that has a span of 30.5 metres or less, a rural municipality shall be entitled to a grant:
 - (a) equal to the sum that results when the applicable formula for calculating grant assistance, as provided for by clauses (a) or (b) of subsection (1), is applied; or
 - (b) when the bridge is located on a super grid road, equal to the higher of the sums that results when:
 - (i) the rural municipality's percentage rate, as set out in Table C, is applied to the cost of maintaining the bridge; or
 - (ii) the percentage rate provided for by clause (c) of section 8 is applied to the cost of maintaining the bridge, provided the rural municipality is part of a maintenance area; or
 - (iii) the applicable formula for calculating grant assistance, as provided for by clauses (a) and (b) of subsection (1), is applied to the cost of maintaining the bridge;
 but the maintenance costs to which the various formulae described in this clause shall be applied shall equal those costs approved by the Deputy Minister, as provided for herein, less \$200.00.
 - (c) when the bridge is located on a grid road, industrial access road, main farm access road, regional park road or resort road, equal to the higher of the sums that results when:
 - (i) the rural municipality's percentage rate, as set out in Table C, is applied to the cost of maintaining the bridge; or
 - (ii) the applicable formula for calculating grant assistance, as provided for by clauses (a) and (b) of subsection (1), is applied to the cost of maintaining the bridge;
 but the maintenance costs to which the various formulae described in this clause shall be applied shall equal those costs approved by the Deputy Minister, as provided for herein, less \$200.00.
- (4) Where a rural municipality eliminates the need for a grid bridge or a municipal bridge having a span of not less than 6.1 metres nor more than 30.5 metres, by:
 - (a) the installation of a culvert; or
 - (b) the construction of a road diversion or a low level ford crossing;
 it shall be entitled to a grant to assist it in such installation or construction, calculated on the same basis as the grant to which it would have been entitled if it had been constructing the bridge, as described, as provided for by subsection (1).
- (5) A rural municipality shall be entitled to receive a grant equal to the entire cost of dismantling a grid bridge or a municipal bridge having a span in excess of 30.5 metres, provided such bridge is to be used for salvage purposes.

GRANTS FOR OTHER MUNICIPAL SERVICES

- 18. A rural municipality shall be entitled to receive a grant:
 - (a) equal to the entire cost of surveying gravel pits and access roads thereto; and
 - (b) calculated in accordance with the applicable percentage rate set out in Table C, for the purpose of compensating it for the exploratory costs associated with locating gravel deposits.
- 19. The rural municipality shall be entitled to receive a grant, calculated in accordance with the applicable percentage rate set out in Table C, for the purpose of compensating it for the costs associated with conducting traffic counts and the planning of its municipal road system.

ADMINISTRATION

- 20. Notwithstanding any other provision in these regulations, no grant, or any portion thereof, payable hereunder, shall be issued until:
 - (a) a written application for such grant has been received by the Department of Municipal Affairs, Rural Division; and

(b) the deputy minister:

(i) has approved the project and the standards in accordance with which the project has been or will be completed; and

(ii) is satisfied that the costs associated with the project are eligible for grant assistance under these regulations.

21. Any grant payable under these regulations may be paid in such installments as may be approved by the deputy minister, but not more than 80% of the total of any grant payable hereunder shall be issued prior to the completion of the project in respect of which the grant was made.

22. Any grant payable under these regulations may be paid in such installments and at such times as may be approved by the deputy minister.

SCHEDULE "A"

Regulations made under Clause (a) of section 2

1. The persons who were born during the calendar years 1966, 1967, 1968, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1972, 1973 and 1974 are hereby designated for the purpose of clause (a) of section 2 of the Dental Care Act, 1974.

THE HIGHWAYS ACT—SECTION 80

(Filed July 25, 1978.)

AUTHORIZATION

SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 255/78

THE HIGHWAYS ACT—SECTION 81

THE URBAN MUNICIPALITY ACT, 1970—SECTION 23, SUBSECTION (2)
Order in Council 1129/78, dated July 25, 1978.

(Filed July 26, 1978.)

ORDER:

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Executive Council, pursuant to subsection (2) of Section 23 of The Urban Municipality Act, 1970, hereby orders that the boundaries of the Rural Municipality of Corman Park No. 344 and the Town of Martensville be altered in accordance with the Schedule attached hereto.

