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## SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 302/71

### ORGANIZATION OF THE YORKTON VETERINARY SERVICE DISTRICT

*(Filed December 31, 1971.)*

By virtue of the authority vested in me by Subsections Four and Five of Section Three of The Veterinary Services Act, R.S.S. 1965, c. 217, and in accordance with the recommendation of the Rural Municipalities of Saltcoats No. 213, Wallace No. 243, Orkney No. 244 and Garry No. 245, made to me pursuant to the said Act, I, John R. Messer, Minister of Agriculture, do hereby order the organization of the Yorkton Veterinary Service District, this organization to be effective January 1, 1972.

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## SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 1/72

### UNDER THE PROVINCIAL LANDS ACT

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## SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 2/72

### UNDER THE REAL ESTATE BROKERS ACT, 1968

(O.C. 1804/71)

*(Filed January 5, 1972.)*

Regina, December 30, 1971. Approved and Ordered, Lieutenant Governor. The Executive Council has had under consideration a report from the Provincial Secretary, dated December 13, 1971, stating:

1. that His Honour did by Order in Council 1018/68 dated May 31, 1968, make regulations under section 57 of The Real Estate Brokers Act, 1968; and
2. that it is deemed advisable to amend the said regulations.

Upon consideration of the foregoing report and on the recommendation of the Provincial Secretary, the Executive Council advises that His Honour's Order do issue under section 57 of The Real Estate Brokers Act, 1968, amending the regulations made by Order in Council 1018/68 by striking out section 5 thereof and substituting therefor the following section:

"5. The examination shall be under the direction and control of the superintendent."

**SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 3/72**

UNDER THE URBAN MUNICIPALITY ACT, 1970  
(O.C. 1817/71)

*(Filed January 5, 1972.)*

Regina, December 30, 1971. Approved and Ordered. Lieutenant Governor. The Executive Council has had under consideration a report from the Minister of Municipal Affairs, dated December 16, 1971, stating that subsection (1) of Section 25 of The Urban Municipality Act, 1970, provides that the Lieutenant Governor in Council may by Order, when requested by the council or when the conditions of incorporation as set out in subsection (1) of section 10 no longer exist, revert the status of a city to a town, a town to a village or a village to a hamlet, as the case may be.

The Minister further states that subsection (2) of Section 26 of the said Act provides that when the Order reverts a village to a hamlet the Order may appoint one or more persons to adjust and settle the assets and liabilities of the village and if an appointment or appointments are made the Order shall specify the fees payable to such person.

The Minister further states that subsection (5) of Section 26 of the said Act provides that where taxes due to a village that was disorganized are transferred to a rural municipality, the taxes are deemed to be due to the rural municipality.

The Minister further states that, whereas the council of the Village of Leney has requested that the status of the said village revert to the status of a hamlet in the Rural Municipality of Perdue No. 346, it is deemed expedient to grant such request.

The Minister further states that it is considered desirable that the reversion of the village status of the Village of Leney to hamlet status shall be effective on the 31st day of December, 1971.

The Minister further states that it is considered desirable that Mr. Lorne Kirk Foster of Perdue, Saskatchewan be appointed as liquidator to adjust and settle the assets and liabilities of the village and the fees payable for such appointment be fifty dollars.

The Minister further states that it is considered desirable that all taxes, including penalties, due to the Village of Leney on the 31st day of December, 1971, be transferred to the Rural Municipality of Perdue No. 346.

Upon consideration of the foregoing report and on the recommendation of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, the Executive Council advises that His Honour's Order do issue:

1. Directing that on the 31st day of December, 1971, the status of the Village of Leney shall revert to the status of a hamlet in the Rural Municipality of Perdue No. 346;

2. Directing that Mr. Lorne Kirk Foster of Perdue, Saskatchewan be appointed as liquidator to adjust and settle the assets and liabilities of the said village and the fees payable for such appointment shall be fifty dollars;

3. Directing that all taxes, including penalties, heretofore levied by the Village of Leney and which are outstanding and unpaid, shall then be transferred and added to the tax roll for the Rural Municipality of Perdue No. 346 and shall be deemed to be due and payable to the said rural municipality and the said rural municipality shall have and may exercise all right of recovery thereof.

