## CHAPTER P-17.1

### The Potash Corporation of Saskatchewan Reorganization Act

**NOTE:** Section 3 of *The Potash Corporation of Saskatchewan Reorganization Repeal Act*, being chapter 26 of the *Statutes of Saskatchewan, 1994*, states:

**PCS head office operations**

“3(1) In this section:

- (a) **‘head office’** means the office or offices at which head office functions are normally conducted;
  - (b) **‘head office functions’** means the functions that, as at the date this Act is assented to, are being carried out in Saskatchewan by:
    - (i) the chief executive officer and the chief financial officer of PCS and all other senior executives of PCS and its subsidiaries; and
    - (ii) all management and support personnel carrying out the collective executive, corporate planning, senior administrative, general management, administrative and other functions of PCS and its subsidiaries;and includes those functions that may be prescribed in the regulations;
  - (c) **‘PCS’** means Potash Corporation of Saskatchewan Inc. and includes any continuation of that corporation resulting from one or more amalgamations or reorganizations and any successor to that corporation;
  - (d) **‘subsidiary’** means a subsidiary, within the meaning of *The Business Corporations Act*, of PCS but does not include any PCS subsidiary, or any division of any PCS subsidiary, the majority of whose business is conducted and the majority of whose assets are located outside Saskatchewan.
- (2) PCS shall maintain its head office in Saskatchewan.
- (3) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may make regulations:
- (a) prescribing functions for the purposes of clause (1)(b);
  - (b) defining, enlarging or restricting the meaning of any word or phrase used in this section”.