SCHEDULE

1. Ordering that the area described as follows:

“That portion of the north east quarter of Section 21 more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the point of intersection of the westerly boundary of the said quarter section with the southerly boundary of a surveyed road as shown on Registered Plan No. 65-S-26659 of record in Land Titles Office for the Saskatoon Land Registration District, thence easterly along the southerly boundary of the said surveyed road to the point of intersection with the easterly boundary of the said surveyed road, thence southerly and parallel with the westerly boundary of the said quarter section a distance of 140 feet to a point, thence westerly and parallel with the southerly boundary of the said surveyed road to the point of intersection with the westerly boundary of the said quarter section, thence northerly along the westerly boundary of the said quarter section to the point of commencement;

All in Township 38, Range 5, West of the 3rd Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan” shall be taken from the Rural Municipality of Corman Park No. 344 and added to the Town of Martensville so that the area of the said town shall thereafter consist of the lands set out below:

AREA OF THE TOWN OF MARTENSVILLE

“That portion of the north east quarter of Section 21 more particularly described as follows: Commencing at the point of intersection of the westerly boundary of the said quarter section with the southerly boundary of a surveyed road as shown on Registered Plan No. 65-S-26659, thence easterly along the southerly boundary of the said surveyed road to the point of intersection with the easterly boundary of the said surveyed road, thence southerly and parallel with the westerly boundary of the said quarter section a distance of 140 feet to a point, thence westerly and parallel with the southerly boundary of the said surveyed road to the point of intersection with the westerly boundary of the said quarter section, thence northerly along the westerly boundary of the said quarter section to the point of commencement;

That portion of the north east quarter of Section 21 lying north and west of the southerly and easterly boundaries of a surveyed road as shown on Registered Plan No. 65-S-26659;

The north west quarter of Section 21 bounded on the west by the easterly boundary of a surveyed road as shown on Registered Plan No. FN-33;

The most southerly 851 feet of that most westerly 466 feet of the south east quarter of Section 28;

The west half of Section 28 bounded by the west by the easterly boundary of a surveyed road as shown on Registered Plan No. FN-33;

All plans of record in the Land Titles Office for the Saskatoon Land Registration District;

All in Township 38, Range 5, West of the 3rd Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan.”

2. Providing that the effective date for the purposes of assessment and taxation shall be January 1, 1979.

SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 257/78

THE ANIMAL PRODUCTS ACT, 1978—SECTIONS 15 AND 18

Order in Council 1153/78, dated July 25, 1978

(Filed July 26, 1978.)

ORDER:

His Honour, the Lieutenant Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Minister of Agriculture pursuant to Sections 15 and 18 of The Animal Products Act, 1978, hereby makes The Saskatchewan Poultry Regulations in accordance with the schedule attached hereto effective the 1st day of August, 1978, or thereafter on the effective date of this Order.

SCHEDULE

THE ANIMAL PRODUCTS ACT, 1978.

Regulations governing the licensing of persons dealing in poultry products; defining the grade standards; prescribing the manner and conditions of grading, inspection, packaging, marketing, advertising, branding and labelling; prescribing the standards for handling cleanliness; and respecting the methods for reporting and payment for poultry products under the provisions of Sections 15 and 18 of The Animal Products Act, 1978.