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**SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 4/72**

UNDER THE URBAN MUNICIPALITY ACT, 1970  
(O.C. 1819/71)

*(Filed January 5, 1972.)*

Regina, December 30, 1971. Approved and Ordered. Lieutenant Governor. The Executive Council has had under consideration a report from the Minister of Municipal Affairs dated December 9, 1971, stating:

1. That subsection (2) of section 23 of The Urban Municipality Act, 1970, provides that if it is satisfactorily shown that the limits of a municipality should be altered by adding thereto or taking therefrom any territory, the Lieutenant Governor in Council may, by Order without any request therefor, but after the minister has consulted with the council, make the alteration and make due provision for the settlement and adjustment of all matters arising out of the alteration.

2. That it is expedient to take from the Town of Willow Bunch and add to the Rural Municipality of Willow Bunch No. 42 the territory hereinafter described.

3. That consultation on this proposed alteration has taken place with the councils of the Town of Willow Bunch and the Rural Municipality of Willow Bunch No. 42.

4. That it is considered desirable that the annexation of the said territory to the Rural Municipality of Willow Bunch No. 42 shall be effective on the first day of January, 1972.

Upon consideration of the foregoing report and on the recommendation of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, the Executive Council advises that pursuant to subsection (2) of section 23 of The Urban Municipality Act, 1970, His Honour's Order do issue, effective on the first day of January, 1972:

(a) Ordering that on the first day of January, 1972, the territory described as:

"All that portion of Block A in the south east quarter of Section 24, Township 5, Range 28, West of the 2nd meridian, lying east of the southerly production of the westerly boundary of Lots 6 to 13 inclusive in Block 1, said Blocks A and 1 as shown on Registered Plan No. EX620 of record in the Land Titles Office for the Moose Jaw Land Registration District in the Province of Saskatchewan"

shall be taken from the Town of Willow Bunch and added to the Rural Municipality of Willow Bunch No. 42, so that the Town of Willow Bunch shall thereafter consist of the lands described in Schedule "A" annexed hereto.

#### SCHEDULE "A"

##### *Area of The Town of Willow Bunch*

"All that portion of the south west quarter of Section 19 lying south of the centre line of the right of way and station grounds of the Canadian National Railways;

All that portion of the south east quarter of Section 19 commencing at the intersection of the centre line of the right of way and station grounds of the Canadian National Railways and the west boundary of the said quarter section, thence south easterly along the said centre line a distance of 500 feet, thence south westerly at right angles to the said centre line to the southerly limit of the said station grounds, thence north westerly along the said southerly limit of the said station grounds to the west boundary of the said quarter section, thence northerly along the said west boundary to the point of commencement;

All that portion of the north west quarter of Section 18 bounded on the south by a line commencing at the point of intersection of the east production of the south boundary of Willow Bunch Street with the east boundary of the said quarter section, thence west and north westerly along the southerly boundary of Willow Bunch Street and east production thereof to the north west corner of Parcel F, thence south westerly along the north westerly boundary of Parcel F to the south west corner thereof, thence north westerly parallel with Willow Bunch Street to the south easterly boundary of St. Louis Avenue, thence south westerly along the south easterly boundary of St. Louis Avenue to its intersection with the south easterly production of the south westerly boundary of Bruneau Street, thence north westerly along the south westerly boundary of Bruneau Street and the south easterly production thereof to its intersection with the east boundary of Broad Avenue, thence south along the east boundary of Broad Avenue to the intersection with the east production of the south boundary of Parcel G, thence west along the said south boundary and east production thereof of Parcel G to the west boundary of the said quarter section, said streets and avenues as shown on Registered Plan No. AF413 and said Parcels F and G on Registered Plans No. CA6567 and EX727 respectively;

All in Township 5, Range 27;

All that portion of the north east quarter of Section 13 bounded on the west by the westerly boundary of Blocks 1, 2 and 4 as shown on Registered Plan No. AG1438;

The most easterly 526 feet in width throughout of the most southerly 624 feet of the south east quarter of Section 24 which lies north of the south westerly boundary of Principal Street as shown on Registered Plan No. EX620;

All in Township 5, Range 28;

All plans of record in the Land Titles Office for the Moose Jaw Land Registration District;

All west of the 2nd Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan.

