CHAPTER P-37 REG 7

The Public Health Act

SHORT TITLE

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Bakeshop Regulations, 1986*.

Interpretation

2 In these regulations:

- (a) “**Act**” means *The Public Health Act*;
- (b) “**applicant**” means a person who applies for a licence;
- (c) “**licence**” means a licence issued pursuant to section 6.

Licence required

3 No person shall establish, construct, extend, renovate, alter or operate a bakeshop unless he possesses a licence that authorizes him to do so.

Exceptions

4 Section 3 does not apply to the routine maintenance of a bakeshop.

Applications

5 An applicant shall:

- (a) submit his application to a medical health officer or a public health inspector; and
- (b) provide any information or material relevant to the application that is requested by the medical health officer or public health inspector.

Issuance of permit

6 Where an application, including any information or material requested, is received pursuant to section 5, a medical health officer or a public health inspector shall:

- (a) issue a licence, subject to any terms and conditions that he considers appropriate; or

(b) refuse to issue a licence;
and shall notify the applicant of his decision.

Compliance with licence required

7 No person to whom a licence is issued shall fail to comply with a term or condition contained in the licence.

Amendment, suspension, cancellation of licences

8(1) Where in the opinion of a medical health officer or a public health inspector:

- (a) a person to whom a licence is issued has contravened the Act or these regulations; or
- (b) a bakeshop that is being operated pursuant to a licence is being operated without adequate consideration of the need to operate in a sanitary manner that does not endanger the public health;

the medical health officer or public health inspector may amend, suspend or cancel the licence.

(2) For the purposes of section 3, a licence that is suspended pursuant to this section is, for the period of the suspension, deemed not to have been issued.

Licence not transferable

9 A licence may not be transferred.

Unsanitary operation

10 No person who operates a bakeshop shall cause or allow it to be operated:

- (a) in an unsanitary manner or under unsanitary conditions; or
- (b) in a manner that endangers the health of a member of the public.

Prohibition respecting sale or distribution

11 No person shall cause or allow an article of food that has been prepared, preserved, stored or packaged in a bakeshop under unsanitary conditions to be offered for sale, sold or distributed for human consumption.