Title

1. These regulations may be cited as "The Saskatchewan Poultry Regulations".

Interpretations

2. In these regulations:

- (a) "Act" means The Animal Products Act, 1978;
- (b) "branch" means any stationary permanent place of business in addition to the principal place of business of the licensee;
- (c) "certificate of registration" means the certificate of registration issued under The Canada Agricultural Products Standards Act by the Minister of Agriculture for Canada;
- (d) "consumer" means a person who buys processed poultry for domestic use and not for resale;
- (e) "container" means any case, box, carton, cage, coop or other receptacle used to contain poultry products;
- (f) "custom poultry processing station" means a place where live poultry, the property of another, are killed, dressed or eviscerated for a consideration;
- (g) "department" means the Department of Agriculture for the province;
- (h) "director" means the Director of the Animal Industry Branch of the department;
- (i) "dress" or "dressed" means the removal of blood and feathers from poultry after slaughter;
- (j) "eviscerate" or "eviscerated" means the removal from dressed poultry of the respiratory, digestive, reproductive and urinary systems, the head, the legs at the hock joints and the oil gland;
- (k) "grade" or "graded" means to mark dressed or eviscerated poultry according to the Processed Poultry Regulations;
- (l) "inspector" means a person appointed as or authorized to be an inspector under the Act;
- (m) "licensee" means a person licensed under these regulations;
- (n) "marketing" or "market" includes selling, offering for sale, advertising, assembling, storing, shipping or transporting in any manner;
- (o) "poultry" means a bird of the species *Gallus domesticus*, a turkey, duck, or goose;
- (p) "poultry product" means live poultry, dressed or eviscerated poultry;
- (q) "process" means any part of the work of preparing processed poultry;
- (r) "processed poultry" means a dressed or eviscerated chicken, chicken capon, stewing hen, old rooster, turkey, duck, goose or other domestic avian species;
- (s) "Processed Poultry Regulations" means The Processed Poultry Regulations as amended from time to time, respecting the grading, packing, marking and inspection of processed poultry as established under The Canada Agricultural Products Standards Act, as amended from time to time;
- (t) "processed poultry wholesaler" means any person other than a producer who markets poultry products to:
 - (i) a retailer;
 - (ii) any person in quantities of 50 kg or more of processed poultry; or
 - (iii) a registered poultry station;

(u) "producer" means a person who markets poultry products produced on premises owned or operated by him;

(v) "registered poultry station" means a place where live poultry are killed, dressed, eviscerated, graded, packed or marked and, in respect of which, a certificate of registration has been issued;

(w) "retailer" means a person who markets poultry products and includes establishments which utilize poultry products in the preparation of food products;

(x) metric units used herein shall be construed with reference to The International System of Units (SI); and

(y) words not herein defined shall be construed with reference to the interpretations of the Act.

Licences

3. (1) No person shall, unless he is the holder of a valid and subsisting licence issued under these regulations, operate or carry on business in Saskatchewan as:

(a) a custom poultry processing station;

(b) a processed poultry wholesaler;

(c) a registered poultry station;

(d) a branch operation of any of the businesses mentioned in clauses (a), (b), or (c).

(2) Licences shall be in the form issued by the department and signed by the minister, or any person authorized by the minister.

(3) No licence shall be transferable.

(4) Every licensee who operates more than one stationary permanent place of business shall obtain a branch licence for each such place of business.

(5) Every licence shall, unless previously suspended or cancelled, expire on the date indicated on the licence.

Licences Under The Live Stock and Live Stock Products Act

4. Licences issued under regulations made under The Live Stock and Live Stock Products Act and filed as Saskatchewan Regulation 208/70 shall continue and be subject to these regulations and be deemed to have been issued under and meet the requirements of these regulations and such licences shall continue to be in force until December 31, 1978, unless sooner suspended or cancelled pursuant to these regulations.

Conditions Respecting Licensing

5. (1) Every person required to be licensed under these regulations shall make application to the director for a licence in the form issued by the department.

(2) Any person applying on behalf of a partnership, firm or association may be required to provide to the director the name and address of every member of the partnership, firm or association and the minister, or any person authorized by the minister, may withhold the issuance of a licence until he is satisfied that such information has been provided.

(3) Upon application, payment of the prescribed fee and fulfillment of other obligations under these regulations, the minister, or any person authorized by the minister, may issue to the applicant a licence.

(4) The minister, or any person authorized by the minister, may require an applicant to furnish a list of employees or other agents authorized to buy or arrange for the purchase or sale of any class or classes of poultry products on his behalf.

(5) The minister, or any person authorized by the minister, may withhold the issuing of a licence where the applicant does not hold a valid and subsisting certificate of registration or has not made provision to grade poultry products in accordance with the Processed Poultry Regulations or any other act or regulations, whether of the province or of Canada, regulating such a person.

(6) The minister, or any person authorized by the minister, may withhold the issuance of a licence until the full nature of the applicant's business can be ascertained.