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**SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 5/72**

UNDER THE LABOUR STANDARDS ACT, 1969  
(O.C. 1820/71)

(Filed January 5, 1972.)

Regina, December 31, 1971. Approved and Ordered. Lieutenant Governor. The Executive Council has had under consideration a report from the Minister of Labour dated December 31, 1971, stating that:

(1) Pursuant to the provisions of The Labour Standards Act, 1969, certain regulations were made under Order in Council 1682/71 dated December 7, 1971, respecting various matters relating to the terms and conditions of employment, and

(2) That it is considered advisable and in the public interest to amend the said regulations in the manner set out in the schedule attached hereto.

Upon consideration of the foregoing report and on the recommendation of the Minister of Labour, the Executive Council advises that His Honour's Order do issue pursuant to the provisions of section 72 of The Labour Standards Act, amending the regulations made under Order in Council 1682/71 dated December 7, 1971, in the manner set out in the Schedule attached hereto.

SCHEDULE

The Regulations under The Labour Standards Act, 1969, approved by Order in Council 1682/71 dated December 7, 1971 are amended in the manner hereinafter set forth:

1. Clause (c) of section 1 of Part II of the Regulations is repealed and the following clause is substituted therefor:

"(c) the occupation of designing, constructing, repairing or maintaining a highway outside a city or town, or assisting therein."

2. Section 1 of Part II of the Regulations is further amended by adding thereto the following clause after clause (j) :

"(k) any person employed in the public service of Saskatchewan as a field employee."

3. Part IV of the Regulations is amended by adding thereto after section 2 thereof the following sections:

"3. Subsections (2) and (3) of section 29 of The Act do not apply in respect of any employee or employer.

"4. Every employee who terminates his employment or whose employment is terminated for any reason shall be paid in full by his employer within fourteen days after the day on which the termination of employment takes effect.

"5. Clause (b) of section 2 of Minimum Wage Board Order No. 1 (1972) does not apply to any person employed to operate a vehicle licensed under The Vehicles Act as a school bus or to the employer of such a person."

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**SASKATCHEWAN REGULATION 6/72**

UNDER THE VEHICLES ACT

(Filed January 6, 1972.)

Pursuant to the powers conferred on it by subsection (3) of Section 133 of The Vehicles Act and amendments thereto, R. S. S., 1965, the Highway Traffic Board hereby:

(1) Cancels its Order of October 16, 1963, as published in *The Saskatchewan Gazette*, dated November 29, 1963, under Saskatchewan Regulation 397/68, whereby a maximum speed of 45 miles per hour was fixed on Provincial Highway Number 11, in the Town of Craik;

(2) Cancels its Order of October 16, 1963, as published in *The Saskatchewan Gazette*, dated November 29, 1963, under Saskatchewan Regulation 398/68, whereby a maximum speed of 45 miles per hour was fixed on Provincial Highway Number 11, in the Town of Craik;

(3) Cancels its Order of October 16, 1963, as published in *The Saskatchewan Gazette*, dated November 29, 1963, under Saskatchewan Regulation 406/68, whereby a maximum speed of 30 miles per hour was fixed on Provincial Highway Number 11, in the Town of Davidson;

(4) Cancels its Order of October 16, 1963, as published in *The Saskatchewan Gazette*, dated November 29, 1963, under Saskatchewan Regulation 407/68, whereby a maximum speed of 45 miles per hour was fixed on Provincial Highway Number 11, in the Town of Davidson.