(7) Every licensee shall at all times comply with the Act and these regulations or any other act or regulations, whether of the province or of Canada, regulating the licensee.

(8) The minister, or any person authorized by the minister, may refuse any application for a new licence or the renewal of an existing licence where an applicant has failed to comply with the provisions of the Act or these regulations or any other act or regulations, whether of the province or of Canada, regulating such a person.

Licensing Fees

6. (1) The fee for a licence shall be \$20.00.

(2) The fee for the renewal of a licence, made by an applicant holding a valid and subsisting licence, shall be \$20.00 where the prescribed fee and the application for licence renewal is received by the director by November 30 or such later date approved or authorized by the director with respect to any application.

(3) The fee for the renewal of a licence, made by an applicant holding a valid and subsisting licence, shall be \$40.00 with respect to any application received by the director after November 30 and which date has not been extended by the director under subsection (2).

(4) Notwithstanding subsections (1), (2), or (3), where the applicant holds one valid licence issued under these regulations, other licences required by the applicant under these regulations, other than branch licences, shall be issued without charge.

Licences to be Displayed or Produced

7. Every licensee shall ensure that his licence is displayed at all times in a conspicuous place in his business premises.

Suspension or Cancellation of Licences

8. Where a licensee has failed to comply with any provisions of the Act or of these regulations or has failed to comply with any of the provisions of any other act or regulations, whether of the province or of Canada, regulating the licensee, the minister, or any person authorized by the minister, may:

(a) suspend the licence and, in such case, such notice of suspension in writing shall be given to the licensee, and the licensee shall surrender forthwith his licence to the director;

(b) reinstate a suspended licence if the licensee, within 30 days of the notice of suspension of his licence, furnishes evidence to the satisfaction of the director that the licensee can comply with the provisions of the regulations on account of which the licence was suspended and the director shall give to the licensee notice in writing that his licence has been removed from suspense, together with the reinstatement of the licence; or

(c) where the licence has not been removed from suspense within the 30 days referred to in clause (b), cancel the licence and the director shall give notice of the cancellation by registered mail.

Payment for Poultry Products

9. (1) Every licensee shall ensure that a producer receives payment in full or final settlement within seven days of the purchase of poultry products by the licensee.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), where a producer supplies poultry products to a licensee on consignment, the licensee shall ensure that the producer receives payment in full or final settlement within seven days of the time when the poultry products are sold.

Compliance with Director's Requirements

10. Where, in the opinion of an inspector, the director or his designate, the premises of a licensee are not satisfactory for the grading, storing or handling of poultry products in which the licensee is authorized to deal, or that the licensee is handling the said poultry products in an unsatisfactory manner, or the licensee is otherwise in default of any regulation and upon notice in writing of such default from the director, the licensee shall comply with such requirements, and within the time the director may specify, to remedy any such default.

Transportation of Poultry Products

11. (1) Every operator of a vehicle transporting poultry products shall ensure at all times that the vehicle and containers are in a clean and sanitary condition satisfactory to an inspector.

(2) Every person transporting poultry products in any vehicle shall ensure that there is adequate protection against abnormal temperature which may be detrimental to the product and shall provide efficient means of preventing unnecessary movement of the containers of poultry products carried therein.

(3) Poultry products shall not be transported in any vehicle at the same time as other livestock, volatile petroleum products, hides, fruits, vegetables, or any other commodity that may damage or impart flavours or odours to the poultry products so transported.

(4) Notwithstanding subsection (3), poultry products may be transported where such items are separated in a manner that will not endanger or impair the quality, appearance or flavour of the poultry products.

(5) Live poultry shall not be transported in any manner that is deemed by an inspector to be inhumane or injurious to the poultry.

Reporting and Records to be Maintained

12. (1) Every licensee shall furnish the department and the Poultry Division of Agriculture Canada with a report of all purchases, sales, holdings or other information pertaining to the poultry products handled, in such form and at such time as the department or the Poultry Division may direct.

(2) Every licensee shall maintain a complete record of all transactions and retain such records for a period of not less than 36 months and shall furnish an inspector, the director or his designate upon demand with such information as he may require for the purpose of administering and enforcing these regulations.

Canada Regulations to Apply to Marketing Poultry Products Within Saskatchewan.

13. (1) The interpretations and the whole of Part 1 of The Processed Poultry Regulations, insofar as they are not inconsistent with any other regulation in these regulations, mutatis mutandis, shall

apply to poultry products and the regulating of poultry products, including the grading, packing, marking and marketing of poultry products in Saskatchewan, and shall be deemed to be made pursuant to the Act and by reference are hereby incorporated and made part of these regulations in respect of regulating poultry products, including the grading, packing, marking and marketing of poultry products in Saskatchewan.

(2) No person shall grade, pack, mark or market processed poultry that is not in accordance with these regulations.

(3) Notwithstanding subsections (1) and (2), the following persons shall be exempt:

(a) a producer who markets directly to consumers;

(b) a person who sells processed poultry marked with the name of a foreign country and the name of a grade of that foreign country provided that the processed poultry meets the standards for the Canada grade equivalent.

Disposition of Canada Canner

14. No person shall market processed poultry graded Canada Canner unless it is being sent or conveyed to:

(a) a registered poultry station; or

(b) an establishment registered under The Meat Inspection Regulations (Canada), as amended from time to time.

Processed Poultry Deemed to be for Sale

15. All processed poultry on the premises of a retailer or wholesaler shall be deemed to be for sale.

Detention of Product

16. (1) An inspector may place under detention any processed poultry that does not comply with these regulations.

(2) Where processed poultry is detained, a numbered detention tag shall be attached to the product, to a sample of the product, or to a container of the product and shall include the following additional information:

(a) a brief description of the lot or lots being detained;

(b) the reason for detention;

(c) the date of detention; and

(d) the inspector's signature.

(3) Where the processed poultry under detention is not in containers, an inspector may require the person in possession of the processed poultry to place such processed poultry into containers and the containers shall be marked in accordance with subsection (2).

17. Immediately after attaching the detention tag, the inspector shall notify the owner of the processed poultry or his agent of the detention by a notice of detention in the form issued or approved by the department and where such processed poultry are on premises other than that of the owner, a copy of the notice of detention shall also be forwarded to the person on whose premises the processed poultry is detained.

18. Except as authorized by an inspector:

(a) no person shall alter or remove a detention tag or alter any marks made by an inspector pursuant to sections 16 and 17;

(b) no person shall remove, sell or otherwise dispose of processed poultry placed under detention by an inspector pursuant to sections 16 and 17.

19. (1) Where an inspector is satisfied that processed poultry held under detention complies with the Processed Poultry Regulations, and with these regulations, he shall issue a notice of release in a form issued or approved by the department.

(2) The inspector shall forward one copy of the notice of release to the owner of the processed poultry, or his agent, and where such processed poultry is on premises other than that of the owner, one copy to the person on whose premises the processed poultry was detained.

Advertising of Product

20. Every retailer of processed poultry in any advertisement pertaining to processed poultry wherein the price appears, shall ensure that the grade name is stated in a clear and conspicuous manner.

21. Every person who advertises processed poultry shall ensure that such advertisement states the kind of processed poultry and whether the processed poultry is dressed or eviscerated, and where, in the case of turkeys, ducks and geese, shall ensure that the advertisement states whether they are young or mature and all such designations shall be clear and conspicuous.

SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 258/78

THE GAME ACT, 1967—SECTION 61
Order in Council 1160/78, dated July 25, 1978

(Filed July 26, 1978.)

ORDER:

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Minister of Tourism and Renewable Resources, pursuant to Section 61 of The Game Act, 1967, hereby amends the regulations made by Saskatchewan Regulation 226/77 as amended from time to time in accordance with the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

1. Saskatchewan Regulation 226/77 dated August 5, 1977, as amended from time to time is further amended in the manner hereinafter set forth.
2. The Schedule is amended by the deletion of Section 5 of Saskatchewan Regulation 226/77 and replacing it with the following:
 5. (a) Within Game Management Zones 1 to 22, inclusive, during an open season for big game, no person shall carry a firearm on any all terrain vehicle.
 - (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), a firearm may be carried on an all terrain vehicle within the boundaries of the Cypress Hills Provincial Park (West Block) provided such firearm is encased.
